Reflecting on society and human inclination, Aristotle once wrote: "The brave are to be found where bravery is honored." He meant that those virtues and values singled out for distinction would be the values people strive for.

This Sunday we begin the celebration of National Catholic Schools Week.

Catholic schools are a great gift to our country and to our local communities. In the inner city they offer hope where public systems are sometimes strained. In areas with stronger public systems, they offer moral formation and religious virtue particular to Jesus Christ.

Why a Catholic school? It would seem to have something to do with Aristotle's insight. Where the Christian tradition and the Catholic Church's teachings are modeled and taught, those principles will hopefully be developed in children.

What more important "work" is there to the human condition than the nurturing and formation of the next generation? What more important or primary concern than the way we mold our children? What more significant legacy will we leave when we pass beyond than our offspring?

The "desired impression" is more readily taken in youth. We desire to make those impressions strong and deep. The "tales" our children hear, the stories they're told, the vision they're focused to need to be of value and virtue in the Catholic tradition. For that is who we are...the best of who we are.

We go to significant sacrifice, as parents, families, and as a community, in this most important mission. We do so because we see the transmission of faith, the formation in virtue, and the modeling of the Christian life as integral to our identity. And that identity is Catholic. The school supports and assists the responsibility that is primarily that of parents; but never of parents by themselves or alone.

St. Cletus School's programs speak for themselves. They are excellent. They stand proudly alongside any systems anywhere. The unique value, the fundamental advantage, the beginning and end of the discussion ...is the proclamation of Jesus as Lord, and all that that implies. It is well worth the sacrifice.

Maybe You Would Like to Help?

The 5th grade religious education class, with the support of the entire religious education program, is collecting pop tops for the Ronald McDonald houses here in the Chicagoland area. There are three homes in our area. Families with sick children in area hospitals are able to stay long term in these facilities for a fraction of the cost of a hotel. The pop tops are turned in as recycled aluminum and the money collected every year is enough to pay for the electrical costs of the three homes (approximately \$18,000 a year).

They ask that we collect just the pop tops because while they are heavy they are not as bulky or messy as the can. So far we have approximately twenty pounds of pop tops.

If you would like to help, save your pop tops and turn them into the Religious Education Office in the Education Building on Sunday mornings or Monday - Thursday between the hours of 8:30am-3:00pm.
