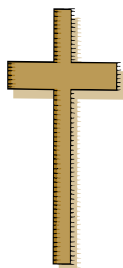

FR. BOB'S UTTERINGS

Sixth Sunday of Easter

We spend much time daydreaming when we are young. As we grow older daydreams give way to memories. Remembering, then, may be the most sacred thing we do, for our memories are the very story of how God has shaped us out of clay.

Do you remember the first rays of freedom dawning for you? Was it walking to school by yourself for the first time? Or having your own money to spend as you would? Or moving away from home? Or was that only yesterday?

Do you remember pain as well? Both feeling pained when you were pruned from the vine that is love; and causing pain when you turned your back to another's face? Do you remember pain? And sin? Or was that, too, only yesterday?

Remembering is good and holy. It is of God's Spirit and where that Spirit works, and why Jesus said, "Now I have told you this before it happens, so that when it happens you may believe" (John 14:29), so that when it happens you will remember. Could we believe if we did not remember?

Much later in St. John's life, when he was exiled to the Isle of Patmos presumably because of his faith and because of the ways his remembering shaped both his own life and the lives of numerous others, he continued to remember and to imagine. What he remembered then was the way that Jesus had been their dream, the divine center of their lives. Jesus had been all they wished for, all they hoped they could be. That's what John remembered and was unwilling to forget.

- *Remember blessings. Be filled with wonder.*
- *Remember your own graciousness. Be grateful for grace.*
- *Remember hurts. Be forgiving and freeing.*
- *Remember your sins. Be humbled and thankful for mercy.*

Dare to remember. It's where we begin to recognize the hand of God in our lives. It is the most radical thing we can do simply because it is of the Holy Spirit.

Listen to your mother

Mother's Day is practically a holy day of obligation in this country. Coincidentally, the words of Jesus today sound almost like a mother's special form of blackmail, don't they? "Whoever does not love me does not keep my words." It wouldn't be the first time that Jesus is noted for his strong maternal qualities. Julian of Norwich wrote, "Indeed, our Savior himself is our Mother for we are forever being born of him, and shall never be delivered." Dame Julian also noted that all motherhood has its roots in the life-bearing activity of Christ. Mother or not, be conscious of Christ's life born within you daily.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts of the Apostles 15:1-2, 22-29; Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23; John 14:23-29*

"Whoever does not love me does not keep my words."

MONDAY, MAY 14 - FEAST OF MATTHIAS, APOSTLE - Let go and love
Jesus' Last Supper discourses are surely some of the most poignant passages in John's gospel. You can almost hear the urgency in Jesus' voice as he exhorts his disciples to carry on and always love one another. Just *love one another*. Three simple words, yet how difficult they are to live at times! Or at least we make them that way. We prefer to hold on to our anger, resentment, or that small slight from this morning. We are entitled to feel the way we do—right? Yet, how much easier it is to simply let the negative feeling go. It's as easy as opening your hand. Today, when you find yourself holding on to anger, visualize opening your hand. Let it go. Love one another.

TUESDAY, MAY 15 - FEAST OF ISIDORE, FARMER -

Our mealtime advocate

Some of us will never look at spinach the same way again after last year's scare about toxic salad. And it's not only haphazard vegetable processing that should alarm us. Bioengineered foods are on the rise at the supermarket, taking their place amid the boxes and bags of junk food, trans-fats, and high-calorie, low-nutrition fare. Saint Isidore, patron saint of farmers, protect us! Isidore (1070-1130), a Madrid farmer, seemed like a throwaway saint when the focus of modern life moved to the cities. But we'll never outgrow our need for the man who ploughed while communing with the saints.

WEDNESDAY, MAY 16 - EASTER WEEKDAY

Still going strong

Jesus lived a brief 33 years, and only spent the past few years of his life publicly preaching and teaching. It should come as no surprise that he had more to teach us than time to teach it in. The implication? God's revelation is ongoing, it didn't stop 2,000 years ago. There is still more to learn, both

in our individual lives and in the life of the church, the community of his followers. Our understanding can and should evolve and grow over time. Look back at your earlier ideas about how God works in the world, and compare them to how you see God at work in your life now. What is Jesus saying to you today?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts of the Apostles 17:15, 22-18:1; John 16:12-15*
"I still have many things to say to you . . ."

THURSDAY, MAY 17 - SOLEMNITY OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

Unlimited energy supply

All is not lost when Jesus leaves the disciples. In fact, nothing is lost because his Spirit remains—his essence, his energy, the fullness of his love for God and for us. Jesus is with us always through the power of the Holy Spirit. Each day, in every moment no matter what the circumstance, that power is yours to draw on. You are never alone. Nothing can separate you from the love—or the power—of God. Don't waste energy trying to go it alone. Draw on God's power—it's free and totally renewable.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11; Ephesians 1:17-23 or Hebrews 9:24-28; 10:19-23; Luke 24:46-53* - *"I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."*

FRIDAY, MAY 18 - FEAST OF JOHN I, POPE, MARTYR

Everyday martyrdoms

The sixth-century Pope John I found himself in an impossible situation: having to walk the fine line between the emperor Theodoric in Italy, who was a heretic, and the orthodox ruler Justin I in Constantinople. Theodoric sent him on a mission to Justin, but when he returned, a suspicious Theodoric imprisoned him. An elderly man, he died in prison. His tomb inscription reads: "Victim for Christ because of a forced journey."

Though his death was a "slow" one, not sudden and violent, the church calls John I a martyr. Why? Because he died for and because of his faith. What can you give yourself to wholeheartedly every day?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts of the Apostles 18:9-18; John 16:20-23*

"Very truly, I tell you, you will weep and mourn, but the world will rejoice; you will have pain, but your pain will turn into joy."

SATURDAY, MAY 19 - EASTER WEEKDAY - What's in a name?

Don't you hate it when you get those marketing telephone calls and the person on the other end totally destroys the pronunciation of your name? That's because wrapped up in your name is the sum total of who you are. It has accompanied you from the day of your birth. Your name means *you*. In the same way, the name of Jesus carries the fullness of who he is. And he's *God*. The Lord wants your joy to be complete and has the power to do it. So ask for something in prayer, and keep asking every day until you receive it. After all, you are beloved of God.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts of the Apostles 18:23-28; John 16:23b-28*

"On that day you will ask in my name."
