Notes from Fr. Bob...

28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

A lady in her nineties used to take a taxi to Mass every Sunday morning because she was no longer able to get to church unaided. Very often she got the same taxi driver, and one Sunday morning he said to her, "Why do you bother coming to church every Sunday at your age?" She replied, "To say THANK YOU."

That old lady had a very profound understanding of what we are doing when we come to Mass. Before all else we are saying THANK YOU. That in essence is what the Mass is – an act of thanksgiving. That's what the word 'Eucharist' means. The meaning of the Mass is summed up in the dialogue before the Preface when we all say, "It is right to give God thanks and praise". And then in the Preface itself which begins with the words, "Father, all-powerful and ever living God, we do well always and everywhere to give you thanks."

So, we're here today at this Mass to say "THANK YOU". What are we saying thank you for? If the taxi driver had asked the old lady that question she might have said something like this:

"I'm saying thank you for my life, for my long life. It's sometimes been hard: there have been bad times as well as good. But in times of hardship and difficulty I've always felt God was with me, supporting me. So, I thank God for that. I say thank you for my late husband. He's long gone now, but he was a good man and a good father to our children. I say thank you for all my family, for my friends, for all the people I love. They have meant so much to me in my life. I say thank you to God for his son Jesus Christ and for Mary his mother. I pray to them every day. It's such a joy to be able to do that. I say thank you for all the other people with me at Mass especially the children. I love to watch them lighting candles and saying their own little prayers...I could go on and on. There's so much to thank God for." Each of us could make our own list of reasons for giving thanks to God, but we don't usually think about all the things on that list every time we come to Mass. Nor is it necessary. What's important is that we come to Mass in a spirit of thankfulness.

Jesus makes clear how important he thought it was to give thanks in today's gospel reading. He was astounded and hurt that only one of the ten lepers who were cured came back to give thanks to God. They had pleaded with him to take
pity on them. In
telling them to go and show

themselves to the priest Jesus was responding to their plea. The priest had to confirm a cure before a leper could take his place in the community again. On the way to the priest they found that they were cured, but only one came back to say "THANK YOU". In fact Jesus uses the word 'praise'. He said, "It seems that no one has come back to give PRAISE to God except this foreigner." Praise and thanksgiving are intimately linked in the mind of Jesus. In both we acknowledge God's goodness to us.

Thanksgiving is not an added extra. It is absolutely central to the life of a Christian. Without a spirit of thanksgiving our Christian lives would be cold and lifeless. An attitude of mind in which thankfulness has no part is likely to lead to pettiness, resentment and cynicism. God takes a back seat in our lives and we begin to go our own way. Thankfulness, on the other hand, preserves a right relationship with God. If we're thankful, God is necessarily part of our lives. It's difficult to see how we could turn away from God permanently and irrevocably if we preserve an attitude of thankfulness. Even if we have serious sins we find it difficult to overcome we won't be permanently separated from God if we can still acknowledge his love and goodness and thank him for it. To be thankful is to see reality clearly.

That's what we're doing today and every time we come to Mass. In the words of the old lady to the taxi driver. We've come to say "THANK YOU"; just to say "THANK YOU".

Because of the construction of our new parish center, we were unable to hold our annual rummage sale, which has been our main sources of income for the last 8 years. Now our St. Vincent de Paul funds are running low. If you are able to make a donation at this time, it would help us greatly to continue our good works.

We regularly get calls and make home visits to families in our community, who are struggling to make ends meet. These includes older adults on fixed income, whose retirement funds won't cover growing expenses; single moms dealing with unemployment/underemployment and childcare costs; people without means of transportation or money for gas to do errands, go to medical appointments, get to work or job interviews; people dealing with illness or disabilities; families undergoing foreclosures, termination of utilities or other financial difficulties.

Our volunteers, as they go into the homes of those requesting aid, provide not only monetary assistance, but also hope and the realization that God works through others to answer their basic needs.
