Dear Parishioners,

How do you start your day?

Some people start their day by making the sign of the cross. Others by raising their minds and hearts to the Lord. Some others by carving some quiet time before they engage in all the excitement that a new day brings. What about you? What is your practice? What is the first thing that you normally do at the beginning of each day?

Following the recommendation of my spiritual director, mentors, and good friends, one of the first things that I do as soon as I wake up is to connect with the Lord. How? I pick up the bible and do a Lectio Divina with the reading of the day. Then, I take a walk for about 20 to 25 minutes. As I start my walk, I ask the Lord to walk with me. During my walk with him I talk to him mostly about you. I tell him that you all are gracious, caring, and so dedicated to your parish. Walking with the Lord each day has been and continues to be amazing and renewing.

You and I walk with the Lord daily, each in our own unique way. It is from this experience that I am pleased to share with you some opportunities where I noticed the presence of the Lord among us and walking with us.

First, last Sunday after our 12:30 PM Mass, we held out first gathering of ministers and volunteers. We were blessed by over 60 people who attended the gathering. The intention of the gathering was to acknowledge, affirm, encourage, and thank them for generously serving the Lord and us at our Sunday Mass. Some of those who attended the gathering are also responsible for the way how our plants and flowers look amazing in our parish. I enjoyed very much being with them. I would like to thank Juanita Avila, Director of Hispanic Ministry, for organizing the gathering, which was awe-some.

Second, on Monday, August 29, 2022, at 7:00 PM, we held our get together with our catechists and volunteers in the Gallagher Room. The first thing that I did at the gathering was to thank and affirm each of them for their dedication and love for our children. It is thanks to them that our children are able to receive to receive the sacraments of the Eucharist and Confirmation.

Then, I took the opportunity to introduce to them Lawrence Manetti, who is the new Director of Faith Formation for Children. He led the remaining part of the gathering. We are blessed to have Lawrence Manetti. He is a man of deep faith. He loves and enjoys serving the Lord. He is a good listener. In collaboration with our catechists and volunteers, he wants to offer a solid formation to our children. He enjoys my full support. Please keep him, the catechists, and volunteers in your daily prayers.

Third, last Tuesday, August 30th, 2022, at 8:00 AM, I was lucky to celebrate the School Children's Mass after the summer break. I don't know what it is, but there is something unique, something different, something beautiful that I get to sense and experience each time I have the opportunity to celebrate Mass with our school children. From my experience of praying and celebrating Mass with them, I find them to be thoughtful, reverent, and engaging. They participate well in Mass. They receive Holy Communion prayerfully. They express a sense of belonging and joy. Praying and celebrating Mass with them is pure joy and a blessing. If you would like to, come and join us any Tuesday when we have our School Children's Mass. I would like to thank our School Administrators, staff, and teachers for being such good mentors and role models for our children. I also would like to thank you, parents, for trusting us with the education and faith formation of your children. Let us ask the Lord to grant us a good new school year.

Fifth, the first St. Cletus Pig Roast is just 20 days away. I am encouraged by the enthusiasm and leadership of the members of the Parish Pastoral Council around this marvelous activity that will bring us together as a parish community. I am

also inspired by the spirit of generosity of all those who are signing up to help as volunteers. I feel like we all are going to have a great time. I am looking forward to it. Let us pray for good weather.

Finally, as we grow in our relationship with the Lord, may he continue to fill our lives with his kindness each day.

Note From Father Mike

Who can conceive what the LORD intends?

This is a question that comes up frequently in our world. Everyone wants to know "What is God thinking? Why did He let that happen? Why did that young person have to die?" Or one of my personal favorite statements is "God is not happy!" Meanwhile, there are also many scientists (as I probably have mentioned before) who seem to want to not only figure out just how old the universe may be, but also how the universe Technically, to those who have even some knowledge of the faith and faith in God, we realize that we can only guess when it comes to those sorts of questions. "No one knows the time or the day when the Lord will return."

Take, for instance, the recent deluge of rains along the Gulf Coast. It's mind-boggling to you and me about the amount of water levels are staggering. We must assume God is not evil. that He never gave into temptation and sinned. Therefore, we want to seek another answer.

What about the extreme heat in Europe like they had not seen in many years? What about the people who have been killed in various instances of "mass shootings" around the country? What about the older man who is beaten, robbed, and left for dead (sometimes actually dying)? What about the continued war in Ukraine? People continue to ask, "what is God trying

to tell us through these and other world events?" The truth is that while we know that God is always good and not vengeful like some once thought, it's clear that one of the lessons we've been told to take from these and other sad stories is that regardless of the situation, KEEP FOLLOWING JESUS' TEACHING TO LOVE ONE ANOTHER.

Extremely late in St. John's Gospel, Peter asks Jesus "Lord, what about him (St. John)?" Jesus responds "What if I want him to remain until I come? What concern is it of yours? YOU FOLLOW ME." (John 21:22) It's not that we shouldn't be asking questions concerning God. After all, we were created to be able to know God as we were created in His image and likeness. That is our starting point. Just as we were conceived in the womb and likely were born approximately nine months later, so to Jesus – the Son of God AND Son of Mary rain they'd been experiencing. 

The St. Cletus Continuing Religious EDucation Opportunities Committee (CREDO) and Father Elmer have collaborated to plan a day trip to Mundelein Seminary! We hope you can join us for a day with Father Elmer and some of his friends and former colleagues.

Date: October 22nd, 2022

Time: Bus leaves at 8am sharp, returns at around 5pm

Cost: \$60 per person

Where: Mundelein Seminary, with special tour guide and speaker arranged by our Pastor!

The day will include a special, expanded tour led by Dr. Paul Hilliard Ph.D., Chairperson of the Department of Church History, and a talk and reflection led by Rev. Brendan Lupton, President of the Pontifical Faculty of Theology, mass celebrated by Father Elmer, lunch, and time to explore the grounds and shop in the bookstore. The day will include approximately a mile of walking on the tour and between buildings, standing, and some stairs. If you are not able to walk that far, you may drop out of the tour for private reflection in the chapel.






