Pastor's Note

"Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light," Matt 17:1-2.

Dear Parishioners,

As we enter and embrace the Second Sunday of Lent, my invitation for us is to engage the feelings we experience each day as we walk with Jesus in the desert. The fruits of walking with Jesus allow us not only to grow in friendship with Him but also to have the deepest experience of His Father, which completely transforms our lives.

Peter, James, and John faithfully walked with Jesus. They saw Jesus radiant with glory and in the company of Moses and Elijah. They saw Christ in a new light because their eyes had changed, and they had matured. They allowed God to heal and to change their hearts. They saw God's power at work.

How are we experiencing and seeing the radiant glory of Jesus in our lives and parish? How are our eyes being changed? How is our faith being strengthened? How is our awareness of Christ's presence, grace, and closeness drawing us closer into the intimacy of his love?

With faith, gratitude, and joy I am happy to share with you some moments where I continue to notice and strongly feel the presence of God in our midst.



First, the celebration of Ash Wednesday was a special day for our parish community. Over 2,400 people came to pray, celebrate, and receive their ashes beginning at 6:30 AM. The seven opportunities for Ashes that our parish offered were well-attended. Each celebration was truly a moment of prayer and encounter with the Lord. My heart was overwhelmed with joy for which I am most grateful. I would like to thank you for the witness you continue to give me. I also would like to acknowledge and thank our Parish Staff, Gushers, Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Music Ministries, and volunteers. Their service, ministry, leadership, and dedication were inspiring. May the Lord continue to fill their hearts with his kindness.

Second, the first special Mass of Hope and Healing that was held on Saturday, Feb 25, 2023, was well attended. We were blessed to have 200 men and women of faith that came to receive the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. They wanted to experience the closeness of God. They wanted to welcome, experience, and receive the healing power of God through the sacrament. They felt the work of the Holy Spirit through the prayers and words of Fr. Ron Kalas who was the principal celebrant. He touched our hearts and brought us closer to the Lord with his spirit-filled faith and joy. He made us feel at home and in the presence of God as we prayed together.



Third, the online survey conducted by the Catholic Leadership Institute is going well. As of Wednesday morning, March 1st, 2023, 315 parishioners have already completed the survey. That is good news. My prayer is that more of you will make the effort to complete the survey. The data collected will help us to be more aware of what is going well and what needs our attention. Please accept my gratitude for your contribution with the success of the survey.

Fourth, the 2nd St. Cletus Lenten Fish Fry Sponsored by St. Cletus Father's Club will be held on Friday, March 10th, 2023, starting at 4:30 PM. Last year five hundred people came and enjoyed the warm and kind hospitality of the members of St. Cletus Father's Club. I would like to take a moment to acknowledge and wholeheartedly thank them for the love they have for St. Cletus, the Lord, and for bringing us closer as a parish community. Please hold them in prayer.

Fifth, Kris and Clara Santin, leaders of the Art and Environment Committee, continue to assist us in making sure the sanctuary of our church looks appropriately arranged and decorated for the season of Lent. They are volunteers. They love sharing their gifts and talents. I am humbled by their dedication to all of us. Please keep them in prayer.

May God continue to bless our desire to walk with His Son, Jesus, and to open our eyes to recognize Him in our midst.

Note From Father Mike

Covenant

Some people refer to this second weekend in Lent as Transfiguration Sunday. I prefer Covenant Sunday. God speaks to Abram (not Abraham yet), telling him to leave his home and land behind, and God speaks a word of promise to him if he heeds God's message.

> "I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you and curse those who curse you. All the communities of the earth shall find blessing in you."

Abram obeys and we know the outcome of the story. Eventually, once Abram arrives in this new land, God blesses him abundantly along with his wife Sara - even though they were both past child-bearing age. And from there Abraham (as he became known as) receives that very promise "that his descendants will become as numerous as the stars in the sky or the sand on the seashore." Obedience to God has great advantages. Disobedience to God has heavy consequences, as Lot's wife found out the hard way.

But the covenant doesn't end with Abraham. No. We see Fr. Mike Jesus carrying out the Father's will, picking up generations of Israel's covenant as it continued through Moses and the great prophets, so we listen to St. Matthew's gospel account of the Transfiguration. Some people might say that

Moses had nothing to do with the covenant between God and man. Not so. We hear in the Book of Deuteronomy "If you obey the commandments of the LORD, your God, which I enjoin on you today, loving him, and walking in his ways, and keeping his commandments, statutes and decrees, you will live and grow numerous." Moses is reminding the Israelites that the covenant message is still valid. And then, through more generations, the prophets were charged with trying to keep the Israelites on track. That's why Jesus is conversing with Moses and Elijah. Yet, Jesus is different than both Moses AND Elijah --"This is my beloved **SON**, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." And Jesus doesn't teach anything different than Moses nor Elijah. Instead, He confirms God's covenant along His entire ministry, being sure to let people experience God's love wherever He went.

We have a responsibility to be sure to keep God's covenant with man. It's not the absolute same covenant that God entered with Abraham. I guess in one sense it is, we must be able to see that God raised the bar on His side in the sacrifice Jesus would eventually make for us. Doesn't it make sense that human beings ought to raise up our part of the covenant? How might we do that during Lent?






