Note From Father Mike

January 21 (3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time) 2024

While we are officially out of the Christmas season, I wanted to take a few minutes to reflect on the goodness of the Christmas Season at St. Cletus and give attention to the Again, thank you to all of our volunteers of St. Cletus. Christmas Eve and Day celebrations.

Advent is a time of preparation for Christmas. It's also more work than some may think. There really was no way St. Cletus would have seen the success we did without the amount of volunteers and ministers who pitched in to bring Christ to life before our eyes. The first group our patrons see as they walk into the church are the ministers known as Onward to God's Kingdom! the gushers (the combination of whose members are both greeters + ushers at Mass). It's a group that tends to be simply made up of smiling faces, greeting our patrons with warmth, gratitude, and sometimes handing out bulletins. The people you see bringing up the bread and wine at the offertory are usually chosen by the gushers, besides taking the collection. Everyone is a top-notch human being. For Christmas EVE especially, they were going here, going there finding more chairs for people to sit in as between the 3pm and 3:15pm Masses there were about 2000 people in attendance.

One of the reasons the 3pm Mass is so popular is because our children's choir sings like the angels they are. It's a lot of parents and other family members that come to hear their children sing so beautifully under the direction of Mr. Ryan Rump, our Director of Music. And with that segue, think about all of the time and energy it took for Ryan to bring various choirs, musicians, and cantors together in order to be sure that every Mass was brilliant and vibrant. Ryan's choirs have really done great, and his volunteer cantors continue to work hard to give the best praise and worship they can.

Our Altar Servers have made some important strides forward. Some of the servers are taking a bit more of a responsibility, especially in terms of learning how to work with incense. Since the arrival of the most recent set of servers were trained, they seem to be more attentive to the Mass and to what comes next. It may not be all of the time right now, but they really did a good job during the Christmas Masses.

From behind the scenes (ideally), sacristans help get things set up for the Mass – putting out the bread and wine to be offered, lighting candles, being sure the books are out and ready to be used, and so much more. We have a very good group of men and women doing this specialized ministry. I intend on teaching them more and more. For now, thanks to all of you for your ministry!

One of the more impressive ministries in my opinion is the Hispanic Ministry led by Juanita Avila. The core group of volunteers are always helping to be sure the 12:30pm Mass

runs like clockwork, as well as special Masses that include Spanish being used. Looking back at Our Lady of Guadalupe celebrations for Mañanitas and Mass of the Roses, the volunteers worked tirelessly to be sure everyone in attendance had a wonderful experience.

These liturgical ministries are only the beginning of the great things that are possible when we all pitch in. It really makes things easier on all people. Please consider one of these ministries or something else. The parish website has a dropdown menu of all ministries. Check them out and see if there is one for you.



Second Collection Next Weekend to Support Our Students

St. Cletus Parish Finance Council Update

The week of November 19, 2023, we published the FY 2023 Parish Financial Report that summarized the Parish's 2023 fiscal year, ending June 30, 2023. We encourage you to read about your continued support & generosity in providing the financial foundation that sustains all of our Parish ministries and initiatives.

Of course, one important component of our community is our Parish elementary school, which has 280 students enrolled in Pre-K through 8th grade. According to Archdiocesan guidelines, parish schools are required to be self-sufficient through tuition and any needed fund-raising, not relying on Parish financial support. Our school has been very successful in completing & following this mandate.

However, a serious setback was dealt to our school and other private schools when the Illinois State Legislature chose to allow the Empower Illinois Scholarship program to expire without renewal. The five-year-old tax credit scholarship program that 9,700 students across the state used, including 23 St. Cletus students was allowed to "sunset" after the 2023 - 2024 school year. Our St. Cletus school received \$113,218 in scholarships this year to help pay either partial or full tuition of \$6.900 per student at St. Cletus. This has caused a huge budget concern for our school and many individual families seeking a Catholic education for their children who now must consider other school options for the next year.

We are writing to you for a couple of reasons. First, to ensure that you are aware of how this short-sighted (in our opinion) decision by the legislature will directly affect our St. Cletus community. This is a real, serious issue for several school families and school administration, and ultimately, our entire Parish. This brings us to our second point.

Three weekends have been set aside for a second collection during Mass to help offset this deficit. The weekends of January 27/28, 2024, which is the start of Catholic Schools week, and the weekends of February 24/25 and April 27/28, 2024. These three weekends also correspond as Family Mass weekends at 10:30 Mass. We realize that many of your budgets are probably already stretched thin, especially after the holidays. However, after examining your family's bottom line and praying about your options, please consider this choice to further show your gratitude for God's blessings. Another option to consider, if this would work for you, would be to sponsor one student for the entire year. As mentioned earlier, this would be \$6,900, probably more as tuition increases. 
