

God reveals himself to the nations

Three wise men were traveling together in the sandhill dunes of the desert. As they stopped to rest for a short time, they noticed something in the far, night sky. A new star appeared. In their traditions, that could only mean one thing – a new king. These wise men were not from Israel, but they noticed that was where the star was leading them to go. They had to follow. Imagine the excitement of meeting and being in the presence of a new king. What a privilege! They just had to show their welcome and respect.

When they noticed that the star was at its brightest and it came to rest over Bethlehem, they were even more excited. They had to go to the star, for that is where the new king would be. When they arrived and dismounted their camels, they took with them their special gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. The place was not what they expected to find. It was not a palace, but quite the opposite. It was a stable. But they didn't question if it was the place, for the star was directly above them. They walked in and saw a baby with his parents. They dropped to their knees in humble adoration and gave their gifts. His parents didn't understand fully since they were foreigners.

The kindness shown by the wise men to an unlikely king shows us that things are not always what they appear to be. There tends to be a larger picture that we need to be open to seeing and react to people or situations with the same kindness, not the ugliness many show in the world we live in. Any one person we meet could be the key to unlocking a new understanding of kindness, but the source of kindness always ought to be in the Holy Spirit. Kindness is one of His fruits. And kindness tends to be "contagious." The more we show kindness, the more others are likely to follow. But if someone asks you about why you are kind to them or how you could possibly be to someone who may not "deserve" it from you, just tell them you learned from Jesus and the Holy Spirit encouraged you in the moment.

The Jubilee Year 2025 for the Catholic Church is focusing on being "Pilgrims of Hope." I have really only been on one pilgrimage in my life officially, but there have been times that I felt called to be somewhere only God would lead me to be. I feel like that is who the wise men were "pilgrims of hope."

What does it mean to be a "pilgrim of hope?"

I am quite certain there will be plenty of articles written over the coming year, some that will be in response to Pope Francis' promulgation of this Jubilee. I am going to be keeping a close eye on just what Pope Francis is saying and how he reflects his thought by his actions. I checked out the document that institutes the Jubilee. His opening is from St. Paul's letter to the Romans and a good place for us to begin "Hope does not disappoint." (Rom. 5:5) Hmmm. Interesting.

I recall leading a prayer service back in 1996 when I was still a student at the seminary. I used this piece of Scripture as my basis for my reflection. Why do we become so despondent when we lose a loved one to death even when we believe in eternal life? It's a pertinent and valid question. It's not a supersimple answer, however. I have often said that hope needs a vision. While I know that sort of defeats of the purpose of hope because it relies on faith, we all need something to look forward to – a light at the end of a long and dark tunnel. Sometimes it takes a while to get to that light, but as long as the light keeps getting brighter and we move closer, our hope increases along the way. When Jesus is our light and our way, our pilgrim journey is much easier.

At a local store, I witnessed someone allow a senior citizen shopper to move ahead of the line and cover the cost of her groceries as well. At home, I witnessed my daughter assisting with the preparation and clean-up of our dinner table, despite not being asked to do so.

What do all of these reflections have in common? Each involved a demonstrated action of assistance, consideration, and unselfishness where nothing was expected in return. Please continue to demonstrate and spread kindness from within your heart.




AARP Tax-Aide Needs Volunteers for the 2025 Tax Filing Season

Looking for a rewarding opportunity to make a difference in your community?

The AARP Tax-Aide Program is now seeking volunteers for the upcoming 2025 tax filing season. It's not necessary for you to be an AARP member or to have a tax or an accounting background to volunteer. However, some knowledge of your own personal tax matters is very helpful. All returns are prepared on computers; thus, volunteers should be somewhat computer literate. Training classes will be held in January, 2025. Minimum time commitment during the filing season is 4 to 5 hours one day per week from early February to mid-April.

This income tax preparation and assistance service is offered to low and middle income individuals with special attention to those 60 years and older. Won't you help?
