A Note from the Pastor's Desk

"The Lord, your God is in your midst, a mighty savior, he will rejoice over you with gladness, and renew you in his love, he will sing joyfully because of you, as one sings at festivals."

Zephaniah 3: 17-18

Dear Friends,

The Scripture passage above gives us a remarkable image of God. It says that he sings *because of you, as one sings at festivals!* Wow! This image of God is beautiful and inspiring. Now I understand more the reason why I appreciate so much the leadership, witness, and ministry of the members of the choirs we are blessed to have at our parish. We see and hear God singing for us through each of them. How blessed we are seeing and hearing God singing for us and with us every time we gather to worship him at Mass.

Perhaps this week, The Third Sunday of Advent, you can approach and spend time with God who sings because of you. Perhaps you can sing along with him. Perhaps you can include members of your family, friends, or a neighbor to sing along with you. Could you imagine the effects and fruits of singing with God? Nowadays, we have Advent hymns, Christmas carols, and worship songs available online. I am learning to use them often. Consider trying it.

Turning to God who sings is exciting. This means that he does not only give us commandments, sermons, and speeches. He sings joyfully because of us. This is mind-blowing. We mean so much to him. The saints--think of St. Francis, Mother Teresa, or Dorothy Day—they are like great songs God composed for us. How about Beethoven, Pavarotti, Bocelli, Sinatra, Bach, or Taylor Swift? God gave them to us. They and so many others are ways that God sings joyfully because of us. In a real sense, we are his songs.

At our Thanksgiving Day Mass (11/28) the desire to give thanks together for our blessings was beautifully expressed, shared, and celebrated. We

all felt the presence of God in our midst. He gave us his grace and blessing to feel at home and pray well together. He gave us the opportunity to thank him in two languages: English and Spanish. Michael Burns and Beronica Martinez made us feel welcomed with their kind words at the beginning of Mass. We were led in song by an amazing choir: children and adults. We heard the voice of God singing through them. We had two homilists: Fr. Novick and Fr. Garcia. We were joined by Fr. Ron Kalas, who loves praying and celebrating Mass at our parish. We noticed the sanctuary of our church arranged beautifully for the special Thanksgiving Day Mass. We were also inspired by the witness of all ministers who served and fulfilled their ministries with care, joy, and love. Thank you for making our bilingual Thanksgiving Day Mass special with your presence, active participation, and love.

We have two amazing Christmas concerts taking place at our parish this week. The first one, *Bending Towards the light: a Jazz Nativity* will be happening this afternoon (12/15) at 4:00 PM in the Parish Center sponsored by the Ed Ward Fine Arts Serries. The second one: *A Child Is Born! A Christmas Choral Concert* hosted by the St. Cletus Music Ministry will be taking place next Sunday, December 22nd at 4:00 PM in our beautiful church. Bring along members of your family or friends or a neighbor. The Lord is giving us two wonderful opportunities to grow in fraternity, community, and friendship with him and one another. Remember, God sings, and you are his songs. I hope you can join us.

May the Lord continue to renew us in his love so that our hearts are better prepared for the birth of his Son.

A Note from the Associate pastor's Desk

Once again, we have arrived at the weekend of a slight and very quick color-change in these Advent days. Yes, it's Gaudete Sunday, and the Church marks this day of joy by focusing on a shocking color to help us realize that Jesus is nearer to us than ever before. I sometimes wonder why the Church chose this option of rose vestments and not some other color. Orange would have been just as shocking, don't you think? But then again, maybe orange would be considered a color to proceed with caution. So why rose? For one, it certainly has a shock value. It is also near violet in the color wheel spectrum. But more than those reasons, while the violet colors of Advent remind us to wait in joyful hope, rose is supposed to get us to be excited that Jesus is very close and that we need to focus on making final preparations for his arrival.

This week, on Tuesday, the Church kicks off the Octave (eight days) before Christmas. The fathers of the Church were very deliberate about what readings we ought to have from December 17th thru the 24th. And December 17th starts us off right by the reading of the genealogy of Jesus at the very beginning of St. Matthew's gospel. (Did you know that St. Luke has a version of Jesus' genealogy too?) Yes, I know that so many of those long Hebrew names mean absolutely nothing to us, but the Church says otherwise. Like so many people

who have researched on Ancestry.com or watched "Finding Your Roots" on PBS channels, we subconsciously want to know where we came from, trying to go back as many generations as possible. That's is the beauty of the genealogy of Jesus. It goes back 42 generations starting with Abraham, working its way forward to Joseph and therefore to Jesus.

The genealogy also has King David as a part of the lineage. That is the same King David of whom it was prophesied that the Savior would descend from. It's the same David who overcame Goliath with a sling and a stone. It's also the same King David whom the Book of Psalms is credited. Jesus also came through the same people who had been in exile for a couple of generations. So this person is not going to be any ordinary person. This long-awaited Savior is going to be someone with great power and will show us the glory of the God of Israel. Neat, right? Read ahead this week to the gospels for each day of the Octave. It may not hold for the 4th Sunday of Advent simply because the 4th Sunday doesn't fall on the same date each year, but if you read them all together, you have a clearer picture of not only WHO Jesus is, but what His ultimate mission would be – hope for the salvation of all people.

Spes non confundit - Bull of Indiction of the Ordinary Jubilee of the Year 2025 (9 May 2024) I Francis

The Holy Father has designated the Jubilee of Hope, a Holy Year beginning December 29, 2024 and ending on December 28, 2025. The Holy Father Francis wants the coming Jubilee Year 2025 to be lived as a "year of hope," very symbolic in times when the world's wars seem to be unending and multiplying.

The Jubilee Year will offer the faithful opportunities to participate in various jubilee events at the Vatican and in their own dioceses. The great tradition of opening the Holy Door will begin when Pope Francis opens the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica on December 24, 2024. Other holy doors will be opened at the Rome basilicas of St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major and St. Paul Outside the Walls. For pilgrims who cannot travel to Rome, bishops around the world are expected to designate sites as special places of prayer for Holy Year pilgrims, offering opportunities for reconciliation, indulgences and other events intended to strengthen and revive faith.

As part of the observance of the Jubilee Year, Pope Francis has granted a plenary indulgence. One of the means for obtaining the Indulgence is that the faithful make a pilgrimage to a parish or shrine designated as a Jubilee Pilgrimage Site. At these parishes or shrines the faithful experience and obtain the indulgence by spending time in prayer, adoration before the tabernacle, or participating in the celebration of the Eucharist or Reconciliation (as well as by making a profession of faith and praying for the Holy Father's intentions).

Requests of a pilgrimage site of the Archdiocese of Chicago:

- By being designated a site for the Jubilee of Hope Indulgence, these parishes would agree to welcome the faithful at designated times (determined by the parish) for prayer, or for the celebration of Mass or Reconciliation at their scheduled times.
- When the archdiocesan list of parishes and shrines is publicized, parishes designated as Jubilee Year pilgrimage sites will be listed along with the times the church is open, and the schedule of Masses and opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- There are no specific or "extra" liturgies or celebrations that would be required.


