Dear Parishioners,

Through the ongoing practice and celebration of our faith we grow in relationship with the Lord. We notice this growing closeness of the Lord when we pray and attend Mass. We also sense being in the presence of the Lord when we spend time with those who are ill, lonely, and going through difficult times in life. We sense being in the presence of the Trinity each time we share our love and concerns to others. We feel claimed and sent to spread kindness.

As you continue to grow in your relationship with the Lord, I kindly ask you to be attentive to the subtle ways the Lord is reaching out to you. Personally, I continue to notice his presence, smile, and joy each time you and I have the opportunity to exchange a few words before or after Mass. Note From Father Mike

Wisdom

Several years ago, I began to contemplate what I might be able to offer someone who asks me to define "wisdom." There are many ways to think about it – and that is the point. Here is MY definition of "wisdom:" humanity began to become wise when we began thinking about our intelligence. One might say that wisdom comes with not only what we think about our ideas, but also is putting those ideas into tangible actions. What makes an action wise, though? If it's an idea is used for the betterment of humanity -- for the good. For instance, was the idea of a nuclear weapon wise to make reality? Probably not. Why? It has the potential to harm other human beings. Even if we might want to think "If our country is attacked via a nuclear strike, then we can defend ourselves and harm the enemy." The potential is still a threat. That isn't wise.

It's the first of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. Well, maybe it isn't the "first" gift given since they are equally given all at the same time, but it's still the one we hear most people when listing the seven gifts. The first reading for Sunday, November 12 is all about wisdom. It's so beautifully written.

I think about the Apostles after Pentecost. I think about the rushing wind that comes into the room bringing the tongues of fire resting over each of them. Then, within another scene or two in Acts of the Apostles, St. Peter encounters the lame man. He put into action what he learned from Jesus. He not only had the faith that Jesus gave the Apostles authority over illness and disease, but also how to use the gifts. How does Peter help? "I have neither silver nor gold, but what I do have I give you: in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazorean, [rise and] walk." Then Peter took him by the right hand and raised him up, and immediately his feet and ankles grew strong" (Acts 3:6-7). He knows that it is not the healer, but Jesus is.

During November we are given many opportunities to remember and use the lessons we've learned from Jesus. Besides All Saints Day and the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls Day), there is Thanksgiving coming soon, Veterans Day, Armistice Day, (those two days are this weekend), and the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. All of these special days are particularly important to use the Wisdom of the Holy Spirit so that we remember to give thanks for the gifts of our humanity and relationship with Jesus.

Speaking of Veterans Day (November 11th), please take the opportunity to say thank you to our military veterans for the service to our country. I know that the veterans are very proud to have given their time, putting their lives on the line to be sure we remain a free country. I have seen more veterans wearing their caps in public. Many are in wheelchairs whether because of an injury or simply because age has caught up to them. And if you don't see our veterans out and about, please remember to pray for them and thank God for them.
