

Pastor's Note

"Brothers and Sisters:
May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father,
who has loved us and given us everlasting encouragement

Dear Friends,

It is always good to hear the voice of God through St. Paul. He was a lucky man to be encountered and loved by the risen Lord. He allowed the Lord to touch and transform his entire life. The Lord became an essential part of his life. After that encounter and personal experience of the risen Lord, St. Paul dedicated his entire life talking and sharing about Jesus Christ, whom he loved until the last second of his life.

As I pray and journey with you, I continue to notice how the love, spirit, grace, and encouragement of our Lord Jesus Christ is present and active in each of you. Your love and commitment to the Lord is contagious and encouraging. Your faithful participation at daily Mass and weekend Masses is so edifying. Your sense of hospitality, community, and belonging is wonderful. Your openness, flexibility, and generosity are inspiring. Your contribution, interest, and participation in our efforts to grow in fraternity and friendship with each other has been uplifting.

Below I share with you some concrete examples where the spirit, grace, encouragement, and love of our Lord Jesus Christ has been at work.

First, I am pleased to let you know that the installation of the new sound and streaming system in our church has been completed (80%). The work began on Monday, October 17, and was completed by Friday, October 28, 2022. New equipment, wires, speakers, and cameras were mounted on walls and ceiling throughout the church. Last Sunday after Mass, many of you shared with me your positive feedback and satisfaction about the new sound system. I heard words such as, "I was able to hear the word of God," "I was able to hear Father's homily," and "I will tell my friends that now we can hear everything our church." The company will be back in Spring of next year to install some equipment (20%) that has been backordered. For more technical details, please visit the parish website. I would like to take this opportunity to offer you my heartfelt gratitude for your prayers, trust, and financial support for the successful completion of this needed project.

Second, now that we are blessed to have a new sound system and aware of our desire to be able to hear the word of God well and with clarity, we are offering two Audio Training Sessions for all those who are responsible for proclaiming the word of God at Mass. The first one will be on Friday, November 11, 2022, at 12:00 PM. The second one will be on Friday, November 18, 2022, at 7:00 PM. The sessions will take place in church. Lectors are encouraged to attend one session. Also, if you are thinking of becoming a lector, please come and join us. Looking forward to it.

Third, 20 members of our 12:30 PM Mass just completed their formation to become new Lectors. They attended four hours of formal training which was led by Juanita Avila, Director of Hispanic Ministry, in collaboration with the Office of Divine Worship of the Archdiocese. It is such a blessing to see how people want to get involved, help, and serve the Lord. Please keep our new Lectors in prayer. Below you will see their names.

Fifth, I was sad to learn on Wednesday afternoon, November 2nd, 2022, the death of Rev. Raymond Klees (ordination class of 1973) former pastor of St. Cletus Parish. He served St. Cletus from 1992 to 2006. Funeral arrangements are still pending and will be available on the parish website when we receive them. Please pray for his soul.

Note from Father Mike

Believe It Or Not

The gospel reading for this weekend, about the Sadducees testing Jesus, has a marvelous lesson about marriage and how precious life is. One of the goals of marriage is the creation of a family. What I find interesting about the story/situation the Sadducees propose to Jesus is fundamental but subtle – this woman seems to intentionally be married before trying to conceive a child. She is chaste between the marriages to the seven brothers. Of course, having a child out of wedlock was a serious crime in those days.

We get a chance to appreciate just how serious of a crime bringing a child into the world outside of marriage is very early in the Bible. Remember that old man, Abraham? What did Sarai tell Abraham he should do about having an heir? She allowed him to have relations with her maidservant, Haggar, who bore a son, Ishmael. But Abraham sort of undermines his new offspring and practically pays Haggar to leave with the child because he knew that he had put both her and the child's lives in danger. He didn't want to see any harm come to them. God's messenger tells Abraham that his descendants that would become as numerous as the stars of the sky or the sands on the seashore would be through Sarah. And so it happened. A barren and elder woman is going to bear a child? Impossible! But it does and Isaac is born through the woman Abraham was married to.

The other and more obvious example of a child that was conceived out of wedlock was Jesus, of course. We are told that Joseph had decided to divorce Mary quietly. They were only engaged when Jesus was conceived. However, thanks to the grace of God, God's messengers visit both Mary and Joseph telling them not to be afraid. And they marry. Joseph was a descendant of King David's family (who and how did someone do the ancestry.com work back then). How else could Joseph have known that the family of King David was going to be responsible for raising the Savior of the world in his home?

While it might only be perception, many children ARE born into our world outside of wedlock, but it's no longer a crime. And while it is a great and noble thing to become a mother and/or father, raising children in our world today tends to be much easier when the two people who brought the child into the word are either married or get married during a pregnancy. There are far too many broken homes or homes with single parents trying to do their best to be sure their children are becoming responsible and faith-filled human beings, but that it very difficult. That's not just something from a movie. It's reality.

If you are a single parent and succeeding in your duty as a parent, rearing your children to grow up to be good human beings, I applaud you. If you are the product of a single parent who raised you to be a good human being, I applaud you even louder as you had to learn many difficult lessons, sometimes on your own. I hope you that would mean that you were able to find good resources to help and that you didn't truly have to "go it alone." I also hope that if you grew up in a "broken home" that you do not wish any ill-will toward your parents. They may not have been able to carry out things exactly how every parent dreams, but they DID NOT panic. They took your life very seriously and took a chance to let you live.

Moral decisions are never easy to make. As I like to say "That's why they call them 'morals." They take lots of prayer and thought. More often than not, they take lots of discussion too. The key is still trusting God. What is it HE wants?

The last thing Jesus says in that gospel this weekend is that "God is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to Him, all are alive."

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The sudden and unexpected influx of men, women and children seeking asylum to U.S cities, including Chicago, over recent weeks has presented our community with significant challenges but also significant opportunities to share God's message of compassion and joy. The plight of these asylum seekers, most of whom are fleeing violence, political oppression and crushing poverty in their home countries causes us grave concern, but I am convinced that this is a moment for us to join together in a mission of love and mercy.

Over 3,000 asylum seekers arrived in our city as of mid-October. Almost all the migrants we have welcomed report that they plan to stay in the Chicago area and will need support to reestablish their lives. Unlike other migrants, most do not have relatives in the States with whom they can live and learn as they build new lives.

The Catholic community has shown an outpouring of compassion as churches, religious congregations, and other ministries have opened their doors, and Catholic Charities has deployed a team to connect people with loved ones and conduct initial needs assessments. Across the Church, many parishes have responded, and more help is needed. We have mobilized to create a coordinated Catholic response to assist asylum seekers so we might maximize the impact of our assistance as we bear witness to our faith. A Working Group has gathered to evaluate opportunities to serve. We are considering several options including transitional shelter, parish sponsorships, and pastoral care for asylum seekers.

In support of these efforts, parishes throughout the Archdiocese will hold a second collection for asylum seekers at all Masses celebrated the weekend of November 5-6. The commitment of faithful Catholics like you will help ensure the success of this mission. Please consider giving to this collection or giving directly to Catholic Charities which will serve as a central gathering point for donations.
