Since almost 2000 years ago, Jesus, the Son of God, has been inviting us to collaborate with him in the mission he received from his Father. Note From Father Mike

Day of Renewal and the Eucharistic Revival

My friends, I am fully aware of the fact that October is Respect Life Month (RLM). Maybe I can shed some light on RLM next week. Today, I want to offer a couple of reflections on the Archdiocesan Day of Renewal this past Monday (Sept 25th).

There has always been something innately good about people coming to one place from around the Archdiocese. We've had them at the Cathedral as well as a couple of other Parishes in the past. This year, the Cardinal gathered not only priests but some staff members and other leaders from the Parishes, many of which are newly merged and formed Parishes through the Renew My Church process. Gatherings like this one show the super-diversity of cultures that surround us every day, from all walks of life. As I've shown you before on my mathematically influenced "Catholic line graph," we come from varying ecclesiologies that are from "extreme liberals" to "extreme conservatives" with Jesus Christ being at the very center of the graph.

There were three keynote speakers that included Cardinal Cupich, Cardinal Raniero Cantalamessa (by video message from the Vatican), and Fr. John Riccardo (priest of the Archdiocese of Detroit and founder of the organization *Acts XXIX* – Acts 29 for those who don't know Roman numerals). All were good, but the talk from Fr. Riccardo was most intriguing. His organization's name is cryptic by makes sense when we realize the book of the Bible The Acts of the Apostles has only 28 chapters. So, *Acts XXIX* is the organization's way of saying "What's next? Who's on deck?" Someone has to pick up where those brave souls who took Jesus' commission to the world of the Mediterranean Sea coastal region left off to go farther than that region. He used several examples of some more modern-day men and women who have done what many might say as crazy, but they followed their beliefs to the depth of their souls to show that not only is Jesus Christ for everyone, but that He lives on in us and in our actions.

My favorite of Fr. Riccardo's stories was about a cradle-Catholic who left the Church and joined a Hitler-led Germany in World War II. He was assigned to Auschwitz and participated in the killing of thousands of people. Eventually, he was arrested himself and thought he would be executed. Instead, he was treated with pity and mercy, coming to his senses and in need of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Many priests were slain at Auschwitz, but one (by the grace of God) was spared. That priest's brethren were captured and killed under the soldier's watch, yet, that priest went and heard the confession and absolved the soldier.

Simple extraordinary love shown. That priest practiced what he had been preaching for many years before – become that which you receive. In the Eucharist, we become the Body of Christ.

That's how I came to see the value of the Day of Renewal in terms of the Eucharistic Revival we are currently in.

As I said in my homily last week, I see not only a lack of love for the Eucharist or the faithful not seeing the need to receive the grace of the Most Blessed Sacrament, but we are in a crisis of faith and understanding that ordinary bread and wine ARE changed through the consecration by the Holy Spirit at Mass. Remember that statistic of 69% of all Catholics do NOT believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Think about that priest hearing that confession of the soldier. If not for the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, then how does someone go the extra mile and forgive someone from the heart? If not for the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, then why would we even bother being at Mass every week? As has been said over and over again, you can pray by yourself anywhere, but the only place to pray and have a VERY good meal is at Church WITH the community of believers. Jesus took time to pray alone at the mount, but he ate together with sinners – AND still does.

God spoke to us today through Cardinal Cupich and how we are willing to accept the Renewal of the Church through our faith. Thank you for the opportunity to be at the Archdiocesan Day of Renewal. God is good all the time! All the time God is good!” - Juanita Avila

“My holy moment was learning about Jesus the entire day. With the speakers that were there today, they were so prepared and filled by the Holy Spirit. I felt very connected with Jesus with the words they shared with us.” -Deacon Ramon Cazales

- 1) The Cardinal’s keynote and specifically his explanation of the Liturgy of the Word and Liturgy of the Eucharist. 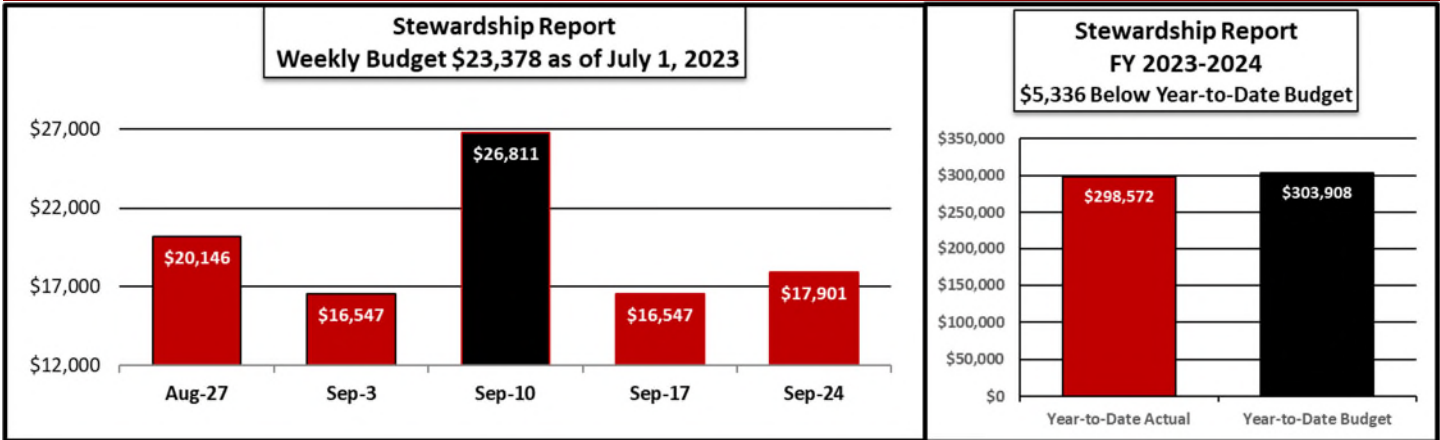
