

Pastor's Note

Dear Friends,

Today is the last day of 2023. With faith, appreciation, and gladness we thank the Lord for all the blessings he has bestowed upon us this year. Today, we are also invited to celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. We are truly loved by God.

The year 2023 has been a good year for us at St. Cletus Parish. Our sense of belonging, feeling welcomed and at home, and our care for each other have been strengthened through the many community building opportunities we had such as the Fish Frye, Pig Roast, Ed Ward Fine Series, and Fall Festival, just to name a few. Our souls were also nourished through the Evening of Prayer and Reflections, Music Ministries, prayerfully celebrated Masses on weekdays and weekends, and through many other spiritual gatherings and prayers our parish was blessed to have.

The Social Concern Ministry, led by Kendall Grant, has been a source of blessing for all of us at our parish. Kendall, through her countless kind and caring volunteers, has shared the love of Christ to every woman and man that came to our parish. Our Christmas Giving Tree Program was a success. I was moved seeing you picking up a name from the Christmas Tree and then delivering your gift to the parish. I noticed that every gift was carefully wrapped. I was also encouraged seeing many volunteers with smiles on their faces passing on the gifts to the many recipients on the weekend of December 16-17, 2023. I would like to thank Kendall, the volunteers, and each and every one of you, for sharing your blessings with care and love. It is through your witness that I continue to experience the closeness and love of God.

On December 12, 2023, we celebrated the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, which was beautiful and filled with the love of God. We started her feast day at 4:45 AM by singing Las Mañanitas (Morning songs) to our Lady which was led by an excellent Mariachi. There were over 430 people that attended Las Mañanitas. After Mass all were invited to the Parish Center for fellowship which was another source of blessing for all. I felt the love of Our Lady of Guadalupe as we sang Las Mañanitas, celebrated Mass, and shared a meal together. I would like to thank Juanita Avila, Director of Hispanic Ministry, the volunteers, and the special committee, for their witness, ministry, and fine leadership.

I am happy to share with you that after The Mañanitas had completed, one of our parishioners, Manuel Ruiz, approached me and asked if he and some of his fellow workers could have permission to clean up the parish grounds in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe. He said that they had spoken to their employer, Tony Colant, the owner of Colant Landscaping, and explained to him that December 12 is a very important Feast Day for them, and could they please take the day off from work, which Tony granted. They also asked if they could borrow his company equipment to use at the parish for the day, which Tony also gave approval for. Consequently, Manuel, his son Antonio, Martin Martinez, and Sergio Nuñez spent most of Tuesday morning diligently working around the entire St. Cletus campus leaf blowing, mulching, and pruning back bushes in preparation for Spring next year, all in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe. On behalf of St. Cletus parish, I gratefully say a big "Thank You" to Mr. Colant for allowing his landscaping company equipment to be used, for the dedication and generosity of Manuel, Antonio, Martin, and Sergio in giving of their time and talent cleaning the parish grounds, and for their inspiring devotion to and love for Our Lady of Guadalupe.

I grew up hearing my father saying, "generosity begets generosity." After a long time, now I feel like I am starting to understand what he wanted me to learn and appreciate. Since July 1st, 2021, you have been showing me this with that special love you have for St. Cletus Parish and the Lord. As we conclude this year, 2023, I would like to offer you my sincere gratitude for your witness, generosity, and for having the Lord as part of your life.

Note From Father Mike

What makes a family holy?

I think I've heard this question posed before and I hope anyone who has asked was not thinking that Jesus, Mary, and Joseph shouldn't be considered holy. Au contraire, of course, they ARE THE Holy Family. Still, was it merely because of the gifts that were bestowed on Mary's Immaculate Conception, and the Annunciation of Jesus when Mary said yes? Where does Joseph fit in? There wasn't anything special or divine about him. Why should he be considered as a member of the Holy Family?

My hope is that we can all appreciate the role of Joseph in raising Jesus as if He were his own flesh and blood. Some places I've seen where Joseph is referred to as either a "foster father" or an "father by adoption" for Jesus. I can see how that makes some sense; however, Joseph is much more.

Go back and read the two opening pieces of St. Matthew's gospel. It's different from St Luke. Luke's gospel drips with dramatic scenes. It has Zechariah (the father of John the Baptist) having an encounter with the Archangel Gabriel, who brings news similar to the news he brings to our blessed mother. Joseph has a similar encounter too in Luke's gospel, where St. Matthew simply says that Joseph had a dream as he was told not to be afraid to take Mary as his wife "for it is through the Holy Spirit that she is with child." They are subtle differences but what it boils down to is that Matthew and Luke had two different audiences whom they were writing for – Jews and the Gentiles respectively.

The Jews St. Matthew was writing to would have needed an explanation of just how Jesus is connected way back through Abraham, and Joseph is the common person. That is why Joseph is told what to name Mary's child – because Joseph is from King David's royal bloodline that works all the way back to Abraham. On the other hand, while that might not have been as important to the Gentile community, there had to be something more extraordinary about the child Jesus and his connection with this figure we came to know as John the Baptist.

So what makes a family holy? Can we any family be considered holy? The answer is yes. I think my family is holy. It's not because we don't argue or hurt on another's feelings – we do. Or because we have anything unique and special about us. We are holy because in the heat of a world filled with discord, we know what it takes to be together and united in purpose. We don't even do things exactly the same way, but when we need to band together, that bond is forged in our hearts, because God gave us each other as gifts.






