# Pastor's Note

"When you send forth your spirit, they are created, and you renew the face of the earth." Psalm 104:30.

Dear Friends,

What are the blessings of having God as part of our lives?

God delights in blessings us, in generously sharing his life with us, and in pouring out his spirit upon us every second of our lives. He wants us to let him heal and purify our thoughts, feelings, and actions. In all of this, God seeks to renew the hearts of every man and woman through us. Our Parish will be hosting an evening of prayer and reflection entitled: "What if Holiness Is Actually an Adventure? on Wednesday, June 12, 2024, at 7:00 PM in our beautiful church. Our special speaker is Matt Lozano. He is a man of deep faith. He has let God transform his thoughts, feelings, and actions. Since then, he has made the choice to allow God to work through him. He travels the world inviting people to return to the Lord and remain in his love. He is a gentle, thoughtful, and caring person. I encourage you to consider attending this important moment of grace the Lord is offering us. Please join me in extending this invitation to others.

Following the prompting of the Holy Spirit, I decided to establish a Eucharistic Revival Committee for our parish. The first meeting took place back on August 9<sup>th</sup>, 2023. After a period of getting to know each other, prayer, and discernment, some initiatives were offered and implemented. First, on Wednesday, October 4<sup>th</sup>, we hosted our first Solemn Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament in English. During Lent, a thoughtful weekly Eucharistic reflection was offered through our parish bulletin, which was prepared by Michael Eardley, a member of the Eucharistic Revival Committee. Seeing the commitment and love the committee has for the Lord, a decision was made to offer a monthly Solemn Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The first one was on March 6<sup>th</sup>, 2024. The most recent one was last week, May 8<sup>th</sup>, 2024. The next one will be on Wednesday, June 5<sup>th</sup>, 2024, at 7:00 PM.

The faith, energy, and love of the Eucharistic Revival Committee continues to grow. With their leadership, we will be hosting a Solemn Eucharistic Procession on Saturday, June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024, starting at 6:15 PM. I believe this is a unique opportunity for us to come together and walk together with Jesus around the parish grounds. My hope is that all, including those offering the amazing ministries our parish is blessed with, will want to be part of this Solemn Eucharistic Procession. More details about it will be shared next weekend. Know that your prayer, support, and cooperation is greatly appreciated.

May the Holy Spirit heal our wounds, renew our faith, and kindle in our hearts the love God has for each of us.

# **Note From Father Mike**

### It's The Birthday Of The Church!

Pentecost Sunday is considered to be the Church's official birthday. It was that day that the Apostles were strengthened and convicted by the Holy Spirit to proclaim the gospel without fear of circumstances. Jesus gave them the mission when he was taken up to heaven before their eyes and He said, "Go into the all the world and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." But it was not until the Apostles received the Holy Spirit – a driving force, a sense of confidence, courage, and more – when they went out to the people to speak all languages and so that everyone could listen and respond to the power of Jesus' life, passion, death, and resurrection. It's interesting that this weekend is the celebration of priesthood ordination in the Archdiocese.

So many of us priests were ordained this time of the year. It's not always on Pentecost because of the way the church calendar works, but Chicago has tried to keep the third Saturday in May for the great celebration of Holy Orders. May 19, 2001 was my ordination day. Twenty-three years of laughter, tears, popes, bishops, joy, heartache, and blessings beyond my wildest dreams. I knew it would be this way because I watched what my priests did in their daily living. Of course, not so much as a child, but my priests were present, spirit -filled, examples of goodness. They became friends as I grew up and began to be more involved in a couple of ministries. And over time in the seminary (eventually), I got to know even more priests who have also been shining examples of love.

What can I say of just how this vocation has shaped me now officially over 23 years?

Ministry had a rather auspicious start. Just three months after ordination, the events of 9/11/2001 happened. In March 2002, the pastor to which I was first assigned informed the staff that a skin cancer he had in previous years had returned with a vengeance. Then in August 2002, that pastor died. He was a long-time friend of my parents and family. The parish was devastated. Gratefully, I was not the only priest at the parish, but even the other associate was only ordained three before me. Certainly a "baptism by fire" experience.

I also experienced my first priest convocation — a sort of retreat that is not merely informative, but time to focus on the fraternity we all share. Many dioceses have their convocations annually; however, the Archdiocese normally has them every three years. In many ways, that is because of the size of our presbyterate (or at least it was, since we have approximately 60% of the priests we once had still serving, and not ordaining nearly enough). That first year, I assigned myself to be the unofficial greeter at the front desk of the resort we were using, welcoming as many priests by name as I could, especially my elders, sometimes even giving them help with their luggage. It's usually a solid time to focus on our fraternity.

Our next convocation is a month from now. It'll be the second time using the resort in lower Wisconsin. The one we used for many years really went downhill and eventually closed.

My friends, I said it way back at my first Mass in 2001 at the end of my homily, "I ought to invest in Dramamine. I get motion sick pretty easily. This priestly ministry promises to be a roller coaster with many twists and turns, ups and downs." Almost prophetically, that has been very true. And while celebrating funerals is a stronger point of ministry for me, I've battled my own grief quite often having buried many family members and three of my closest friends. This is my life, and I wouldn't have it any other way.

The Holy Spirit is certainly at work with our St. Cletus CCW.

We then enjoyed some delicious heart shaped cookies baked by Michele Blecic and great conversations. We ended our meeting with prayer and an invitation to anyone interested in working on our Board to help plan meetings, events, service projects and other social gatherings to join us for an indoor picnic (due to the cicadas) at our next Board Meeting on June 12th at 6 pm In the Gallagher Room. 

# **Eucharistic Revival Reflection**

### **Eucharistic Revival: Preparing for Our Eucharistic Procession**

On **Saturday, June 1, at 6:15 p.m.** (i.e., following the 5:00 Mass) we are hosting a truly exciting and transformative event—a **Eucharistic procession to celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi**. Unlike common liturgies and devotionals such as the Mass or saying the rosary, a procession isn't all that familiar to us 21<sup>st</sup> Century Catholics. So, what's the deal? Why are we doing this? Why should we as parishioners attend?

The short answer: Jesus Christ, who rose from the dead, continues to call each one of us to "Come, follow me." By processing with his true presence in the Eucharist, we remind not only ourselves, but also the outside world, that Jesus is present, active in our world, and inviting us to share in his eternal life.


It doesn't take much effort to recognize our brokenness and hunger for fulfilment in today's world. It's apparent in our media, in witnessing the suffering in our city, and in the trials of those we encounter that we are in need of saving. St. Augustine's famous realization that our hearts are restless until they rest in God is as true today as it was 1600 years ago. We try to fill the God-shaped hole in our hearts with all sorts of things—relationships, experiences, politics, entertainment, careers, pleasure—but, to a person, these fall short. It can be tempting to fall into despair or cling to what we can control, only to be disappointed in the end.

As Christians, we know that the typical end we fear—death—does not have the final word. We have a reason to hope. We have a savior who offers something extraordinary: eternal life. We are called by Jesus to go out to the world and spread this good news. A procession outside the walls of our church is a concrete means of doing just this.

We also need to remind ourselves of this reality. Our bishops introduced this period of Eucharistic Revival precisely because our church is forgetting to remember the extraordinary truth that God remains with us in the Eucharist. We sing the national anthem before football games to remind ourselves of the liberties we enjoy. We wear wedding rings to remind ourselves of the commitments we have made. Similarly, we participate in liturgical celebrations to refocus our hearts and minds on what it is we believe.

On the Feast of Corpus Christi (that is, the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ), St. Cletus Parish and many other parish communities across the world will process with the Eucharist as a reminder of God's presence in our world, a reminder that we are *followers* in need of Christ, a reminder that we have received the means to overcome brokenness and death. We will process with the Eucharist in a monstrance, as we use during adoration, around our church grounds, stopping at five altars along the way for brief prayers and reflections. It is a time to celebrate the beauty of God's gift as a community, to offer our prayers before the Lord, and to demonstrate that our faith is not limited to the four walls of our church.

This is an event for everyone—adults, children, those who seek out adoration, those to whom this is completely new. Come deepen your faith on a summer evening and remind yourself—and the community around us—that God is truly with us. Please do not hesitate to approach one of our priests or a member of the parish pastoral council if you have any questions.






