

Notes from Fr. Bob...

CHRISTMAS EVE 2016

"A child has been born to us, a son given to us. Today a savior has been born to you," the angels tell the shepherds. "And here is a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger." This is the oh so familiar message, which touches our hearts as we see little children gathered around the crib. Instinctively on this night we are drawn back to our own childhood memories, and of course it is the children's feast, but not only the children's feast. This is not a fairy tale which we love to hear again, but which has no bearing on our lives. This feast has everything to do with real life: the life you are living right now, whatever your age. No doubt that is why the Church includes the short reading from the letter to Titus in the liturgy. Once we have grasped the meaning of this feast we will have no ambition except to do good.

So listen again to that message of the angels: "Today a savior has been born to you...and here is a sign for you." That message was not just for the shepherds two thousand years ago, but for each one of us here this evening. A Savior has been born for us – but do we notice the signs all around us: the signs of people doing good? There are signs of God breaking into our world and being present in our lives, if only we have the eyes to see them. Let's find some examples. The old parishioner facing a major, life-threatening operation who told his friends very simply: "I'm not frightened. If the Lord wants me, he'll take me, if he doesn't, fine." Such deep faith and trust in God is a sign of the Savior's birth, of God's presence among us. The mother who has been abandoned and betrayed by her husband, but who sets aside her own sadness to ensure that her children's lives are normal, happy and secure: a sign of the Savior's presence. The grandmother with cancer, celebrating her last Christmas, determined to make sure it is one the family will enjoy and remember: a sign of the Savior's birth. The man who after many years of hurt and anger with the Church, returns to the practice of his faith: a sign of God's presence. The person who after years of resentment finally finds the courage to forgive: a sign of the Savior's birth.

The sign given to the shepherds wasn't something dramatic or extraordinary, but a very ordinary, very human sign: a new born baby. So ordinary, it would be easy to miss it. When we look for the signs of the Savior's presence, we too need to look to the ordinary – to our own nearest and dearest, to the daily struggles and sacrifices of the people in our lives, to the everyday joys and blessings of life. The Incarnation is not simply a one off historical

event.

St. Paul tells us:

"God's grace has been revealed." The Savior continues to be born for us, and your life is full of the signs of his presence. Whenever there is love, courage, sacrifice, service, forgiveness, then he is truly present among us.

Christmas isn't about hearing a lovely sentimental story just once a year to help us forget the cold, harsh reality of our daily lives. It's about realizing that the deepest reality of our lives lies precisely in that story of the birth of a Savior. The sense of joy and hope we experience when we see a child placing the baby in the manger is in fact the truth of our life. Today a Savior has been born to you – in your life. He is Christ the Lord, and there are signs all around you of his presence, of his being laid in the manger of your life.

Take that image home with you of the young child placing the baby Jesus in the crib – and try to remember that that is the truth of your life. God is with you – not just at Christmas, but every day. If you have faith to see the signs of his presence in your life, then you too will join in the angel's song of praise: "Glory to God and peace to his people on earth."


CHRISTMAS WISHES

The generosity of our parishioners, neighbors and friends, abounds, which we witnessed, especially during this Holiday Season.

2016 by the numbers:

- 1500 individuals got Giving Tree Christmas presents
- Over 2,300 households were served through the food pantry (9,000 individuals)

- 654 handmade Mission Ladies items

A NOTE FROM ELIZABETH TOMASEK

 This past year has been a fruitful year for high school ministry. Our ministry has grown in many ways: increased participation, more adult volunteers, and additional ministry opportunities and offerings. I am so grateful to the adults who give of themselves and their time to make ministry happen to the teens themselves who constantly inspire me to recognize God's grace and mercy. In reflection on our year of ministry memories, it is clear that we have together strengthened our recognition of Christ in those we serve, and have come to a deeper appreciation for the connection God gives us to all humanity. Just as God gave us Christ himself, naming Him Emmanuel, meaning "God with us", so we are called to encounter Christ in the events and people in our own lives. In so many ways, I have witnessed this within youth ministry.

In the past year, St. Cletus teens have served their local communities and communities afar in numerous ways. They have taken active roles in parish life. And they have sought out ways to retreat from the demands of daily life to ponder God's role and presence. Some of our ministry's highlights through the year include the following:

- Preparing sack lunches for BEDS Plus in March and in September
- Spirit Social to welcome 8th graders from St. Cletus school and parish to youth ministry
- Cooking and serving dinner for Ronald McDonald House residents in April and November
- Collaborating with St. John of the Cross for Spiritual Giftedness workshops held in June and August for teen leaders
- Weeklong service trip to Detroit, MI with Young Neighbors in Action
- Liturgy participation as lectors, Extraordinary Ministers, singers, and musicians
- September bonfire to kick-off a new year of ministry
- Kairos 24 for high school juniors and seniors to reflect deeply on the role God has in their lives
- Church League basketball for girls in the spring and boys in the fall/winter
- Encounter small groups that meet monthly to discuss with peers life issues and current events through the lens of faith

- Wednesday Sundaes to gather monthly in prayer and fellowship (and ice cream) to examine God's workings in and through self and others
- Vicariate Awards Banquet to honor teens who commit themselves to parish vitality by sharing their gifts and talents

Thank you to all who support our ministry by your efforts and your prayers, and thank you to the teens who bring Christ's light to all you encounter! May peace and joy be yours this Christmas season!






