

Dear Parishioners,

Happy Fourth Sunday of Advent.

As we approach Christmas, I would like to thank you for allowing the Lord to prepare your heart for the birth of his Son through this season of Advent. I also would like to thank you for reading Matthew Kelly's book, "Holy Moments", and for sharing your own holy moments with us. It has been a spiritually enriching experience for me. I enjoyed reading the book and your holy moments. Both of them allowed me to have a unique Advent 2022 for which I am grateful. I am happy to let you know that on Wednesday, January 25, 2023, at 7:00 PM, we will gather together in our church to celebrate and share Our Holy Moments. Please mark your calendars.

It is with gratitude and joy that I share with you some holy moments that we have received. Read them contemplatively and allow the Lord to fill your heart with his kindness, peace, and joy.

"My holy moment was on Thanksgiving morning. Days prior, I was feeling paralyzed by grief and sadness over my dad's passing, thinking about having to spend my 9<sup>th</sup> holiday season without him. Flashbacks of the last time I saw him flooded my memory, and I started to struggle with unbearable regret and anxiety over the end of his life. I had a lump in my throat, felt nauseous, and wasn't interested in doing any daily activity. I was not sure if I would make it through the holiday, being that sad. On Thanksgiving, I forced myself to run the annual turkey trot, load up the car, and get on the road to my uncle's house. During the drive, my anxiety started to turn into deep feelings of self-compassion and love. I felt the Holy Spirit working within my heart by changing my mind about the past and fostering a new level of empathy. It was confirmation that the Holy Spirit had never left me, even when I thought I had lost my way."

"For me, holy moments are always when a song the choir was singing at Sunday mass comes to mind and resonates within me during the week. Once when I was getting my nails done, the nail technician was ever so softly humming a responsorial psalm. I never talked out loud with her about it, but it affirmed that she too had her Sunday mass experience resonating within her too!"

"Sometime in the late 1950's when I told my Mom I wanted to become a Nun. I wasn't a Catholic at the time and didn't really understand what I was saying, but in retrospect, I think I knew I was drawn to Jesus and service in the church and saw these women in habit as an example of devoted Christian women."

It is amazing how the Lord continues to find his ways to speak to us. When he does, he gladly shares his grace with us so that we can recognize him through the countless holy moments he gives us each day. # **Note From Father Mike**

# **Advent 4 Liturgical Year 2023**

As of December 17<sup>th</sup>, the Advent season begins its final approach toward our Christmas destination. I really love this time as we hear lots of Scripture that puts the faithful on notice one last time, hearing quite a bit of foreshadowing from the Old Testament to important connections in the Gospels. It's the Church's way to tell us that all of the prophecies of the coming Messiah are about to be fulfilled.

Again, the Octave (eight days) before Christmas (the official title to the "week of final approach") begins way back with Genesis letting us know where this special person would be from (the land of Judah) and pairs it with the genealogy of Jesus – His ancestry. The key figures through generations really are Abraham, King David, and Joseph "who was the husband of Mary. Of her was born Jesus, who is called the Christ." Yes, to many people, this gospel reading is a nightmare to read, including some clergy. There are lots of tongue-twisters of names. Many of the people we only hear about in this gospel and nowhere else in the Old Testament. Yet, consider if you've taken the time to research your own ancestry (even if it's with Ancestry.com). Many of the people you find in that research Fr. Mike you will never have met, yet without them, you wouldn't be reading this today. They played a role in who you are. Plus, we don't tend to be able to go back but maybe 4 or 5 generations. In just this first chapter of Matthew's gospel, we hear about a total of 42 generations of Jesus' heritage.

Also in subsequent days of the Octave before Christmas, we hear about the birth of Samson whose parents were barren, similar to the parents of John the Baptist. We hear of the Blessed Mother's visit to a very pregnant Elizabeth and how Zechariah is struck mute for his lack of belief in the message of the Archangel Gabriel regarding his child-tobe. There are similar stories about Joseph's belief from his dream and then of the Annunciation of Gabriel's message for Mary. The gospel for Christmas Eve morning is of John the Baptist's father Zechariah's tongue untied to proclaim the important role his son would play in salvation history. Of course, WE know that we will be waiting for about 30 years for John to come out of the desert and Jesus to be announced by him, but then by that time in our world today, it's only a few short hours until the shepherds will have announced to the world that the promised Messiah to be born into time.

Thoroughly confused? Enjoy it! It's the way God put it all together. There are a trillion pieces or more to the "puzzle." The big picture is about to be revealed. Be patient! Take the time to notice at least one holy moment this week. I hope it's full of them.

# **OUR FASCINATING FAITH**

### Las Posadas (December 16–24)

Of the many Latin American traditions for the celebration of Advent and Christmas, the tradition of Las Posadas seems to be the best known. It originated in the last half of the eighteenth century when the boisterous Misas de Aguinaldo were no longer celebrated in Mexico. To replace these Masses, the laity decided to celebrate in their own homes by taking what they had seen dramatized in the churches: the journey of the Galilean immigrants, Joseph and Mary of Nazareth, when they were looking for an inn (posada) in Bethlehem of Judea. Like the "O Antiphons" of the official liturgy, these *posadas* were celebrated on nine consecutive nights.

The journey of Joseph and Mary from inn to inn sadly continues every day in the fearful and tired steps taken by so many immigrants in this country. Like the Holy Family, Latin American families look for hospitality with the hope of finding a new life for their sons and daughters. Unfortunately, many citizens of the United States behave like the people of Bethlehem, preferring to close their door in the face of the immigrants rather than welcoming them. Perhaps that is the reason that the tradition of *Las Posadas* has taken on so much importance among the Latinos in the United States. We know firsthand what Joseph and Mary experienced two thousand years ago. We have to ask ourselves: When will the human heart change? When will we open the doors of our heart to our immigrant Lord?




