

Note From Father Mike

Hail, Full of Grace...

These words from the message of the Archangel Gabriel to a young virgin girl named Mary gave humanity a chance to live again in the life of God – as long as Mary would be receptive to the rest of Gabriel's message. Did Mary know she was "full of grace", or was she finding out from Gabriel in that moment? Did Mary have to say yes to becoming the Mother of God?

The answer to that is no. She didn't have to say yes. She, like you and I, had free will. However, in her innocence and purity even from original sin, she didn't hesitate to say yes and accept the honor. I also like to point out the difference in Mary's question to Gabriel as opposed to when Zechariah questioned. This is another way we might say that St. Luke is trying to tell us just how special this young girl is. When Zechariah questions Gabriel, he is punished to be mute. Mary, is without sin, and Gabriel knows it. Maybe even think of it this way – Gabriel knows that Mary "outranks" the great messenger. Maybe that is a crude image, but what if Mary would have said no? Then what?

The month of May is a great time to reflect on the magnitude of the role Mary plays in salvation history. We do so pretty regularly and most often when we are praying the rosary. Of course, that brings up another question which is often misunderstood -- whose life are we to be focusing on when we are praying the rosary? All of the mysteries certainly want to point out Mary's role, but the focus is still on how SHE relates to her Son, especially in the Joyful Mysteries and the last two Glorious Mysteries. Everything other mystery is focused on some event in Jesus' own life. Many people, even in our present day, think they are praying TO Mary, but remember, we are asking her TO HELP our prayers to reach the ears of God.

Something else that is important to point out for this weekend is the fact that May 4th, we celebrated with our 2nd graders who received their First Holy Communion – their first time saying "Amen" to believing Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist. It's always a special time for families. I've told the story many times over my priestly ministry that I didn't receive First Communion with my classmates because my parents had moved that year. It was also interesting because the priest who celebrated that day was a very good priest named Rev. Raymond Novak (no relation to us – not the same spelling, but pretty cool nonetheless). I love the story and the images ingrained in my heart of that day. I almost remember it as clearly as my ordination day. Great memories!

I would, finally, like to ask you to pray for all of our students from both our school and faith formation programs (including our children that are home-schooling for their religious formation). Tomorrow morning, May 6th at 9:30am, the children of our school will be celebrating Mass with a tradition included that should make full sense to us as believers – May Crowning. As we believe that the Blessed Virgin Mary is assumed into Heaven body and soul, for she is sinless from her conception, Mary is then crowned to be Queen of Heaven. There is actually a feast day for this great celebration in August just a week after we celebrate her glorious Assumption, but with May being a month dedicated to our Blessed Mother, it makes sense to have this special celebration with our children, planting seeds of faith even within the smallest of them.

Please continue to pray for the men who will be ordained to be permanent deacons and priests over the next few weekends. Keep praying for more young men to say yes to Jesus when He calls them to follow the footsteps of the Apostles. And for more young men and women to consider joining a religious order community too. The lacking number of vocations is effecting them too.

Staying Connected to Our Source

In the middle of a Zoom call, without warning, my computer screen went black and the subtle hum of my laptop was silenced. Dead battery. *How could this be*, I thought to myself. The power cord has been plugged in the entire morning, and surely my battery can maintain at least a bit of a charge! Turns out the plug had been pulled slightly from the wall for who knows how long.

It's an obvious truth when it comes to electronics, and one that we should also consider in our spiritual lives: if we don't stay plugged in, we eventually fail to operate as we're made to.

This has been a theme in John's Gospel for the last two Sundays. Last week, Jesus explained that he is the vine and we are the branches. When we live in communion with Jesus we bear fruit, whereas we whither without him. This week, Jesus continues: "Remain in my love," which we do by keeping his commandments, by laying down our lives for others.

The Eucharist is such a powerful sacrament of this spiritual reality. When we share in communion, we are physically and spiritually connected to Jesus, himself. We are also plugged in, so to speak, to the life of grace and the universal body of Christ. And it is by humbly partaking of Christ's body and blood that we are strengthened to lay down our lives for others.

When I find myself anxious about worldly things or falling into a pattern of sinfulness, I've almost certainly kicked my spiritual power cord. You wouldn't neglect to charge your phone battery before heading out the door. Jesus is reminding us not to make that mistake with our spiritual lives!

St. Antoninus relates that a pious gentleman had died, who was a great friend of the Dominican Convent in which the Saint resided. Many Masses and suffrages were offered for his soul. The Saint was very much afflicted when, after the lapse of a long time, the soul of the poor gentleman appeared to him, suffering excruciating pains. "Oh,

my Dear Friend," exclaimed St. Antoninus, "are you still in Purgatory, you who led such a pious and devout life?"
