Pastor's Note

"Fill us at daybreak with your kindness, that we may shout for joy and gladness all our days,"

Psalm 90:14

Dear Parishioners,

The readings for this weekend can help us to prayerfully reflect and become aware of our longings, desires and needs in life. Each texts invites us to make an honest assessment of the ways we engage life. In addition, the readings challenge us to seriously take a look at the way we conduct ourselves whether at home, at work, in our faith community or at any other place we might find ourselves.

Following the invitation of St. Paul (Col. 3:1-5, 9-11), we know that we are gently and firmly asked to "seek what is above and think of what is above." This is something that each of us certainly can process, pray about, and reflect upon daily. But this is also something we do as a community each time we gather as children of God to celebrate the holy Eucharist. From my experience of being and praying with you for one year, I am pleased to say that you St. Cletus parishioners are always seeking and thinking of what is above. Christ for you is all and in all. This, experienced daily, is something very special.

It is from this experience of the Lord as I continue to learn how to be His priest and your pastor that I joyfully share with you some important updates.

First, I am delighted to say that we are blessed to have Fr. Michael Novick as our Associate Pastor. He is a man of prayer. He longs to do the will of God. He is eager to serve and walk with us. He is genuinely interested in sharing his vocation and priesthood with all of us. On a personal level, I now feel like I have a brother priest with whom I can talk, laugh, pray, and discern the will of God for our parish. In addition, we are blessed to have Fr. John Lodge as our guest in the rectory when he is on for a weekend Mass. Thank you for your prayers and continued support.

Second, with gratitude and joy I would like to inform you that Fr. Novick has agreed to be our new shepherd and leader of Ministry of Care and Compassionate Care Ministry. Fr. Novick has been a priest for over 21 years. Before joining our parish, he served for 14 years as a pastor. He has the knowledge and experience, but most of all, a joyful willingness to journey with us. I am confident that with his pastoral zeal, both ministries and those involved in them will receive diligent accompaniment and guidance to serve and grow in their respective ministries. I kindly ask current ministers/volunteers of each ministry to keep Fr. Novick in your prayers and collaborate with him as we bring Jesus to all who call us. Third, with the help and guidance I have been receiving from each of our sacristans and other volunteers, I am grateful to let you know that we have been slowly but surely cleaning and reorganizing the sacristy. This effort led me to reach out and consult with Alfredo Chumpitaz, who is a fine carpenter, and whom I have known since 2000. He is a good Catholic who delights in sharing his carpentry skills. As I showed him our sacristy, he said to me, "Let me help you with this project. All you have to do is to pay for the materials." Encouraged by his willingness to help and generosity, I made the decision to build new shelves in the sacristy. The project (Phase I) was completed last Saturday, July 23rd, 2022. Photos of how it looked before and how it looks now are available in our parish website and the canticle. We were able to cover the cost of this project using funds that you donated through the orange maintenance repair envelops.

Fourth, we are a parish that is lucky to have many wonderful and dedicated sacristans. They do a phenomenal job and ministry. I take this opportunity to acknowledge and thank each and one of them for their dedication, service, and love for the Lord as they fulfill their ministry as sacristans.

Finally, with the help of God may our minds and hearts continue to be engaged with the things of God who gladly fill us with His kindness each day.

Note From Father Novick

Vanity

The first reading this weekend from the Book of Ecclesiastes is not as popular as the wonderful reading we would hear sometimes at funerals, i.e. "A time for..." However the author is very straight-forward with his teaching, in essence saying pay attention to the world around you, but remember it is not likely going to be you changing it on your own. Do your part and stop worrying about what others are doing. You might be tempted to try doing it by yourself. That is pride at work within you and it's not good.

When many of the priests are newly ordained, we came out of the seminary having what is known to many people as a "Superman complex." There is a feeling that you are going to make a huge impact, and you do, just not in the manner you think. That was actually the trap that the Apostles had been in, and only one of the 12 didn't cross over the line of understanding and faith. He simply thought that Jesus should have just wiped the Romans off the face of the earth like Sodom and Gomorrah were wiped out last week. But Jesus had a better way to follow – the way of humility and love.

Humility is the primary antidote to pride/vanity. We need to realize that the needs of everyone else are more important than our own. That is paraphrasing St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians when St. Paul states "Humbly regard others as more important than yourselves." (Phil. 2:4) Humility comes from the third of the primary virtues -- charity. Not only did Jesus' humility led Him to wash the feet of the Apostles, but His charity also led to perfect love through self-sacrifice. Our Savior simply did as His Father wanted Him to do – He obeyed. He did the exact opposite of what Adam and Eve once did in the Garden of Eden.


"What shall I do, for I do not have space to store my harvest?'
And he said, 'This is what I shall do:
I shall tear down my barns and build larger ones.
There I shall store all my grain and other goods and I shall say to myself, "Now as for you, you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink, be merry!" (Luke 12:17-19)

The man in the gospel is so full of himself. Jesus was pretty clever in how He taught about pride and vanity. He does it in this parable and in another when the primary subject makes himself to be God. "What shall I do?" He isn't concerned in the least for the grains he owns. He only goes off to build larger silos instead of thanking God for the gifts of the earth. He doesn't even make a motion to share all of the wealth he accumulated. It's all about HIM.

It's a very difficult line to walk on. You know as many priests as I do who are mostly focused on their needs. I am fully aware of many times I have fallen into that pit. There are many still who do not do so intentionally, and many others who have just done "about face" movements away from the people they promised to serve too. It happens to every one of us. It doesn't make it right, though. We change to become the person God created us to be when we drink in the attitude that it is only by His grace that we have been called to be His press agents, so we can tell others of the great things God continues to do for us.

The St. Cletus Religious Education Program has programs to fit the needs of each parish family. Our Early Childhood Program

provides beginning religious instruction to children ages 3 -5. Songs, crafts and stories are used to instill a sense of community and introduce these young members of our parish to Jesus' word. For families with children in public schools, we have **Traditional Religious Education**

Classes and sacramental preparation for children in 1st – 8th Grade, where the children have an encounter with Jesus through scripture, service experiences, interactive activities and games, and classroom experiences. These classes occur on Sunday mornings from 10:00-11:30 a.m. or on Monday evenings from 6-7:30 p.m. throughout the academic year.

Please take the time to complete the registration forms to register your children for RE classes for the 2022-2023 academic year! The registration deadline is fast approaching! Please be sure to register asap to get the class date/time that is best for your family. To get priority placement, please consider volunteering your time and talents in one of the following ways:

is a special place. Both the Parish and School received a nice donation for using our campus. Special thanks to Pastor Father Elmer and Business Manager / Engineer Jim Dion for their continued support of all of our special activities.

SAFETY AND SECURITY

We are in the process of implementing some additional safety features at St. Cletus School.

They include:

- -adding a second electronic security door near the main entrance of the school
- -replacing all of the locks on the doors leading to the courtyard that will automatically lock once a door is securely closed. There will be no need for a staff member to have to relock a courtyard door anymore once all of the students have entered or exited the school.
- -parents/visitors will still be required to sign in at the entrance prior to entering the school or picking up a child during the school day.

I am also happy to announce that we have a school parent that has already offered to offset a partial cost of the additional safety features by donating \$4,500 to this cause. If anyone would like to make an additional donation toward the upgrade in safety features at the school, it would be greatly appreciated. Any and all donations should be made out to St. Cletus School and add to the memo line "School Safety." Any donations received will be used specifically toward any safety feature upgrade determined by the school staff.

SCHOOL STAFF

We are happy to announce that as of this bulletin we have completed the hiring of our staff for the 2022-2023 school year. In addition to our current members, we have increased our staff size by adding a fourth Pre-School Class (all three full-time pre-school classes have reached full capacity), an additional second and fifth grade class, a new Music staff member, a Math Coach, a Marketing and Development Coordinator, and a Director of Faith Formation for Children.

Thanks for all of your continued support of our students and staff as they prepare for the start of the 2022-2023 school year.





Hymnal News

New Hymnals/Worship Aids coming soon!

Earlier this year we were notified by the publishers of our bi-lingual Music Issue missals/hymnal that our current missals are no longer going to be produced. We solicited samples of potential replacement books from both GIA Publishing (the publishers of our current Gather Book) and OCP/Oregon Catholic Press (the publishers of the Music Issue booklets currently contained in our blue vinyl binders). Fr. Elmer, Tina Norton, Juanita Avila, Luis Galvez, and Karen Ziemba subsequently met to discuss the alternatives. After prayerful discussion it was decided that the United in Christ/Unidos en Cristo soft cover books, as well as new vinyl covers, would be ordered. The format will be slightly different from our old missals; the music edition will feature English and Spanish songs that are currently not available in the Gather books. 400 copies will arrive and be placed in the pews in late November, to coincide with the 1st week of Advent.

It was during the discussion regarding the missals that I brought to the attention of this committee the fact that our red Gather Comprehensive II books, which we have had since 2004 (18 years! They've served us well!) and which do not contain the new order of Mass/wording instituted in 2010, are terribly out of date and it would be a great addition to our parish if those hymnals could be replaced. The new Gather Fourth Edition, first published in 2021, contains all the new responses, many new and more contemporary songs, several updated Mass settings as well as still featuring the songs and responsorial psalms that are currently part of our parish repertoire.

To help defray some of the cost for the new Gather IV (Gray) books and accompanying materials, we are requesting you support this effort in the following way.

Each hymnal is valued at \$25. We are asking you to donate one or as many hymnals as you like. You can dedicate each hymnal you donate to the memory of a loved one or in honor of your family or friend(s). A bookplate will be placed on the inside front cover of the hymnal with this information. Each hymnal that you donate will be a lasting tribute to that special person(s) you name. We ask that you please complete the form below and return it with your donation prior to September 20th.




