
kindness, goodness, and love. With the help of God, could you consider becoming a sower of kindness, goodness, and love?

The total cost paid for this project was \$227,535.00. I will sleep better if we can complete phase 2 (northern part of the west



wing) next summer. As of today, the cost will be \$160,950.00. From reports gathered, we are replacing roofs (phase 1 and 2) that were never replaced since they were built in 1953.

I am sensing something deep in my heart that tells me that you want to help with the school roof

A Note from the Associate Pastor's Desk

A reflection on "People on the Move"

Back in the year 2000, after I had been ordained a transitional deacon for the Archdiocese, my best friend and a former associate pastor of St. Cletus, Fr. Charles Watkins (God rest his soul) introduced me to a ministry based with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops that focused on ministry to people who make their living in entertainment, traveling from town to town. The Office of Pastoral Care of Migrants, Refugees, and Travelers would eventually be come to

be known as the Circus and Carnival Apostolate. It also ministered to Indy, Cart, and NASCAR.

Fr. Charles, for those who did not know him, had experience from the time he was a child working with his grandfather who had an act with chimpanzees. Fr. Charles would learn along the way the arts of walking on the high wire and acrobatic feats on a single trapeze. He learned the art of clowning over time as well, and, while in the time of finishing his graduate degree, became a circus promoter in his spare time. It really was a passion of his for many years, and I was being introduced to it as well concentrating on smaller circuses when they

Fr. John Vukulskas

One of those men was a priest from lowa, Fr. John Vukulskas, who was the head chaplain for the carnival industry. Fr. John was larger than life in my eyes, physically and spiritually. He towered over people in size and had a bellylaugh that was infectious for anyone once he started. He was beloved by the carnival workers from all various companies that provide the rides and games that go from town to town,

driving rigs, setting up the best layout on the grounds they are allotted, and more. What Fr. John brought with him everywhere he went and

with on the side (not for pay).

to every city he traveled to was to feed the need of every person in the companies the love of Jesus in the Eucharist.

So many of the workers live every day in RVs of all sizes, setting up, taking down, and off to the next city. It's a hard life. It's a costly life too. RVs are not cheap and many of the workers are paid minimum wage or just above. Thank the workers of the Fall Fest. They have rules they need to adhere to, and sometimes that leads to disagreements with customers. Let's be a part of the solution to being sure all

came to the tri-state area. Fr. Charles, when I began, was still in the seminary as he was ordained two years after me.

For nearly 10 years, we attended the annual meeting of the chaplains for each industry (circus, carnival, and racing). There were probably 15 of us in regular attendance each year. I met great men and women dedicated to being full-time ministers who traveled WITH the shows. In these days around Fall Fest, I am taken back in time to those





people are treated with respect and dignity. Maybe carnival workers don't fly through the air, but they do a lot of heavy work.

Fr. John passed away in 2020. I don't know who carries on his legacy anymore. So please pray for and support and thank the workers at Fall Fest, as well as the many volunteers from St. Cletus who helped make it a wonderful event.

XXIII Sunday in Ordinary Time, Cycle B – Reflection

Society's attitudes regarding its physically and/or mentally impaired members have evolved considerably through the centuries. Each generation, motivated by an ever-growing sensitivity and respect for another's differences, has coined new words to refer to these special people among us. Now, we have terms such as mentally challenged, hearing or visually impaired, or simply special needs.

Although discrimination still exists and must be dealt with whenever it arises, contemporary society is learning to value people for who they are and what they can do. A mother of a brain-injured child offers a lesson: "We would have called our daughter's handicap the greatest tragedy of our lives if it were not for the fact that through it, we came to know God much better." Physical and/or mental maladies were generally misunderstood in the ancient world. Some attributed certain conditions to demons; others believed that sin was responsible and, therefore, the illness was God's punishment. In either case, those so stricken were doubly burdened. Those who could have been helpful and supportive to the needy disassociated themselves so as not to be rendered similarly unclean.

Jesus has set the example. As one who sought out the poor and disenfranchised, Jesus incarnated the divine predilection for the needy (Luke 6:20,7:22). He gave sight to the blind, made the lame walk, healed the deaf, and gave voice to the mute. Today's Gospel invites us to continue Jesus' ministry. May we all keep the human community in touch with the reality of God's saving power.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults






