

# Notes from Fr. Bob...


#### **1ST SUNDAY OF LENT**

The native tribes of South America make a point of marking different events in a person's life in dramatic fashion. In a time honored tradition their young men are initiated into the tribe in a private ceremony. They will eventually receive honorable status in their society but not before they have endured differing rituals designed to test their strength, and, perhaps humble them a little. There are many rites of passage for different occasions. Somehow these help them become loving and caring husbands and tribesmen. These societies have no doubt learned that the only way humanity moves forward is when we have the courage to face our weakness and our fears.

Like Matthew and Luke, Mark shows Jesus going through a time of testing. Each account, in a different way, tells us that he has to endure his strengthening, his initiation, before he could preach his message of salvation. The spirit that leads him to the wilderness is the same spirit that will tell him he is a beloved son. His preparation to do the will of the Father will not be complete until he spends those hungry days alone with his thoughts, finding out who he is.

To the people of the day, the wilderness of the desert was a lonely place, cut off from the support of one's family. How could one survive this experience, vulnerable and exposed to danger? In fact, Jesus is facing those demons that we all must face at some time in our lives, the terrible vulnerability of aloneness, and the inevitability of death. His days alone were a foretaste of the cross to come. Of course we know that this testing leads to freedom and through the cross, to redemption. Since we are baptized into Christ, we too can overcome the obstacles that may confront us. We can rest safe in the knowledge that Christ has overcome even death itself.

Perhaps like Noah, we cannot fully understand what real freedom looks like until we experience vulnerability. As the early Christian mystics say, we cannot understand the language of the cross, until we have faced darkness in our own lives. To be a builder of the kingdom means being a person of compassion and that is not learned without suffering. Life brings with it many forms of testing, for some it may be an embittering experience, leaving them cold and closed. For us as people of the promise, it can be a turning point, a cleansing experience that leads us to growth and openness. This freedom can only come about if we, like Jesus, remember that we are beloved by the Father who is with us at every stage of our journey. Like



In this time of Lent, the Church asks us to spend time looking within ourselves. During the coming weeks we are to confront our fears and temptations, so that we might be brought into a fuller relationship with Christ. The Gospel reminds us that the Father who strengthens his son in the desert is the same God who renews the promises to an unfaithful people and is bound with them forever. This is the good news that we all need to hear, and are all called to share

What does this good news look like? Well we know it transforms people, it makes them turn around, repent, and start again. It gives hope; it drives away fear; it promotes true peace; it is concerned for others; it is concerned with building up what is good, and destroying what is evil. When we begin to see this work of God in our lives, when we respond anew, we will find life: life in all its fullness.



# The First Sunday of Lent

### PEOPLE OF THE COVENANT

If there is one word that stands out in today's readings, it is "covenant." God's faithfulness and goodness serve as examples to us of how to live. Genesis tells the story of Noah and of God's covenant not only with all people, but with all of nature. Never will the cleansing waters of the flood bring their destructive power to all the earth again. The sign, the reminder to both God and nature, is the rainbow in the heavens.

The psalm reminds us of this compassion of God, and begs God to remember us, not because of our goodness, but because of God's goodness and fidelity to the promise. God shows us how to be good, not by decree, but by example.

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The Holy Father usually marks the solemn opening of the Lenten fast with a procession and Mass on Ash Wednesday evening. He walks from the Benedictine monastery, San Anselmo, down the Aventine hill to the Dominican monastery of Santa Sabina. This very old tradition was revived by Pope John XXIII in the late 1950s. Have you ever wondered who gives the pope his ashes? It's the cardinal who has been given the "title" of the church of Santa Sabina. The pope's homily at this Mass states his theme for Lent.

Santa Sabina dates from the fifth century, and is one of the most beautiful churches in Rome. One of the panels on its main doors features the Crucifixion, a scene not normally depicted in art until much later. In the year 1219 the pope gave the church to Saint Dominic for his new religious order, the "Order of Preachers," commonly called the Dominicans, and it remains their world headquarters to this day. That pope, Honorius III, was a member of the Savelli family, and this church was their personal family chapel. Sabina was a wealthy Roman lady who became a Christian and was martyred, and whose home became a place of prayer. Later, the church built on that spot was dedicated to her memory.




