Pastor's Note

Dear Parishioners,

My heart is filled with gratitude, love, and joy.



On Saturday morning, April 29, 2023, I traveled to London, UK to attend the Alpha Leadership Conference 2023 which was held at the Royal Albert Hall. Five thousand people from all over the world felt inspired to attend such a conference which was filled with the love of God.

The organizers did an outstanding job in hosting such a joy-filled conference. With their kindness, humility, and graciousness they successfully made us all feel welcomed and at home. I was touched by the genuineness of their servant-leadership style. I also noticed and experienced the immense love that each of them has for the Lord. I was encouraged by their witness (leaders, speakers, volunteers) to let the Lord pour upon my heart his love and Spirit.

Prayer was the backbone of the Leadership Conference 2023. This is something that I not only heard from the leaders and speakers: but that the entire conference was a prayer. I noticed that the leaders and speakers were truly women and men of prayer. Each session, seminar or talk started and ended with a prayer. I am already asking the Lord to teach me how to lead with love. I ask you to do the same. Then, the speaker added, "this is how Jesus leads."

Another speaker shared with us the following, "I love you so much. Come back to me. Let me lead you." This is something she heard Jesus saying to her at prayer. She said that after this experience, her life was changed completely. She became a new person. Now she lives and serves knowing that she is love by Jesus.

I was blessed to travel and attend the Leadership Conference 2023 with my close friend, whom you know Fr. John Lodge. He teaches at Mundelein Seminary and on weekends he comes to our parish to celebrate Mass for us. Traveling with him is a joy. His brain is always pondering about things and life. Sharing meals with him is a delight. I was able to learn more about the conference and London from him at our daily conversations.

St. Cletus Fiacre Society

ST. CLETUS FIACRE SOCIETY SPRING 2023 UPDATE

Perhaps you recognize the above picture and are reminded that Spring is here with an update from the St. Cletus Fiacre Society. Maybe you don't recognize the picture and are wondering, what is this ministry?

St. Fiacre, a 7th Century Irish Monk, the patron Saint of Gardeners (also the patron Saint of taxi drivers!)? This ministry likes to get involved with beautifying our St. Cletus campus through gardening, flowers and building community.

The St. Fiacre legend is this: Fiacre asked the local bishop for more ground on which to plant food and herbs. The bishop told him he could have as much land as he could entrench in one day. After prayer, Fiacre used the point of his staff to turn the earth, topple trees and dig up briers and weeds to prepare the land for a garden. A suspicious local woman was convinced that such a feat could only be performed by sorcery but the bishop viewed Fiacre's act as a gift from God and proclaimed it a miracle. As word of Fiacre's miracle spread, visitors to Fiacre's Garden brought seeds and plants from afar, and his gardens became famous throughout Europe. The Catholic Church considers Fiacre the saint of growing food and plants used in medicine. After his death in 670 A.D., people who visited his monastery claimed that it had healing power. Fiacre is depicted in art and statuary as an elderly man carrying a spade (see above). While we as yet do not promote our campus grounds and flowers as providing any healing power, we do believe that our efforts to beautify our campus with flowers can invoke hospitality, welcoming all to our beautiful church and grounds.

As the Fiacre Society continues to add to our perennial landscape plan professionally designed two years ago, we also gather to plant annuals. We will be planting sometime after Mother's Day to avoid any damaging late season frost. In future Canticle articles, look for the above picture of St. Fiacre for announcements. We would love to have you join us! Duties of this ministry include weeding, planting annuals, cleaning up flower beds, and to a greater degree, building community. 
