Note from Father Mike

Compassionate Care Ministry

At some times in our lives, we all experience death. It's certainly not a subject anyone WANTS to deal with. It doesn't matter if it is a parent who dies, or a child, a brother, sister, good friend, old or young, the Queen of England or the average homeless person – death happens. But it's important for the families and loved ones to know that they do not have to deal with death on their own. Christ calls every one of us to learn the value of mercy and showing compassion to our fellow human beings at some of the most critical junctures of their lives.

St. Cletus once had a very vibrant and viable ministry known as Compassionate Care. Those involved were men and women who would help the priests in being Christ's light to those who grieve. When COVID came about, people were not being allowed to have many people at the funeral home or at the church. I remember the picture of Queen Elizabeth II at Prince Philip's funeral sitting by herself. We don't like to believe it should be that way, but those who were helping in that ministry here at St. Cletus began to fall away from it just like many other ministries did during the pandemic. Some of the ministries that were on hiatus have been getting back into full swing in the past few months. We would like to see Compassionate Care be one of those ministries.

If you had been previously involved in the Compassionate Care Ministry, please pray about possibly returning. If you had not been involved, please consider this invitation to come aboard. As I stated earlier, not many people deal with death very well. When I was a boy, I was so terrible with death. I actually got sick at my grandfather's wake. Even today, I don't "enjoy" death; however, my heart breaks for the families and loved ones so much that I frequently cry at wakes, even though my heart and my head understand and believe in Christ's Resurrection. And that is what sustains me.

Compassionate Care is all about being able to offer and to be a sign of hope for those who grieve. There will be training. We would never ask you to get involved in something so important without giving you the tools to do it.


