

Pastor's Note

Dear Parishioners,

Jesus in today's Gospel invites us to prayerfully reflect about our experience of faithfulness and stewardship.

As we reflect on faithfulness and stewardship, we come to the realization that we have been entrusted with the gifts of life, faith, family, friends, faith community, and work. Hopefully, this gives us inspiration and the desire to respond with generosity and kindness.

Reflecting on faithfulness and stewardship, I am pleased to share with you some news where I have noticed the Lord affirming and blessing those who are faithful and exercise good stewardship.

First, thanks to your prayers and support, our efforts to strengthen the office of Faith Formation for Children is going well under the leadership and guidance of Lawrence Manetti, Director of Faith Formation for Children. I am also thrilled to let you know that we have hired Hector Obregon (Part-time) as the new Associate Director of Faith Formation for Children, effective September 7, 2022. He comes to us after serving for 14 years as the Director of Religious Education and Youth Ministry at St. Viator Parish in Chicago. He has an excellent education background and experience in ministry and he is eager to share them with our children, catechists, and all of us. Please assist me in giving him a warm welcome to our parish community.

Second, on Tuesday, September 6, 2022, Fr. Michael Novick and I attended the monthly Vicariate Meeting that took place at St. Pius X Parish in Stickney, IL. All priests that serve in Vicariate IV are expected to attend. The meeting was led by Bishop Kevin Birmingham, who is the Episcopal Vicar of Vicariate IV, and his team. Personally, I find the meetings to be helpful, encouraging, and informative. In addition, the monthly meeting also gives us an opportunity to exchange ideas and information with one another about what is going on in each of our parishes and the Archdiocese. Further, thanks to these meetings, I am able to see, connect, and talk with other priests who continue to serve the Lord and his people with dedication and joy. It is always good to be with them.

Third, on Wednesday, September 7, 2022, I had a lunch meeting with Fr. Edgar Rodriguez. He served at our parish as an Associate Pastor from 2008 to 2015. He told me that he enjoyed and loved being at our parish those years. He also told me about how kind you were to him. I really enjoyed my lunch conversation with him. I am encouraged by his faithfulness to the Lord and the people that he serves. He is currently serving at St. Genevieve Parish in Chicago, as an Associate Pastor.

Note From Father Mike

The Seminary

Most people are coming to the realization that the Archdiocese is in the middle of the Renew My Church initiative for a couple of big reasons – lower Mass attendance leading to a need for less churches, and, there are fewer and fewer men being ordained priests. With the waning number of priests, we cannot staff the number of parishes with one pastor per parish. There have been several communities that have had one pastor to tend to the needs of sometimes two or three parishes. In years past, the Archdiocese would have never thought that our archdiocese would end up staffing parishes like many "rural" dioceses.

I remember being in the seminary and listening to another seminarian from Montana. That huge state has only TWO dioceses, what could simply be known as a West/East set-up. That is a lot of space to cover. Yet for all of that space, there might be 100 priests. He was saying that either the priest had to have a helicopter license, or to know someone who does because the parishes they would be responsible for are 70 or 80 miles apart. While Chicago might not be quite widespread, if the trends for diminishing ordinations in the Archdiocese continue, we may end up becoming a more "rural" diocese rather than the urban center we have been known to be for over 100 years.

But what sort of person should consider the priesthood? What qualifies someone for becoming a priest?

First and foremost, the fact of being a male ought to be a given, but even that has come into question over time. Or, so as not to offend anyone, a person who is assigned to be male at birth. The question of whether women could be ordained priests has come up many times over the course of my life. There have been plenty of arguments that have occurred over the centuries, and the argument used most often surrounds Mary Magdelene. She has the title of "Apostle to the Apostles" according to the Church. And if the priesthood is rooted in apostolic succession, then why doesn't Mary Magdelene's role allow for women's ordination? The key to the argument is the Last Supper. While there are many conspiracy theories about the person leaning on Jesus to His right is actually Mary while people have been told it is John (the younger son of Zebedee) because there were no women in attendance at the Last Supper, go back even a little further in the gospels where Jesus called the first twelve. Those are the people pre- Fr. Mike

sumed to be in the Last Supper depictions with Jesus. What about all of those other things we hear about in movies and other theories like Jesus was married to Mary Magdelene and the Church just covered it up. We can't be swayed by fiction, but we must keep faith.

The male must have received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) and have an undergraduate college degree. It used to be that their major in college had to be in Religious Studies and/or Philosophy; however, the seminary system has programs for students to get the philosophy education they need to have for their graduate studies in Theology. Most of the Theology we have been taught comes from some of the most brilliant men who were philosophers before they moved on to study God and His Church. There are also many women who have taught the faith over time too, but even they didn't believe they should have been priests.

One of the other rules of ordination is that the man must be of 25 years of age. Being that most undergraduate degrees would be finished at the age of 21, that makes some easier sense because the theology classes and formation are typically four-year programs. Yet, this rule is almost outdated due to the lack of students going thru the system being at an undergraduate level seminary, then going on to the graduate level. The bulk of any of the seminarians are men with college degrees in other majors and then a few years in the "work world." Still, by the time ordination would come around, the person would be 25 years old without a doubt.

Oh, and of course, a priest needs to be able to love people. A seminarian probably SHOULD be able to do the same before becoming a student. But most of all, you probably would recognize certain qualities in young men like their attendance and devotion to Jesus. It's not a foolproof formula for every young man, but we are all responsible for the lack of priests in our world. We can't keep hoping the Vatican changes its teaching to include women or married men to be allowed ordination. For now, remember this – vocations to the priesthood (as well as religious life) ARE out in the world. Most just need a little encouragement to see the priestly life as viable. It's not going to make anyone rich in wealth, but rich in what matters most – faith.




