

to judge your people
and to distinguish right from wrong."
1King 3:9a*

Dear Friends,

We believe in a God who delights being part of our lives. He rejoices in our joys. He affirms our good deeds. He appreciates our friendship. When in difficult and challenging times, he offers us his grace, blessing, and love. Sometimes all we need to do is to pause, open our hearts, and let God do the rest.

Today's first reading shows us the interaction of God has with Solomon. It is fascinating. Notice, it is God that takes the initiative. He wants to assure Solomon of his closeness and friendship. He offers Solomon his unlimited assistance as he assumes his responsibility as the new leader of his people. He wants Solomon to succeed in his new reality and endeavor. Also notice the response of Solomon to God. He wants God to be part of his life. He is eager to let God assist him in his new role. He wants God to give him "an understanding heart." My heart yearns to engage God the way Solomon did. How about yours?

As we journey together and grow in friendship with the Lord and each other, I am happy to share some important updates with you.

Note From Father Mike

17th

I have been a big fan of the musical *Godspell*, especially the film adaptation in 1973 starring Victor Garber. Many people I know have debated with me saying that Jesus Christ Superstar is better than *Godspell*, but no one is going to change my mind. “But Father, isn’t that the one with the clowns?” Yes, and what else would you have expected from a 1970s film AND musical? If I can sing all of the songs from the soundtrack in karaoke without the lyrics in front of me, it has to have my vote. Can’t do that with *Jesus Christ Superstar*. “But Father the energy of JCS is so much higher than that of *Godspell*.” I’m sure I’d enjoy it, but *Godspell* is best.

Others have debated with me over which film or series about Jesus is best – “*The Greatest Story Ever Told*,” “*Jesus of Nazareth*,” “*The Robe*,” “*The Passion of the Christ*,” “*Son of God*,” or maybe “*The Chosen*.” They’re all very good in their own right. I am very partial to Mel Gibson’s film. There are many who say it’s just too bloody and graphic for their taste. It is VERY much so. However, as much as I didn’t think I was going to be able to handle all of that violence, I faced it along with many other churches along the way when parish groups would buy up all of the seats for a whole movie theater screening of the movie. I know there are many church groups who have watched or are watching *The Chosen* right now and have discussion groups too. Yet, when Gibson’s film hit the theaters, it was very difficult to get tickets unless your parish bought out a theater.

Still, there are so many people who are unfazed in their souls by either the musicals or films about Jesus. They say that it’s MERELY a story.

For others like myself, I find the various productions and films to be enhancing for my vision and images found in Scripture. The same can be said for having been blessed to go to the Holy Land years ago. The point was not about being on vacation but on a pilgrimage (a time to allow God to work thru His Creation in order to enhance our faith). Walking thru the streets of Jerusalem, Bethlehem, Galilee, and other traditional sacred sites really blew my mind to believe that the Son of God walked the very same streets 2000 years before us. But for many who do not have faith, the Holy Land is simply a war-zone.

How else do you feel the Church might be able to enhance the faith that is right in front of us every day? I truly welcome responses to my question. I would ask that you try not to respond in confrontation, but if you feel strongly about something, I hope to be open. Maybe we can meet in person to discuss civilly a subject.

WE WOULD LOVE TO HAVE YOU IN OUR CATHOLIC FAMILY.

The RCIA process is how adults who were not initiated into the Catholic faith early in life become Catholic. RCIA candidates are from a wide variety of backgrounds—some were baptized as Catholics but never completed any more sacraments, some were baptized in other Christian traditions and now want to be Catholic for a variety of reasons, and some have been brought up in non-Christian traditions and now want to be Catholic. Some candidates have never participated in any faith tradition and now are attracted to the Catholic Church. All are welcome!

We will be starting our RCIA process again this year in the next couple of weeks, and we would love to have you join us. Our process is done together with candidates at St. Francis Xavier and St. John of the Cross parishes. We start with a Period of Inquiry, where participants meet in weekly sessions and reflect and discern what it means to know Jesus, and get to know each other and the RCIA team. At the start of Advent, we enter what is called the Period of Purification and Enlightenment, where the inquirers start to learn about the teachings of the church, church history, sacraments, etc. Then, candidates are received into the church at the Easter Vigil, which this year is March 30, 2024. This is an evening of joy and celebration for all of us.

We have separate programs which are designed for children and teens who for some reason have missed sacraments. They, too, can be received into the church at the Easter Vigil.

Note: if you or an adult you know receives communion but only needs to be confirmed, there is a separate Archdiocesan program leading to Confirmation for adults. Please contact us if this is what you need.



Stewardship Report



GIVING YOUR FIRST HOUR TO GOD

Thank you for your continued stewardship of St. Cletus Parish. Parishioners sometimes ask for suggestions about appropriate weekly contributions. When in doubt, consider giving your hourly pay rate at work (“giving your first hour to God”). Whatever you can give will go toward keeping the lights on and supporting the good work of the Parish.
