Dear Parishioners,

As we celebrate the Second Sunday of Advent, I am thrilled to share with you a few holy moments that I have received. Please ask the Lord to join you as you read them.

- "I've had 10 major surgeries in my lifetime, making me aware of how fragile life is, so my daily Holy Moment happens every morning as my feet don't touch the ground to get out of bed until I thank God for waking me up."
- "I have witnessed and experienced so many great losses in my life. The greatest loss was the absence of God in my life. My pivotal holy moment was my realization of that fact leading to my surrender to God and gratitude for His love and forgiveness. "Lord here am I. Use me!"
- "Every day that I wake up is a blessing, but one special Holy Moment that I truly enjoy, is looking forward to put up our Christmas tree and nativity scene each year. We have been doing this for so many years, but each year is so special and unique. It is beautiful to see my daughters so excited and happy to do this together as a family. I can really feel the presence of God in these beautiful moments".
- "When St. Cletus put the call out for volunteers in June 2020 to reopen after being shut down for COVID, I felt the immediate need and desire to do anything I could to help make that happen. I didn't care what they needed me to do-I just knew I needed to be there. I knew that God was calling me there, so I went. Almost three years later, that decision has led me to many new experiences and the joy of meeting and working with some of the most wonderful people."
- "My holy moments occur every day whenever I see and feel God's loving arms wrapped around me leading and guiding me. I talk to God throughout the day thanking Him for His presence in my life and for His abundant blessings."
- "Our holy moment is every morning when we walk out the door, get in the car and sit there for a few seconds to look back at our home and all that we have and continue to accomplish. We realize that all that we have is because of God. We say, "thank you Jesus for all your blessings," make the sign of the cross and head out. Always aware of His presence and never forgetting to give thanks."
- "After many years of searching and stumbling in the dark, to come back to the joy and the Light of the Catholic Church."
- "Several years ago, I had finished Mass one Sunday morning. Everyone had left the church except one man. He seemed spiritually down. Drawn by the Holy Spirit, I went to him to find out if he was okay. He tersely responded "Fine" and I was on my way. The following week, he sought me out to apologize for his attitude the week before. It turned out to be the beginning of a marvelous friendship, and it really took a simple moment a holy moment."
