Pastor's Note

Dear Friends,

On Wednesday, June 21st, 2023, I made a trip to Peru to spend some time with my family. From the moment I arrived home my parents offered me their radical hospitality. They wanted to spend time with me. They were prepared to share their time and heart with me. Pretty much every day (7 days) we had breakfast, lunch, and dinner together. With the direction of my mother, I made breakfast (oatmeal and poached eggs) and dinner four times at home. I managed to bake some chicken and pork. I also grilled twice. The remaining three days, we were invited by my siblings either for breakfast or dinner. A few times, we went out for lunch. I felt accompanied and loved. I enjoyed very much the hospitality and presence I received from my parents and siblings. I consider all of this as a blessing for which I give thanks to the Lord.

Both of my parents continue to show me the beauty of the ministry of hospitality and presence. I remember when I was growing up, how my parents welcomed and offered hospitality to strangers at our house. We had a small house with 12 kids living in it, but my parents always found a way to share their hearts with those who chose to spend an evening and night with us. As I look back to those moments and the actions of my parents, I am able to acknowledge how the Lord was shaping my heart. He was forming me to be his priest first through my parents. I never realized this until now.

As I look back to on my short time at St. Cletus Parish, I am happy to acknowledge your warm, gentle, and kind hospitality towards me. This is something I have continued to receive since I joined you back on July 1st, 2021. Only God knows why he brought me to you as your parish priest. He keeps nourishing, shaping, and filling my heart with his kindness through your hospitality, presence, and friendship. He keeps forming my heart and my priesthood according to his holy will as I grow in friendship with you. Formation never ends. The opportunity to notice the action and closeness of the Lord in our lives is always there. My parents through their hospitality, presence, and love allowed me to discover this truth about God.

It is my prayer and hope that we continue to grow in the ministry of hospitality, presence, and friendship as a parish. I am happy to affirm that we are already good at this. But we also know that deep in our hearts the Lord is inviting us to be more intentional, especially towards those who are new to our parish. I feel like the Lord is trusting and encouraging us to share our kindness, joy, and love with all those who have joined us since or after Covid. Each Sunday, we have the opportunity to take a moment and introduce ourselves, acknowledge, and offer a warm welcome to those who came to pray and celebrate Mass with us. Gestures of love, kindness, and friendship are always appreciated and welcomed. In advance, I would like to thank you for joining me in this effort.

I am happy to share with you that through the leadership of the Parish Pastoral Council, we will be offering a focused, radical hospitality in the Parish Center quarterly. After a particular weekend Mass, we will have hospitality in the Parish Center with a more substantial refreshment. The goal will be to engage and grow in friendship with the new members of our parish community. We thought that we should try this because we are a community that loves being together to grow in friendship with each other. We are also aware that we have a beautiful parish that allows us to be creative and use our imagination in our efforts to build community. Plus, our parish is blessed with generous and caring men and women who are always ready to support initiatives that come from prayer, good discernment, and the heart. Shortly we will offer you more details. Please join me with your prayers.

I am happy to let you know that the Leadership Team will be meeting on July 14th, 2023, in the Parish Center to plan for the Fall Festival. The Fall Festival will be an opportunity to be good hosts and to offer our hearts to those who live in our neighborhood. We know that many in our neighborhood have stopped going to church. They no longer practice the faith. Perhaps if we engage them with gentleness and love they might feel encouraged to come back. I feel like the Lord is giving us such a great opportunity right now in our parish to be missionary disciples. Starting today, let us pray for such grace.

As I was writing this letter, I enjoyed the accompaniment of my mother. We both were sitting in the dining room. She sat quietly right next to me. I know that she was praying for me and for you. I felt the closeness and love of the Lord through her presence and accompaniment. It is amazing how the Lord speaks to us through the people that love us.

Note From Father Mike

My country 'tis of thee


It's hard to believe sometimes. It's hard to believe that there is still lots and lots of oppression in the world. Persecution happens daily, not only of Catholics, but human beings in general. It's a sick thought to believe any government should be so hard on the people they ought to serve. It's just as sick to think that any grouping of people is less important to humanity and that any grouping of people might be "better" than another. The times and reign of Adolf Hitler are the perfect secular example for a "modern" time, as he and his government/military did everything they could to exterminate those of Jewish descent. In a more biblical sense, we can almost say the same thing about the Egyptians as they enslaved the Israelites, too.

The United States has that great document "The Declaration of Independence." "We hold these truths to be self-evident that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain inalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness..." (Declaration, #2) This quote is one that most people my age once sang on some Saturday mornings in the Schoolhouse Rock segments between the cartoons shown on Channel 7. Yes, we learned some of our history from Saturday cartoons. And a lesson we learned was that the many people who had come to the United States mostly from Europe continued to be oppressed by other nations. It took great vision for our forefathers to see their people as free, made in the image of God.

The fireworks we see every year for the 4th of July may be absolutely beautiful, but their beauty is their secondary function. Primarily, we should be reminded of the battles our military men of the day fought to be sure that we could be a nation free from tyranny – ALL PEOPLE! And with those battles, many lost their lives – sacrificing themselves for the cause. It's not that the Church will recognize those men to be saints, but they learned that that there is something in this life greater than themselves. WE need to get on board, my friends.

If anyone needs another instance of oppression, look no further than amongst many members of the Catholic Church. Conservatism and Liberalism are not simply terms that have political implications, but they happen right before our eyes each and every day. I've written about this subject in the past, particularly about the dangers of the extremism of many on each "side." Each "side" looks at the other with disdain, practically saying that the other is demonic for how they express their faith and what they believe, e.g., how Jesus would handle certain situations. The last time I checked the Scriptures, Jesus, Himself, told us we are not to judge others lest WE be judged. Yes, if we see someone doing that could be considered sinful, it would be right to privately reprimand them and TEACH them why they might reconsider their actions. However, **no one** but Jesus has that final say in terms of somebody's salvation.

Try to remember my graphic I made years ago:



Here is the way I see things. I see Jesus as THE ideal, so He is the center line. I consider myself as traditional in my thought; trying to think like Jesus at all times. However, while that is where I fall on the scale, it means that I can dialogue with someone who may deems themselves to be "progressive" in how they interpret Jesus' actions. Still, I also pity the people who are extremists on the graph, right and left. I have witnessed all too often that those extremists will not even consider dialoguing – whatever they believe is absolute and there is no "gray" area for searching for truth. Truth is freedom to be like Jesus. He is the only absolute in the Catholic faith!




