



Pastor's Note

"Your ways, O Lord, make known to me; teach me your paths, guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my savior. Psalm 25: 4-5

Dear Friends,

As we celebrate the First Sunday of Lent, we are invited to join Jesus in the desert. Mark tells us that Jesus was driven by the Spirit into the desert where he remained for forty days. My heart tells me that Jesus will appreciate your accompaniment during this time of preparation for Holy Week and Easter.

A simple way of being with Jesus in the desert during the season of Lent is by intentionally making time for silence, prayer, and reflection each day. We know that our soul is yearning for silence. We know that our prayer life needs some refreshing. We also know that our mind and heart is longing for a good and healthy daily reflection. I confirmed my decision to join Jesus in the desert daily by adding it to my calendar. Perhaps you might consider doing the same.

As I join Jesus in the desert, I will ask him to make known to me his ways, to teach me his paths, and guide me in his truth. My heart and soul are seriously looking forward to being shaped, renewed, and inspired by Jesus. As you encounter Jesus in silence, prayer, and reflection, I encourage you to allow him to share his life and love with you. Sometimes that is all it takes.



esis - God's conversation with Noah regarding the covenant between God and human beings. The gospel is St. Mark's version of Satan tempting Jesus in the desert. Mark's style is simple narration. There are no details about the conversation we hear in other accounts between Satan and Jesus. St. Mark's point is to say that it happened and Jesus (in essence) was taken care of and ministered to by the great throng of messengers from heaven. It does not say anything about HOW Jesus overcame the temptations, but that He did it. And the result was His getting the mission underway "This is the time of fulfillment...REPENT, and believe in the gospel."

How has Lent begun for you? I pray it's your best ever!



Welcome To Lent!

I can't decide whether I actually like Lent, or whether that matters. Some years, it is my favorite time of the year, but when I was younger, it was terrible. We had to "give up" something (which never worked out for the entire season), had to eat the terrible school lunch macaroni and cheese (which, actually, in those days was every single Friday, not just in Lent), and count all the ways you couldn't measure up to Jesus, who fasted for forty days in the desert, stood up to being tempted by the devil, and knew all the time that he was going to die a painful, shameful death on our behalf. In my view, we were expected to walk around under a little cloud of guilt for the entire six weeks. The weather at this time of the year is terrible and sad, even if (or maybe worse if) there is no snow. The symbols of the coming of spring (and the Resurrection) are not always immediately apparent. So Lent, on its surface, is not necessarily a positive experience. But we can make it that way.

We have kicked off our Lent this year with Ash Wednesday, as always. In the Old Testament, ashes signify mortality and penance. Non-Christian cultures use ashes as a symbol of mourning, as well. So on this penitential day, we place ashes on our heads. Unfortunately, many people see this as the only reason to go out of their way to church on Ash Wednesday. For many years, ashes have been what Father Andrew Greeley called the "Catholic ID card," and each year there is more and more pressure on the parishes, to distribute ashes outside a liturgy—"ash and dash," where people just want ashes but cannot be bothered to enter into community worship on this holy day. But whether we come to mass or a liturgy of the word, it remains important that we step off on this journey together, as a community, with an understanding of Lent beyond walking around with a dirty face. We worship together. We minister together. We mourn together. We are penitential together. We are all one community.

As an adult, I see Lent more in the context of the Resurrection. Lent is what Jesus went through in order to rise from the dead and save us from our sins. The Resurrection means very little without the Passion, and the Passion means very little without our reflection and penitence during Lent. We journey to the Resurrection through Lent together in community.

This weekend's readings have the first of our baptismal symbols in Lent (more about that next week!), as well as the story of Jesus being tempted in the desert (a version of this gospel appears on the first Sunday of Lent in all three liturgical years). The people have offended God, so God floods the earth and destroys everything except for faithful Noah and his family and the animals he saves. God gives them a rainbow as the sign of the covenant after the rain. We can see the flood as a symbol of baptism, which is illuminated by the second reading, explaining that the Flood and our own baptism washed everything clean.

Jesus is tempted by the devil in this weekend's gospel. The temptation is the theme in the First Sunday of Lent's gospel every liturgical year, but in Year B (where we are), it is just a passing reference. This gospel highlights that Jesus comes away out of the desert into Galilee when his cousin John the Baptist is arrested. Jesus begins to proclaim the word, and using the words we used on Ash Wednesday, exhorts us to repent and believe in the gospel. This is how we can go forward with our lives, not just during Lent but all the time.

Our Lenten journey has started! Let's move forward on our way to the Resurrection!


