Dear Friends,

With gratitude and hope I wish you and your loved ones a Happy Easter!

As beloved daughters and sons of God, we have been the recipients and witnesses of the closeness, kindness, and love of God. We have let God walk with us. We have allowed him to heal our wounds and brokenness. We have invited him to be part of our struggles and joys. We all, at some point in our lives, felt and experienced God filling our hearts with his love.

Personally, I feel and experience the closeness, the power of the Holy Spirit, and the love of God in conversations and interactions I am lucky to have with many of you, planning a parish event that will bring us closer to one another and to the Lord or celebrating the sacraments. For example, praying and administering the Sacrament of the Holy Anointing to our loved ones continues to be a source of encounter with the Lord. Also celebrating a funeral or memorial Mass or celebrating Mass on weekdays and Sundays is another blessing that connects me with the Lord and for which I am most grateful.

Another source of encountering and experiencing the closeness, mercy, and love of God is the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Eucharistic Revival Reflection

Encountering Christ's Glorified Body

Catholicism is pretty weird when you think about it. We worship a God who entered our world 2,000 years ago as a Jewish carpenter, was executed as a criminal, rose from the dead, and continues to be truly present to us under the appearance of bread and wine when a priest follows an ancient ritual.

Dr. Paul Hilliard made this point when speaking at our recent Evening of Prayer & Reflection. Our job as the laity is to share the good news—that God loves us so much that he became one of us, defeated death, and offers us eternal life. It's extraordinary. And it's the hope our world sorely needs.

The Eucharist, too, can be difficult to comprehend. How can it be that we consume the body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus, who died and ascended into heaven so long ago? The Gospel stories we hear throughout Easter of Jesus appearing to his disciples may be helpful in answering this question.

When Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene, to his apostles, and to the travelers on the road to Emmaus, they see him in his glorified body. It's different from before he died. He can walk through walls, suddenly appear and vanish, and travel great distances. He isn't immediately recognizable as the Nazarene rabbi and carpenter even to people who know him well. And yet it is Jesus, present in the flesh.

When we receive the Eucharist, we are receiving the same glorified body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus. It is under the appearance of bread and wine, but the <u>substance</u> is Jesus' body (hence why the doctrine is called "tran<u>substantiation"</u>). Like Jesus' disciples, we don't see Jesus the same way as before he died when we see the Eucharist, but we have it on good authority that "This is my body, which is given for you" (Luke 22:19).

If we believe the eternal God was able to enter into humanity, defeat death, and rise from the dead, we can trust that he really is present in the Eucharist.






