A letter from the Associate Pastor's Desk

We may be in the middle of Respect Life Month, but November isn't far away. While we are praying about re-gaining the dignity we were originally given by being made in the image and likeness of God, there will always be plenty of opportunities for us to celebrate our loved ones who go before us in death with Jesus' promise of Resurrection.

Several years ago, St. Cletus had begun a ministry known as Compassionate Care. It was a team of men and women who were trained as representatives of St. Cletus who would attend visitations, help plan funerals while offering comfort to those who were grieving, and even lead prayers at funeral homes. Some learned the art and ministry of serving at funeral masses as sacristans and gushers. A small group of choir members formed and created the Good Shepherd choir, which is a very special ministry as they are strictly volunteers offering their talents to help comfort families through song. The whole ministry is volunteers, not just the choir.

There are still a few people who have been dedicated to continuing to offer their time and compassion for those who are grieving; however, we simply have not had to use some of the pieces we offered like leading the prayers at the funeral

home. Still, in prayer, I am very aware that there will indeed be a time when the Compassionate Care Ministry will indeed need to be resurrected (no pun intended), and that planning needs to start now.

I will be having a meeting on November 14th at 6:30pm in the Gallagher Room for anyone interested in being trained in any or all aspects of this very special ministry. You see, having a heart doesn't need training, but using our empathy and compassion skills are gifts from God that need to be honed and refined. We draw upon our own experiences of having been the recipients of others' compassion, and then share that compassion and love that even Jesus showed Martha and Mary when their brother Lazarus died. Remember? He wept. But what does he offer with his heart? Hope.

That is the calling of every baptized person who follows Jesus Christ – to offer hope when things seem hopeless, to offer light in times of darkness, and to renew the hearts of others who need to know God has not left them. Details of the hopeful November 14th meeting should be finalized soon. I hope we get a good showing for this information evening.






