

Pastor's Note

Dear Parishioners,

How are we being light in the Lord? How is the light of the Lord affecting our thoughts and feelings? How is the light of the Lord drawing us closer to Jesus Christ? How is the light of the Lord encouraging us to share our strengths, talents and gifts at home, work, and parish? How is the light of the Lord inspiring us to be more generous, understanding, and more focused on others?

At St. Cletus Parish the light of the Lord continues to brighten our thoughts, feelings, and actions. Every day something good is happening. Every weekend the light of the Lord keeps producing every kind of goodness. Below I am happy to share with you some events, activities, and meetings where I noticed the light of the lord producing something beautiful.

First, the 2nd Annual St. Cletus Lenten Fish Fry, sponsored by St. Cletus Father's Club, was a success! Besides having a great time, I was overwhelmed with joy and gratitude.

Second, two parishioners that attended the 2nd Annual Fish Fry took the time to send me an email. They wanted me to know how much they enjoyed the gathering. I share their notes with you with the intention that together we keep each other in prayer and continue to allow the Holy Spirit work through us.

Note From Father Mike

Rejoice? During Lent?

Yes. We are at that critical point in our Season of Penance – Laetarae Sunday. That means not only do we see a change in vestment color from purple to "pink," God calls us to rejoicing, for the day of resurrection draws ever near. It's a strange concept to many since we are intentionally making sacrifices during these 40 days, and particularly to children as they are learning about making sacrifices by "giving up" something. That's been the normal way of teaching children, for example, giving up eating any candy. It was a very basic way of teaching a very difficult principle. Honestly, I think the principle of sacrifice is still not very well practiced. Maybe that's why we say it takes discipline.

Sacrifice, however, is more than "giving up" something. It's learning to give from the heart. It's learning what it means to give of oneself completely for the benefit of another. Maybe that is the reason I have always found the martyrs of the Church to be so fascinating. We have faith that Jesus, of course, freely gave His life so that sins would be forgiven. Well, the martyrs did similar actions for others, just not on the scale Jesus did. They might have courageously offered their very life so that someone else might live. They might have forgiven their persecutors in the face of their own danger. Some simply kept on singing God's praises when they were told to stop and they were put to death. In any case, these are feats of amazing courage to say the least. The story of Sts. Maximillian Kolbe and Teresa Benedicta of the Cross come to mind when I think of more modern-day martyrs.

Maximillian Kolbe and Teresa Benedicta ministered at the concentration camps of Auschwitz. When I even think of the horrible things that went on at those concentration camps, my stomach turns upside and down. Maybe part of my disgust is that I have Jewish blood in my veins, but I don't think that is a pre-requisite for having such disgust and abhorrence for what Hitler and the Nazi soldiers did in murdering so many human beings. So when Maximillian Kolbe and Teresa Benedicta offered themselves in place of other would-be victims, they were rewarded for their heroic actions. And there are many other similar stories of martyrs throughout Christian history. St. Stephen was the first martyr of the Church. He was the one who was put to death WHILE St. Paul (formerly known as Saul) watched on. Yes, the very same person in St. Paul who would go on to travel from city to city in the Middle East and along the Mediterranean coastal region, persecuted Christians until his conversion experience.

I cannot count just how many times I have had to concentrate on returning to God over my lifetime, and especially during my priestly ministry. I have encountered angels (messengers from God) who have helped to guide me and remind me of my faults and failings so that I seek reconciliation through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The Catechism of the Catholic Church asks us to be sure to celebrate Reconciliation at least once per year. Many people were taught to be at confession twice per year – once in Advent, once in Lent (the two seasons of Anticipation). There were still more Catholics raised that they needed to confess their sins before receiving the Eucharist. The truth is that we need to simply be aware that once per year is all that is required. For many people, that is difficult to understand. Blessings to all.






Sharing Success
