#### Dear Friends,

It is with gratitude and joy that I share with you that Cardinal Blase Cupich, Archbishop of Chicago, will be visiting our parish on Sunday, April 7<sup>th</sup>, 2024. During his visit, he will celebrate a Mass for us, join us at the reception after Mass (Parish Center), and speak with you at one-on-one level. I consider Cardinal Cupich's visit as a blessing.

Following the discernment and recommendation of a special committee (Parishioners/Staff) that was established for this special occasion, I am happy to let you know that on Sunday, April 7<sup>th</sup>, 2024, our Sunday Mass schedule will be as follows: 7:15 AM, 8:45 AM and 11:00 AM. Cardinal Cupich will be the principal celebrant and homilists of our 11:00 AM Mass which will be in English and Spanish. This is truly an opportunity for us to pray well together as one vibrant community of faith with our shepherd. In advance, I would like to thank you for your prayer, cooperation, and support.

Yesterday (3/9) 97 children from our parish received the sacrament of Confirmation at a special Mass celebrated at 1:00 PM by Most Rev. Daniel Turley. I would like to congratulate our children for joyfully receiving the sacrament of Confirmation. They took seriously their confirmation preparation. They made the time to grow in prayer and friendship with Jesus. They embraced openly the encouragements they received from their parents, teachers, catechists, and friends. I am confident that they will remain close to the Lord who loves them. I offer my sincere gratitude to all who offered them accompaniment, encouragement, and love.

Our recent training for current and new altar servers went well. We had a few children who successfully completed their training under the leadership and guidance of Deacon Santos Gutierrez who was assisted by Norma Hernandez. It is encouraging and humbling to see our children who want to serve at Mass as altar servers. The witness they give us at each Mass is profound and moving. As I thank each of them, I also would like to offer my sincere gratitude to their parents. They know their children and eagerly support the desire of their children to serve as altar servers. Please hold them in prayer and feel free to thank them at the end of Mass.

Our third amazing annual Lenten Fish Fry is next Friday, March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2024, which is sponsored by St. Cletus Father's Club. It will be held in our Parish Center starting at 4:30 PM. I am aware that the members of the Father's Club want us all to come together as a parish/school family, enjoy a delicious fish fry, and grow in friendship with each other. I am encouraged by their dedication, generosity, and leadership. Please hold them in prayer and I will see you at the Fish Fry.

A week ago (February 25<sup>th</sup>-March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2024) I was able to complete my yearly retreat. ### **Note From Father Mike**

#### **Covenant 4**

Noah. The rainbow.

Abraham. Isaac.

Moses. The Ten Commandments.

This week, our series on the covenant takes a bit of a twist as we are given another piece of how God shows us His part of the covenant to be our God, but it comes through someone no one in that time would have expected to be the prophetic voice of man – King Cyrus of Persia. Most people hear that name and think "who is THAT?" Or, "how can a Persian be a prophet?"

The passage from the Second Book of Chronicles comes to us as the Israelites are in exile in Babylon. They were taken by force and couldn't understand why God would abandon them to the power of an enemy. But this is where we see what happens every so often with the Israelites. They get to be a little complacent with God and begin to be disobedient to the covenant. So the enemy even destroys their temple. That would have been considered a huge sign that God had abandoned them. And yet, God stepped in again to change that perception. In His own way, God lets the Israelites know that He never left them by inspiring King Cyrus to not only allow the Israelites to return to their homeland, but to decree the building and restoration of the Temple once destroyed.

"All the kingdoms of the earth
the LORD, the God of heaven, has given to me,
and he has also charged me to build him a house
in Jerusalem, which is in Judah.
Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of his people,
let him go up, and may his God be with him!"

So what does that have to do with us?

It has everything to do with the modern times.

Quite often we feel like God has abandoned us for various reasons. "What did I do to deserve this? Why is God punishing me? Why has God abandoned His Church? How does God continue to let human trafficking to continue being a major issue when it's so against everything He stands for?" Yet, in any of these questions which we and so many others ask, God lets us know through many signs (and from many unlikely sources) that He, in fact, has never left us. It is WE who become blind to His presence in the world.

When I hear about a child being born pre-maturely who becomes a miracle for their parents, I get a feeling and sense that God still knows what He is doing and that He alone is in charge. Those who are disobedient to what God commands WILL be dealt with in the end. Abominations like human trafficking are deplorable because while God creates us in His image and likeness, other beings of the same species treat another as objects — as if they have no soul. And forcing someone to do some sort of evil is far more evil than what a victim is forced to do. It's sick.

God's covenantal love for us is always going to be in the signs He gives us. Look to listen to someone who is joining the Church at Easter, or for someone who might be new to St. Cletus. Maybe instead of looking FOR sign of God, consider being the sign of God's love for all people.

Remember, God is relational before rational. Jesus walks among us always.



### **Eucharistic Revival**

### "Both/And," Not "Either/Or"

Author F. Scott Fitzgerald once wrote that "the test of a first-rate intelligence is the ability to hold two opposed ideas in the mind at the same time, and still retain the ability to function." Catholicism is full of such paradoxes, leading theologians to refer to the "both/and" quality of our faith.

You'll find examples of "both/and" theology everywhere. We rely on the authority of "scripture and tradition" (contra Luther's insistence on *sola scriptura*!). Human persons are both "body and soul," not reducible to either. We are both created in God's image and also are marked by original sin. We both have a fallen nature and are redeemed by grace. It's "both/and," not "either/or."

The Eucharist is full of "both/and" realities. Jesus is both human and divine, able to enter into our suffering and redeem us through his sacrifice. He is both the high priest and the sacrificial victim. The Eucharist is both a foretaste of the heavenly banquet and a sacrificial offering. It is both under the appearance of bread and substantially Jesus' body.

We sometimes fall short of Fitzgerald's "first-rate intelligence" by leaning too heavily toward one side of these paradoxes. But there's a richness to the challenge of holding both sides in tension. As you reflect on the Eucharist, consider which sides of the "both/ands" you gravitate toward and which sides you might need to explore further. The depths of God's goodness and truth can never be exhausted!

### **Lenten Reflection**

We are, believe it or not, into the second half of Lent. There's still time to pick up on our Lenten praxes, if you haven't started anything yet. We have talked about Prayer and Fasting, and I wanted to talk about Almsgiving, another form of self-sacrifice.

Jesus told us to take care of the poor, and Almsgiving has been a Christian practice since the beginning. Almsgiving is just another word for charity. What can we do to help the poor, the lonely, the stranger in our midst? Have you donated to the Food Pantry or other ministries lately? Are you filling your Rice Bowl? Charity does not have to involve money, either. Can you volunteer somewhere? Have you raked your neighbor's yard, or brought them something you baked, or given them a ride somewhere? These should really be year round activities for us, but they are especially important to carry out during Lent.

Two weekends ago our OCIA participants and their sponsors, and the pastoral associates from the three parishes in our cluster participated in the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion at Holy Name Cathedral. This is always a high point of my year and is a beautiful liturgy where the parishes of the Archdiocese present their candidates who wish to become Catholic at this year's Easter Vigil to the bishop. The representatives from the parishes assert that the candidates are ready, the candidates assert that they are ready, and the bishop accepts them. It is a lovely, happy day, with beautiful music, and this year sunshine poured through the stained glass windows of the Cathedral. Many of the people there had never been in the Cathedral before, and the staff of the Cathedral made a special effort to make everyone feel welcome. We sometimes lose sight of the fact that the Catholic Church is bigger than our own parish, and it's good to be reminded of that. In Chicago there are four of these Rites held each year, and the Cathedral is packed at each one. It is so wonderful, and so hopeful, to see all these people (we had heard there were 500 candidates at our rite) who want to become part of the church, from all parts of the Archdiocese and speaking a number of different languages. It's wonderful to think that our participants are part of a far greater number, and I'm so happy for all of them.

Starting last week we have had our Lenten Scrutiny Rites at the 10:30 mass, and we invite you to join us then. This Rite invites the Holy Spirit to look into the hearts of those who want to be Catholic and fix anything that needs to be fixed there. In the same way, the entire assembly is healed in this rite. We would love to have you come and meet our OCIA participants, who will be joining the community at the Easter Vigil.

Next week we'll talk some more about those OCIA participants, and how they are a part of everyone's Lent.
