

Dear Friends,

As people of faith, we are always invited by God himself to grow in relationship and friendship with him. A Letter from the Associate Pastor's Desk

Be the person God called you to be

The Wedding at Cana is more than a story of Jesus being obedient to Mary. It's about a changing of the guard too. Jesus says to Mary "My hour has not yet come." But Mary persists. Now here is where things begin the change — John mentions that "there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons." So that water would simply be reserved for the washings alone. Jesus has the jars refilled with water. What happens? Somewhere along the way to the headwaiter, the substance changes. It makes no mention of Jesus saying anything else, nor touching the water, nor even the jars. The substance of the water changes.

When I think of this gospel story, I go back to Moses seeking to convince Pharaoh to let Isarel go free. The difference is in Moses using the staff to touch the Nile which then changes the water into blood. Jesus, as the Good Shepherd (although we don't know it yet), doesn't need a staff nor even a touch. He simply gives the word. Things are far different than when Moses was around. The guard has changed indeed.

St. Cletus' guard changed just under four years ago. Many good things have taken place in that time. It was a rough time under COVID restrictions at the time. And I am sure there were many people that were vital in helping St. Cletus to remain afloat during that time. Many of those vital people have gone home to our heavenly Father whether during COVID or shortly thereafter. The fact that our parish never gave up because of the deadly virus is a true testament to the leadership of staff members

past and present. If there is one thing I have learned about the people of St. Cletus (priest, staff, ministries, and volunteers alike), it would be that they are determined to make the parish flourish for another generation and beyond.

But there has to be a motivating factor beyond love for the parish.

That factor, in my opinion, is hope for the salvation of every person that graces our campus. It means that some of our feelings need to be put on hold or on the back-burner so that anyone who visits us not only feels welcome but that they truly belong to something greater than themselves. That, in my own words, is what it means for St. Cletus to be a designated site for Jubilee Year 2025. It's a responsibility to keep the larger picture in our vision by focusing on being loving, generous, and kind to one person or even one family at a time. There may be some families that are more "advanced" than others. So be it, but not everyone is.

People may say that looking out for the lost is simply the job of the clergy. I beg to differ. If we are truly a people with hope for the salvation of all, then we are all in this task together. Let's say you see someone who is downcast. Should that person only be seen by a priest, or is there an opportunity to maybe be the Christian God called you to be on the day of your baptism?

Today, the guard changed in the gospel. Let's follow the Blessed Mother's advice "Do whatever he tells you." You really cannot go wrong.

Kindness Cards



Sharing Reflection of Kindness

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today's second reading may sound familiar to many of us. Perhaps you have read it or heard it at a retreat, a day of reflection, or perhaps at Mass three years ago. At any rate, the theological richness of this letter touches our hearts every time.

Before his ministry among the Corinthians, Paul had preached the good news of salvation in Athens. Although he could draw a few believers to Christ, Paul's words fell, for the most part, on deaf ears. Paul was undaunted in his resolve and continued his way to Corinth. After eighteen months, he had established a



network of house churches. The Corinthian Christians were enthusiastic, eager, and unrestrained in exercising their faith and the charisms or gifts with which they had been blessed. Paul also reminded the Corinthians of the fundamental premise that underlies today's reading and should inform the heart and mind of every enthusiastic believer: There are many gifts but only *one* giver; there are different gifts but only *one* goal, i.e., the *common good* of the whole believing community. This is what kindness is all about. Sharing the graces, blessings, and gifts we received from God is to be kind.

I have witnessed many acts of kindness at St. Cletus. Kindness is the natural result when we all put our minds and hearts together. We could speak about the gusher who greets and helps our brothers and sisters who come to worship, the volunteers at the food pantry who tirelessly attend to the needy, and those who are part of the staff but go above and beyond to ensure this continues to be a place where kindness flows. Other examples come to mind, but these are too many to list.

The same Spirit that dwells in all of us motivates us to share those talents and gifts God gave us. Let's continue to share them as the Corinthians did so long ago. We find the inspiration in them to continue building a world of kindness.






