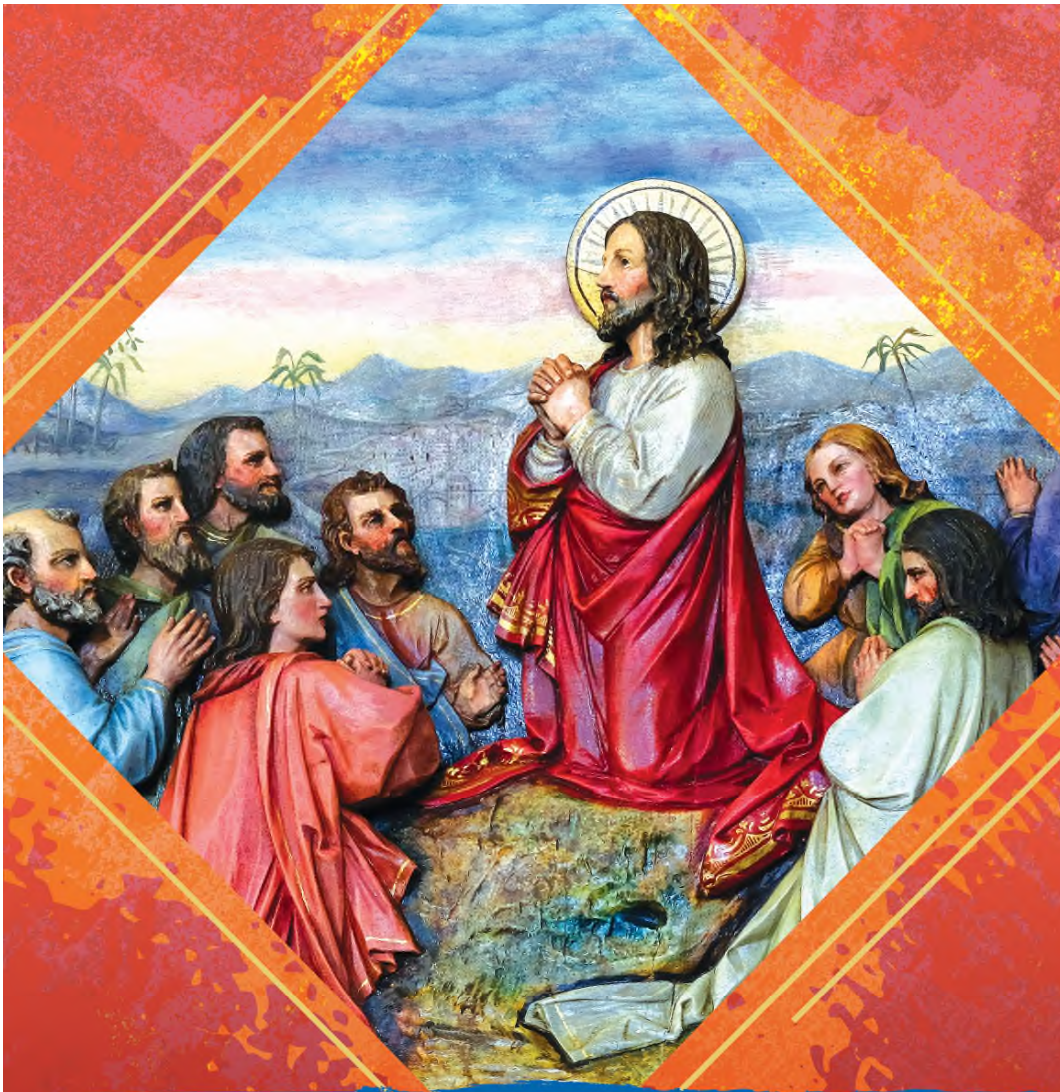

Pastor's Note

*“The eleven disciples went to Galilee,
to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them.

Dear Friends,

As we start a new fiscal year, (July 1st, 2023 - June 30th, 2024,) I am happy to share with you some important news and developments.

First, I would like to ask all of you to pray daily with the above scripture passage. It is the great commissioning of the disciples by Jesus, the Son of God. Over the past twenty centuries, baptized men and women all over the world have prayed, reflected, and felt compelled to fulfill Jesus' invitation. In this way, they found joy, peace, and fulfillment as they brought people closer to the Lord. This same invitation and opportunity continue to be offered to us. Jesus wants to be part of the life of every human being. He wants to share his gentleness, kindness, and love with every person. Today, he is asking us to join him and become his disciples by accepting the mission with which he is entrusting us. My hope is that the above scripture passage becomes part of our daily life and the inspiration of everything we do at our parish, St. Cletus.

Second, with your prayer, support, and the guidance of the Holy Spirit, this fiscal year and the following years, our focus will be to embrace and fulfill the mission Jesus has given to us. I want us to become more intentional and aware of our mission. We will channel our resources and blessings towards its fulfillment. We will offer formation and opportunities for growth in our knowledge of the faith and relationship with Jesus. Please assist me with your prayers as we become more intentional missionary disciples.

We will experience joy, peace, and fulfillment as we joyfully share our faith and lead others to the Lord.

Third, Hector Obregon has accepted my invitation to become our new Director of Evangelization and Renewal at our parish effective immediately. He holds a Master of Divinity with World Mission Concentration from Catholic Theological Union. He has been serving the Archdiocese since 2007 in different capacities. He will assist me in our efforts to embrace the mission given to us by Jesus by working closely with the Office of Evangelization of the Archdiocese of Chicago and by implementing opportunities for growth in the faith through Alpha, An Evening of Prayer and Reflection, Bible study, and other events. I am confident that the Holy Spirit will work through Hector as he shares his gifts and strengths with us. Please hold him in prayer.

Fourth, I am grateful to Clara Santin for accepting my invitation to join the office of Faith Formation for Children as the new Administrative Assistant (Part-time) effective July 12th, 2023. She will assist and work closely with Mr. Laurence Manetti, Director of Faith Formation for Children. She is an active member of our parish who loves to serve and volunteer. She serves as a Gusher and is a member of the Catholic Council of Women. In addition, she offered leadership with our first two parish pig roasts, is a key member of the Art and Environment Committee. Our parish is blessed to have her and offers her support and leadership with the Altar Servers Ministry. I am confident that Clara will work well with Mr. Manetti. Please join me in welcoming Clara as a new member of the Office of the Faith Formation for Children.

Fifth, it is my intention that decisions that I take for our parish will strengthen our desire to grow in our mission. Please continue to hold me in prayer as my heart and mind is shaped by Jesus' invitation.

May our hearts embrace, welcome, and find delight in the mission to go and make disciples of all nations.

Note From Father Mike

July 9 2023

Several years ago, Cardinal Cupich began to lead the Archdiocese upon a journey of renewal. He based this journey in the image of an icon – the San Damiano Cross. Renew My Church has been constantly criticized by many people who feel that the process is simply about finding ways to close parishes, schools, or even both. Admittedly, I have had my own skeptical moments and even bouts of anger in relation to the program because I've seen the hurt it causes communities that are told that their church doors would eventually be closed. It is painful. So, some people wonder "how could anyone think that inflicting that kind of pain is a good idea?"

Well, to begin with, the Cardinal never said anything about RMC being an easy program to accept. The San Damiano Cross is, in its image, a depiction of dying AND rising. As individuals, we know that death will come and HOPE that we will rise with Jesus. As a Church, we must know that there will always be times of communal suffering and disappointment. The Church's history is ink-blotted with a variety of decades of uncertainty and mistrust and scandal. Yet, people continued to come to our churches during those times of uncertainty and dwindling faith. The early church had many men who broke off from the Church because they didn't believe what the magisterium was teaching. And that happened during different eras too. Just an example, at one time in the 1700s, there were three different men who staked their claim to the papal throne all at one time. Could you imagine?

There have been subjects debated like the Perpetual Vir-

ginity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Jesus' own divine nature, Jesus' human nature, and so many more issues. Nowadays, one of the biggest issues facing today is the dwindling number of ordained ministers, especially here in Chicago, but it is happening in places throughout the globe too. Many people truly believe that the answer is in allowing women to be ordained to priesthood and diaconate. As yet, the Church isn't really discussing this issue.

Other people, I have recently been seeing lots and lots of complaints about how the Church "messed up" in bowing to civil authorities when we were told to shut our doors in order to keep people from being infected with the Coronavirus. "You really messed up." "You were not there when my dad was dying." "That's not how Jesus would have done things." And I've read many other comments that are just fowl and ignorant.

The Renew My Church offices for the Archdiocese has been skewered by people as well as the Cardinal. While I still have some difficulty with what has gone on up to this point, I must try to be supportive to the efforts of so many. I have to give credit to the RMC office and their team for persevering in spite of the opposition they've received. By no means am I immune to having my opinions, but I support the efforts being made by the parishes in transition to become something greater, parishes that want growth.

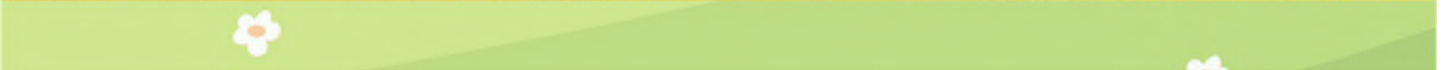

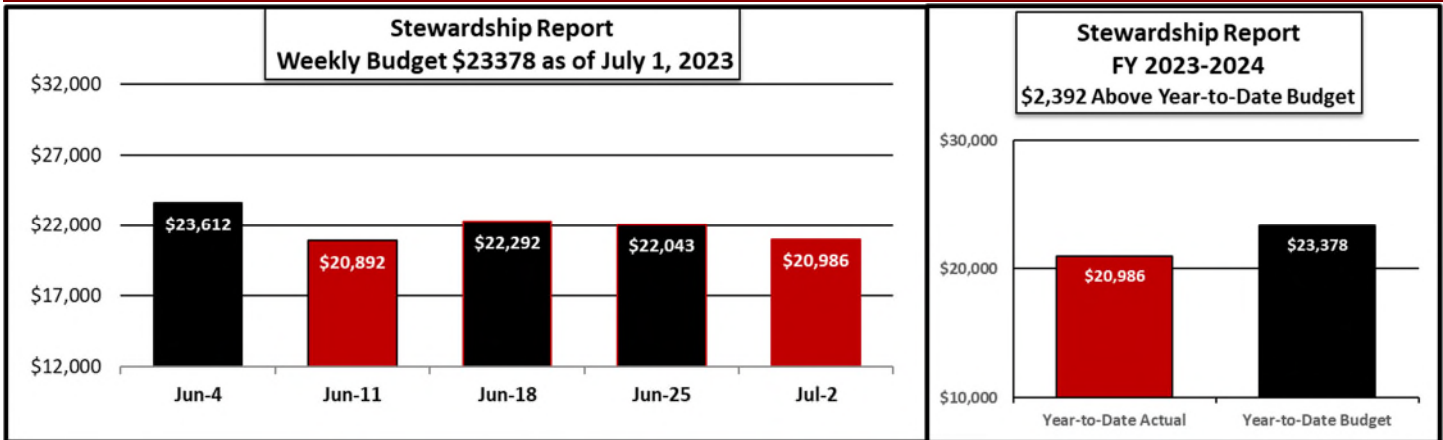
