

Dear Friends,

St. Teresa of Calcutta has been part of my prayer for the past two weeks. Her story of faith, love for humanity, and leadership is remarkable. She allowed the Spirit of the Lord to work through her, finding her purpose of life in the Lord. She resolved to dedicate her entire life to loving the Lord by serving and loving others. Radiating peace, joy, and love, she cared for others 'as a nursing mother cares for her children." She is a model for all of us as we care for our families, our faith, our community, and ourselves?

Both worked closely with Mr. Greg Porod, Principal, Jim Dion, Business Manager, Franco Foti, Operations Director, Pleasant Dale Park District, Innovation Landscaping, and Village of La Grange. They engaged this project with gentleness, kindness, and care. I was encouraged by their witness. Please hold them in prayer. We will have a special ribbon ceremony and a blessing of the playground on Sunday, April 28th, 2024, immediately after the 10:30 AM Family Mass. Hope you can join us.

This year the celebration of The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed was special. The Spirit of the Lord inspired the hearts of the members of the Parish Pastoral Council, Art and Environment Committee, and the Hispanic Ministry to build a special altar in the Sanctuary of our church to honor and pray in a special way for our loved ones. Many were inspired and engaged by seeing the altar holding a photo of their loved ones. I was happy to see the cross-collaboration taking place among our leaders. Their generosity is contagious. Their dedication is inspiring. They are missionary disciples of Jesus. They show us the closeness of the Lord with their lives, faith, and contributions. Please join me in holding them in prayer.

Note From Father Mike

Eternal Rest Grant Unto Them, O Lord

"And let perpetual light shine upon them." This prayer is one that has been a part of the faith for many years. However, I am noticing more and more when I am praying at funeral homes or at the end of a cemetery committal service, less and less people are familiar with it. Or maybe, if they are aware of it, they still do not respond to it. I can only tend to believe one of two theories as to why people do not respond.

First, grieving loss is overwhelming for anyone. It's easy for those close to the deceased to be caught in it so deeply that even simple prayers might be forgotten. However, the second reason was just a little more disturbing. In my early days of ministry, I noticed that there were fewer and fewer children (e.g. between 7-16 years old) in attendance at the wakes for aunts or uncles or grandparents because their own parents didn't want the children to be "traumatized" by death. Not only is exposing children to death important, but the longer families wait to bring the kids, the harder it is for the children to understand. They won't have a grasp on what it means to grieve. Here are just two examples from my own life.

The first wake I remember being at was for my maternal grandfather when I was only 9 years old. My parents may have taken my brother and I with them to other wakes before this one, but again, it's the first one I remember attending. I don't remember too many specifics, but I remember images of the atmosphere of the funeral home. Unfortunately, I was overwhelmed and the stress made me so nauseated, I got sick at the funeral home and missed the funeral the following day. Yet, personally, in my life today, the Holy Spirit has given me a gift to work closely with families at their times of loss. It doesn't mean I don't have my own times of grieving. My own soul is still reeling at times over the passing of Fr. Charles Watkins earlier this year, my best friend for 25 years. But the grieving is supposed to be a "gift" as difficult as that is to see especially when a loss is fresh in the heart. We are called to remember.

The other story was not about me but about my nephew who was maybe 5 or 6 years old when my father (his grandfather) died in 2009. He absorbs what he sees others doing. The image of him walking around the funeral home greeting others and thanking them for attending was an image I never want to forget. He remained present to the people for the whole wake and funeral the next day, not showing too much emotional grief, as he had done most of his crying at home. Today, he is a successful student teacher and certainly has great compassion for those hurting.

November is a month of remembering. Grieving is never going to be easy, but faith and trust in Jesus' love (especially in the Eucharist, for me) does help to heal. It's not time, but God WHO heals.

Please Join Us November 18th


Dear Parishioners,

BLESSINGS CONTINUE TO SHINE UPON US!

St. Cletus campus is proud to announce our newest edition: Alumni Park, in memory of Sr. Madonna Mulqueen O.S.F (Sisters of St. Francis of Assisi). Sr. Madonna began our preschool program in 1989 along with her aide, Mrs. Lorraine Stanko. The program flourished under their guidance. Sr. Madonna created the program using her degree in learning disabilities in early childhood, which helped her assist ALL students to find success. The play-based program has led to our preschool programs' growth!

St. Cletus was gifted this gently used industrial play set from the Pleasant Dale Park District. However, the parish did have to cover proper removal, transportation, reinstallation, and specialty mulch. 

Upcoming Evening of Prayer and Reflection

AN EVENING OF— Prayer & Reflection

THE SEASON OF ADVENT: A NEW BEGINING JESUS WITH /

Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year and is often the least understood of the liturgical seasons. Why do we celebrate every year the coming of Jesus when He has already come? How do we embrace this season so that we might grow as Christian disciples? This presentation will attempt to answer these questions as we pursue the Gospel path together.

Environment and sustainability




