A Note from the Associate Pastor's Desk

WHEN THE SAINTS GO MARCHING IN

If you grew up in the 1970s or 1980s, and attended Mass on a regular basis, you likely heard the song "When The Saints Go Marching In." It might even still be used and taught in some schools. This coming Friday is the Solemnity of All Saints, one of the holy days of obligation. Some people have mentioned to me over time that the phrase "holy day of obligation" shouldn't be used any longer. In other words, we shouldn't make people feel guilty if they don't make it to Mass on a holy day. "People should be encouraged to go to Mass, but don't tell them it's a sin if they don't attend." Work schedules and other parts of life might not always be conducive to those Mass times for a particular parish. I can appreciate that. Still, I would tend to think that since holy days tend to mark special events or people in the Church's vast history, why wouldn't your average Catholic WANT to receive the Eucharist to remember them?

Others have asked "if we celebrate All Saints Day, then what is the purpose of celebrating certain other saints on specific dates during the year?" Think for a moment. What was St. John's vision in the Book of Revelation? 144,000? There are not 144,000 days in a year;

however, rest assured that each and every one of the saints have their own feast day. Still, not every date SEEMS to have a saint associated with it. In that respect, we honor ALL of the saints — men and women we've heard stories about, as well as ones we've never heard of who received the glorious crown in very early days of the Church when record-keeping might not have been quite so accurate, and names might be the only thing on record along with a date, just not as much written information as so many others have.

And the Commemoration of All Souls on November 2nd every year, while it's not a holy day of obligation, why do so many people attend an "extra" Mass every year? That answer, for me, is rather simple – because we have been gifted with memories, we grieve, and we need God's tender embrace to be felt. And while we focus a little more on those who have died in the past year from our parish on All Souls Day, we are still in communion with ALL of our beloved dead, especially with those whom we've never known personally, giving thanks for the many and varied ways so many contributed to the building up of a community of faith and love.

XXX Sunday in Ordinary Time-Gospel Meditation: Encourage Deeper understanding of Scripture By Fr. John Muir at ©LPI

Near my house there is a school for the blind. Often, I see blind people learning how to navigate the world with only a walking stick, even on a busy street with roaring traffic. I'm amazed to see how adept and carefully they get around without sight. Nevertheless, often a sadness arises in me that he or she cannot see all the beautiful colors, images, and persons filling the world around them. Those days, I find myself deeply grateful for the basic privilege of sight.

That's part of why the mystery of Jesus as the sight-giver is so moving to me. This week, it's wonderful how Bartimaeus the blind man is no longer content with his limitation and bellows out his desire for Jesus' mercy. In beautiful simplicity, he cries out to the Lord, "Master, let me receive my sight." Jesus quietly heals his sight. And off

he goes, fully taking in the world around him. Imagine the delightful new way in which he is able to respond to the world.

Like blind Bartimaeus and the courageous people in my neighborhood, we may be able to get around reasonably well in our daily lives. But we are blind to the gestures of heroic love of people close to us. We can't see the desperate need of the hungry, thirsty, imprisoned, exploited, endangered, and so on, in our midst. We can't see Jesus drawing near to us in so many ways, but he is. This Sunday let's cry out to him: Lord have mercy on me! I want to see! And little by little — or perhaps in a flash — we'll see once again, or perhaps for the first time.





Special guest speakers will include Sara Emmick from The Hope Chest and Kim Stephens, Pillars' Vice President of Domestic and Sexual Violence Services.


