Pastor's Note

Dear Friends,

It is with immense gratitude and joy that I share with you an update of our Parish Grounds Beautification.

The first stage of the church and school grounds beautification project was completed the weekend of Oct. 9-10, 2021. This stage was specifically selected to reinvigorate the entrance to our church by changing the three garden beds leading into our church and the St. Francis bed just to the west, adjacent to the church. This stage is only the beginning of a professionally designed plan that will unify the entire parish grounds (both church, school & rectory) with a completion goal of next year. This plan allows for mostly perennial plants in our beds but some inclusion of annuals that will be planted to accentuate and acknowledge different seasonal flower varieties. For instance, mums and kale being planted to highlight the fall season. The mums planted at the flag pole signify the Vatican colors of gold and white that are displayed at Catholic institutions with a gold and white flag.

Perhaps you have concerns about what this might cost. The landscape plan, flowers and bushes did of course cost money. Some monies have already been donated. However, the plan cost was reasonable and all the flowers/plants were acquired at reduced costs because many of our volunteers have business relationships with local suppliers, including Hinsdale Nursery. Labor, perhaps the greatest cost, has all been donated by generous parishioners. Many worked after their regular workday into the night to meet the first deadline of the weekend of Oct. 9-10, 2021. This plan was discussed with parishioners involved in these ministries prior to launching. Additionally, many of the removed plants, including rose bushes, were offered to any parishioner for their own use through announcements at Mass, a parish-wide email and in the Canticle. Many of you accepted this offer. Thank you!

This parish grounds beautification project really began on July 29, 2021, when 40 volunteers joined after 8:00 AM Mass to pull weeds. While not a glamorous chore, the fellowship, getting reacquainted, and meeting new friends and making things look great was rewarding. Trying to regroup, get back to church and our community after COVID is obviously an important goal to keep the parish strong! The need to evangelize and assist others to rejoin our community is especially needed now. One way to do this is to take care of our grounds, showing involvement and color. Another weeding event occurred after another 8:00 AM Mass on Sept. 23, 2021. Thanks to all of you who helped with these two events and all who have been quietly weeding on your own. It is noticeable and appreciated!

Another benefit of this beautification project will be to act on suggestions forwarded to me through parishioners from the Sharing of our Hopes and Dreams Gathering held on September 13, 2021. Below is just one of several quotes from the September 26-27, 2021, bulletin highlighting the need to unify and evangelize within our community:

"Major talking points were inclusivity focusing on all age groups and the Hispanic members of our parish, school enhancements, and evangelization."

I am pleased to know that this beautification effort has instantaneously increased interactions within our community. Below are names of volunteers from last week who joined together to share muddy boots, grass-stained knees, dirty gloves, and sore backs:




on Veterans Day, November 11, 2021. A collection box has been placed in the parish Narthex for your donations.


