

A Note from the Associate Pastor's Desk

Source and Summit

Back at the Second Vatican Council in the mid to late 1960s, our fathers sought to teach people the heart of the faith in a language they could better understand. While it is Baptism that gets the sacramental life started, the Eucharist is said to be the source and summit of the Catholic faith. Everything we know about the world and how we should be treating others flows from the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, whose Body and Blood he freely offered to the world out of love for the Father and for us. Yet, everything we do in this world should lead us to wanting a better relationship with Jesus who IS the summit and example par excellence. We should want to know and love as He loves each and every person on this earth - past, present, and future.

Can we ever really get to that point in life and truly love everyone like Jesus does? Is it truly possible? Well, yes, it is. Is it possible to love as such without the Eucharist? Maybe, yes, but it's less likely to happen without having a true and genuine understanding of self-sacrifice. Jesus' supreme sacrifice of spilling his blood on behalf of all humanity is the example; but Jesus even made the bigger gesture so that we could understand his being the source – gifting humanity with His very own Body and Blood in what still appears to be bread and wine. He offered bread and wine to the Apostles on that "fateful" night, stating "This IS my body. Take and eat...this IS the cup of my blood. Take and as often as you drink it, remember me."

When you might hear someone want to argue and say that no change actually occurs at consecration – that it's only bread and wine – don't cave into someone because their explanation sounds more logical and more possible. The Eucharist is truth. Bread and wine substantially change into something other than what we see. Yes, it is difficult to accept sometimes, but that is when we need to come back to the summit and be nourished by the source – not once, nor once in a while, but often (as Jesus himself stated). For us in the Catholic Church, that one day a week that the Fathers set for us is not

much to ask – to come to the source and summit together.

Now we are merely weeks from our children returning to school, whether here at St. Cletus, Nazareth Academy, Lyons Township, or any of the other schools in our public district, plus, the many young people who are either returning to college or just starting their college life. We send with them the knowledge and love of God. We've all tried to instill in them the importance of having a sacramental life and the importance of Sunday Mass. We need to pray very hard for these young people. There are still so many factors in our world today that will try to convince them that faith and belief in God, let alone the Eucharist, is futile. I've seen it all too often over 23 years, especially with college students. I hear back from parents about their children stopping the practices they've been taught. Now more than ever, we need to encourage them and try to help them navigate a muddy world. Some will eventually find love along the way and their "new love" may not be Catholic, and so they stop going to Church because their new friend does not. It's exactly situations like that why patience is a major virtue to cultivate.

There will be other times when even our own hope for the world will taint our souls. Our children see those things. Despite our best efforts not to do so, we tend to take after our parents.

Brothers and sisters, I may seem biased in my view, but I would not be a priest today without the faith that my parents helped to shape and mold with the help of God. Their example in taking my brother and I to Mass every Sunday became more than just a habit. My own faith-life probably would have simply faded away if it was not for the weekly reception of the Eucharist. Where would I be? Maybe consider that question for yourself and then discuss it with your children/teens/young adults. It could make a major difference to their lives.

A letter from the Coordinator of Faith Formation

Are you wondering if being a catechist is right for you? Or maybe you're already a catechist and aren't sure about continuing. The real question is, "Am I called to be a catechist?" To answer this, you need to consider, "What is a catechist"? A catechist is a person who passes on the faith to others. This



involves not just teaching about doctrine and Church teaching, but also helping others encounter Jesus.

So, what does a catechist do?

With the help of the Holy Spirit, a catechist engages both the heart and mind by praying (personally and communally) and participating in the sacramental life of the Church, nurturing, sharing, and being a witness of faith. They educate the whole person intellectually, spiritually, and physically.

Who calls a catechist? There are many reasons to



consider
becoming one.
You may receive
an invitation
from the pastor
or leader of the
religious
education
program, or you
may be inspired
by a friend or
family member
who is a

catechist. But who really calls a catechist? According to the Directory for Catechesis, "The catechist is a Christian who receives a particular calling from God that, when accepted in faith, empowers them for the service of the transmission of faith and for the task






