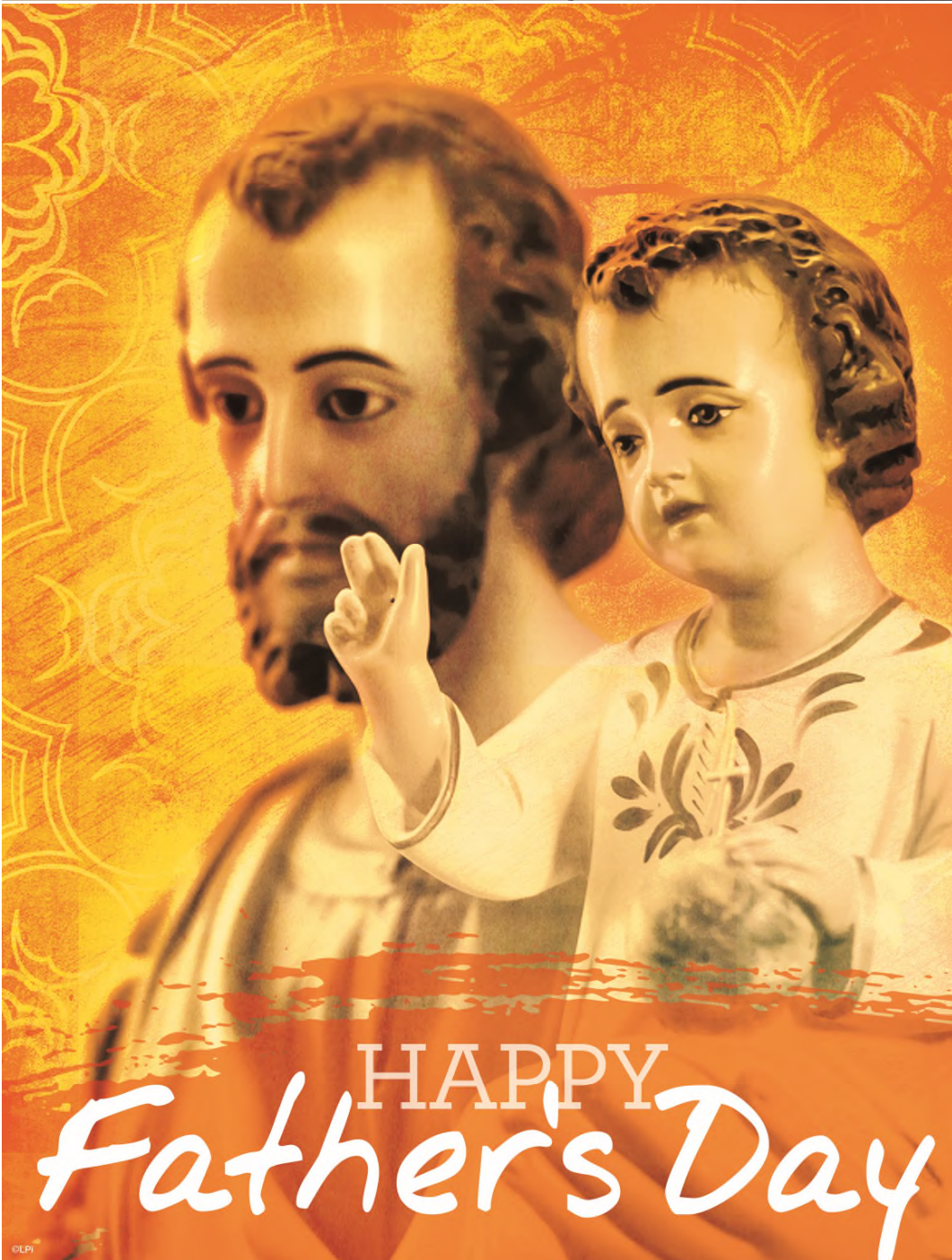

June 18, 2023 – 11th Sunday Ordinary Time

We are slowly approaching my first anniversary of being here at St. Cletus. What a joy! Every parish is going to have its ups and downs, but how often can someone say there have been more ups than downs like I can. I'm not saying that I don't miss my friends from my previous assignment, but you, the parishioners of St. Cletus, have really helped me in the process of lots of transition over these twelve months. I am constantly being reminded of a phrase in one of the Eucharistic Prefaces before the consecration of the bread and wine which says, "life is changed, not ended." I'm also reminded of the old saying "the only things that are certain in life are death and taxes" to which I amend "and CHANGE." Again, thanks for the continued support from everyone. I look forward to the coming years, but there is also a matter of being proactive in seeking young men who may be called to priestly ministry. Without a lot of hard work from all of us in seeking vocations, there's no telling just how long I might be able to keep this marvelous assignment.

I also must be grateful to the Hispanic Ministry. Everyone seems to pitch-in to be sure that St. Cletus can participate in customs from Mexico, Puerto Rico, Central America, and South America. There may even be a few traditions that have some over from across the pond. But I am certainly grateful to Fr. Elmer for helping me to expand my ministerial horizons as I celebrated Mass for the first time in Spanish three weeks ago, and I will be on the schedule to celebrate once a month for now. 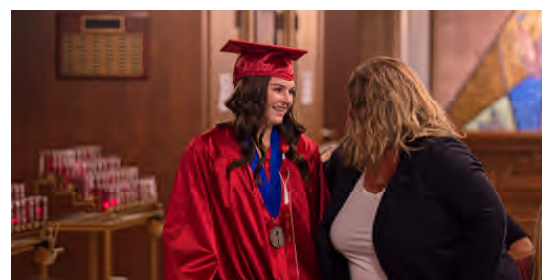

FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

We are thrilled to announce that we have been awarded a grant by the Greater Chicago Food Depository (GCFD) to become a Community Food Rescue Hub!

As GCFD undergoes some restructuring, they are shifting the grocery donation pickups from area retailers directly to local pantries. Previously, these donations were picked up by GCFD trucks and drivers. This change will free them up for other programming at GCFD.

In January 2023, we began picking up grocery donations directly from the Jewel locations in La Grange Park and Countryside. These donations have been a huge help as our numbers continue to rise!

For the past year, we have been working with GCFD to become a Hub. **The St. Cletus Food Pantry was recognized for its growth, presence and leadership in the western suburbs and for our capacity to assist smaller pantries in the area.** We are honored to be chosen as a grant recipient and to become a Community Food Rescue Hub.

As a Hub, **we have been given a brand new refrigerated truck!** St. Cletus owns the vehicle and it was given to us at no cost. This vehicle will be used to procure grocery donations for St. Cletus, as well as, two other pantries in our area: Elsie’s Pantry (Palos Hills) and Second Baptist Church Pantry (La Grange). We are also expanding our retailer partnerships. In addition to the two Jewel locations, we will also be working with the Walmart, Target and Aldi in Hodgkins, as well as the Tony’s in Countryside.

At this time, **we are looking for volunteers that might be interested in learning more about helping with food rescue pickups or being a substitute driver,** as needed. Volunteers must be comfortable driving a large vehicle and able to lift 30+ lbs. Please reach out to Kendall at foodpantry@stcletusparish.com or 708-215-5418.

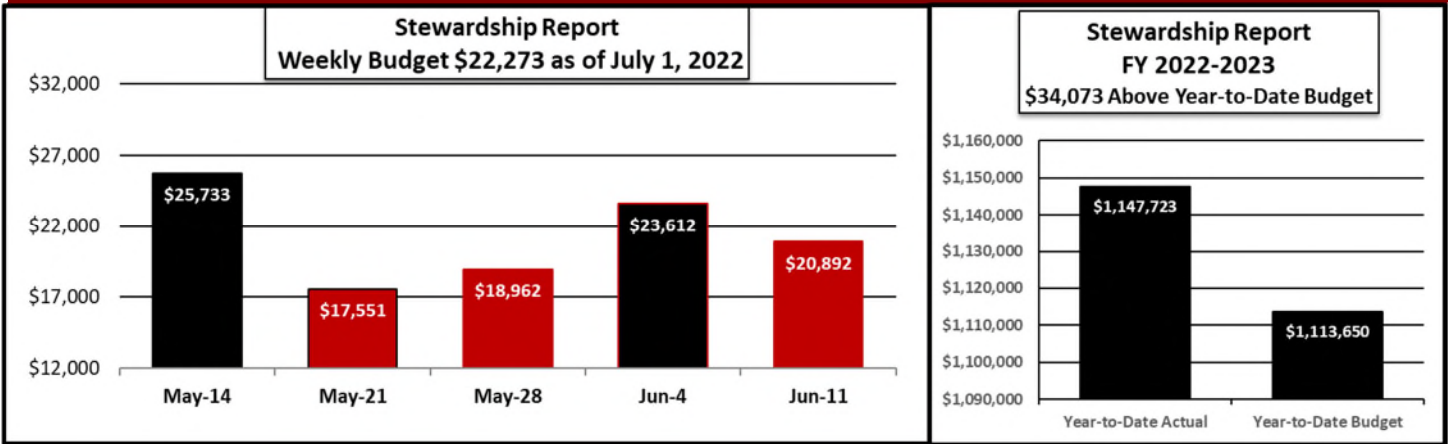
