Pastor's Note



"Jesus said to his disciples:

'Go into the world
and proclaim the gospel to every creature.'"

Mark 16:15

Dear Friends,

What does Jesus mean to you? How important is he in your life? How often do you talk about him to the people you care about?

I continue to learn that our children are hearing less and less about Jesus. They are growing completely disconnected or unaware the role Jesus plays in their lives. Our children are living this reality not because they are not interested in Jesus. To the contrary, they long for Jesus. They would like to know Jesus and to have Jesus as part of their lives. Since this is true, would you be willing to help them know Jesus?

On Friday, May 3rd, 2024, I was able to visit and spend some time with our 3rd Graders in our school. They wanted to know more about vocations to the priesthood and religious life. They were also interested in knowing what my daily life looks like at St. Cletus. I shared with them how Jesus spoke to me through my pastor in my home parish. It was he who invited me to consider becoming a priest. I told them that at the age of 22, encouraged by my pastor and family, I decided to go the seminary and become a priest. They were gracious in listening to my vocation story. Their questions were engaging. Time spent with them filled my heart with gratitude, peace, and the joy of Jesus.

Last weekend, May 4-5, 2024, 117 children from our school and Faith Formation Program received Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time as they celebrated their First Communion. Each of them had the opportunity to hear, learn, and grow in personal relationship with Jesus through the witness of their catechists, teachers, and parents. It is my prayer and hope that they will continue to have Jesus as part of their lives and to encourage others to do the same. I was inspired by their active and prayerful participation in Mass as we prayed together. It was truly a celebration of faith, love, and community.

I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge and thank our catechists, teachers, and parents for their commitment, sacrifice, and dedication to our children. In a special way, I would like to offer my sincere gratitude to Larry Manetti, Director of Faith Formation, for his steady leadership and witness. He has the gift to work well with our children, catechists, volunteers, and parents. Please join me in holding each of them in prayer.

As we celebrate Mother's Day, I gently encourage you to pause for a moment, and thank the Lord for your mother. Recall the moments when you felt loved, encouraged, and challenged by your mother. I learned about Jesus from my mother. She is the one who led me to Jesus with her child-like faith. May Jesus fill the hearts of our mothers with his

gentle love, kindness, and peace.

LOOK UP

There are many stories in the Bible that certainly are not believable to the naked eye. Take, for instance, today's Solemnity – The Ascension. Yes, I know. It was Thursday, right? What happened there? There are plenty of things that don't make a bit of human sense, even to believers. The Church adjusted so that more people could experience this amazing event in the life of Jesus and in the life of the Church. Truth be told, I had a difficult time with accepting that the Ascension was important enough to be a holy day of obligation. I mean, this is Jesus, right? You know – suffered, died, was buried, and rose from the dead. So His ascending to heaven in front of the Apostles should be pretty easy to accept, right?

On the other hand, it's still something no one had ever seen happen. There are probably conspiracy theorists who would want us to believe that Jesus was not the Son of God, but an alien who was beamed up. Trust me, I have heard it theorized. Bah! Jesus' ascension IS important! What did he say to us? Paraphrasing, "If I stay, the Holy Spirit would not be sent in my name. Remember, He will remind you of everything I ever said and did while I was with you."

Moms have a similar way, don't they? They remind us of everything we are or were supposed to do. I'm kidding!!! I think of the Wedding at Cana in St. John's gospel. "Son, they have no wine," Mary tells Jesus. Jesus' answer is one that some people in today's world might have found disrespectful to say to your mother "Woman, my hour has not yet come." She responds not to Jesus directly but to the wait staff "Do whatever He tells you." It's not that Mary was trying to make any trouble for Jesus, but she cares about the people at the gathering. She simply wants to be helpful, and has faith that what Jesus wants to do, He can. And that is in St. John's gospel. We don't even know the Blessed Mother's name, nor is there a story of how Jesus came to be. All we are told is what John says in that wonderful poetic prologue.

Still, back to the relationship between Jesus and Mary, like most priests I know, the relationship with our moms tends to be pretty solid, with very few exceptions. Sadly, there will be many of our priests' moms I will never have the chance to meet. The ones I have met are as dedicated to the Blessed Mother's love and devotion to Jesus and to being sure that their sons (us priests) are living the ministry we were called to do. Since my father died in 2009, my mom has become even more to me. We talk about anything and everything. She truly is one in a million women. She is generous to a fault and she loves meeting my priest friends. Like I won't get to meet all of their moms, they won't all get to meet my mom. I wish they could. She not only prays for me every day but for more solid young men to say "yes" to the Holy Spirit's prompting.



Mary, Mother of the Eucharist

As we celebrate Mother's Day, I'd like to note that arguably the most famous Eucharistic hymn of all time, *Ave Verum Corpus* (written in the 13th Century), underscores Jesus' mother's intimate connection to the sacrament of Christ's body and blood. If you aren't familiar with the hymn, I encourage you to seek it out (both the Byrd and Mozart compositions are classics, though I'm partial to Byrd's). An English translation of the Latin text is below:

Hail, true body born of the Virgin Mary,

You who truly suffered and were sacrificed

On the cross for the sake of man,

From whose pierced side flowed water and blood,

Be for us a foretaste in the trial of death.

O sweet, O merciful, O Jesus, Son of Mary.

Have mercy on me. Amen.

God enters our world in flesh through Mary's womb. When Mary gives her *fiat* to the angel Gabriel, she receives and bears the body of Christ for the world. For this reason, early Christians recognized Mary as the new Ark of the Covenant—the first tabernacle—carrying God's revelation in physical form.

At the consecration, the bread and wine become the body and blood of Christ, the *verum corpus* that Mary bore. It is not an overstatement to say she is the mother of God, the mother of the Eucharist, and our mother as members of the Body of Christ. As we receive the Eucharist, may we, like Mary, receive Christ willingly and ponder him in our hearts.

Sisters of St. Joseph Celebrating

125 Years

of Service and Presence in La Grange Park













The story of the Sisters of St. Joseph in La Grange Park began in 1899 with Mother Stanislaus Leary, and one year later, with Mother Alexine Gosselin who faced the daunting task of leading a new congregation whose financial resources totaled 33 cents. Under her leadership, the congregation grew and by 1912, there were 80 Sisters in the community.

Following WWI and WWII, the congregation prospered and began fulfilling an ever-growing number of requests from area parishes to staff their schools. By 1960, it is estimated

that Sisters had educated more than 14,000 elementary and high school students.

In 2007, the La Grange Park Sisters joined with six other communities of Sisters of St. Joseph to form one united community - The Congregation of St. Joseph.

Today, we continue to serve the community and the world through direct service, outreach, volunteerism, advocacy, prayer, collaboration, and partnerships.
