Dear Friends,

The Lord continues to bless and affirm our efforts as we grow in friendship with him and each other. It is in the intimacy of this friendship that he shares his life with us. He gives us strength, light, consolation, and meaning. This is something that he delights in doing and we know it from experience.

Aware of the joy, peace, and love that we receive from the Lord at our beautiful parish, I am happy to share with you some important updates.

First, I ask you to join me in welcoming Franco Foti as our new Operations Director (full-time). He started his new journey with us on August 14, 2023. He has been working for the Archdiocese of Chicago since 2010 in different capacities, such as Pastoral Associate, Director of Religious Education Program, Adjunct Instructor at Mundelein Seminary, and Operations Director. Franco holds a Bachelor of Arts in Business and Administration degree from the Salvador University, Argentina, Associate in Applied Science Degree – Computer Information Systems from Morton College, IL, Certificate of Pastoral Studies for Parish Studies for Parish Lay Ministers from the University of St. Mary of the Lake, Certificate of Studies in Hospital Ministries from Loyola University Medical Center, IL, and Master's Degree in Pastoral Studies from Catholic Theological Union, Chicago. Franco will be assisting me with the stewardship of the human, financial, and physical resources of the parish. I am grateful for the support, guidance, and recommendations that I received from the Operations Director Search Committee, Parish Finance Council, Parish Pastoral Council, Parish Staff, and the Archdiocese of Chicago in this effort. I am confident that with Franco's leadership and ministry, we will continue to find ways to grow as a parish community according to the will of the Lord. Please hold Franco in prayer.

Second, on Wednesday, August 9, 2023, I held our first Eucharistic Revival meeting in the Rectory. At the meeting, we prayed, shared our experience of the Eucharist, became aware of the National Eucharistic Revival led by the United States Catholic Bishops and the Archdiocese of Chicago. We also listened and shared with each other our desires to grow in knowledge of the Eucharist and to find ways to foster Eucharistic devotion at our parish. Following the recommendation of the Eucharistic Revival Committee of St. Cletus Parish, we will read together "This Is My Body," a book written by Bishop Robert Barron, hold our first Exposition and Benediction on October 4th, 2023, and host An Afternoon of Sharing of Holy Moments where we will share with each other the way the Lord spoke and engaged us as we read "This Is My Body." Books were purchased already, and the Committee anticipates distributing them the weekend of September 16-17, 2023. Please join me in keeping the members of the Committee in prayer.

Third, the current and New Altar Servers Formation went well. We were blessed to have over 15 children who faithfully attended the formation we offered as a parish. I was encouraged by their interest, energy, and willingness to learn in order to serve well at Mass. They received proper formation from Deacon Santos Gutierrez. It is my hope that with the assistance and service of well-formed Altar Servers our celebration of Mass will be more special, meaningful, and spiritual. I would like to offer my heartfelt gratitude to each and one of them as to their parents. Please hold them in prayer.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your ongoing prayer, support, and friendship. I want you to know how much I appreciate your trust and the love you have for St. Cletus parish, which is truly a special place. Thank you for inspiring me to serve and share my priesthood with you. I am enjoying it!

May the Lord continue to bless us as we grow in friendship with him and each other.

Note From Father Mike

"Revivaling"

Please don't be alarmed by the title of the article. I once had a friend who would make up his own words for various things. This is just the sort of example that he would have used.

I didn't hear Fr. Ron Kalas' homily this past weekend, but he told me that his main theme had to do with the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. It's a long way of saying that we as Catholics believe that ordinary bread and wine are truly changed at the consecration during Mass into Jesus' Body He chastens and hastens his will to make known and Blood. Now maybe you had the chance to hear Fr. Ron, and maybe you have had the fortune to read about some statistics as to whether or not Catholics really believe in this teaching. The sad answer to that question is that the percentage of those who don't believe is growing. In this crucial time of the Eucharistic Revival, that negative trend needs to change.

It's enough to know that there are less people who DO believe. What is worse for me is that there are less and less Catholics who say that our teachings on the importance of receiving the Eucharist really matters in the grand scheme for their salvation. And some people may think that it's only "young people" who don't believe or believe they Find the lost. need it.

One common phenomenon that is a contributing factor to most of these beliefs is individualism. Many people, even before COVID ravaged the society, were beginning to talk more and more about what THEY themselves believed about Jesus, the Eucharist, and the Church. This, unfortunately, was only made worse by the pandemic as we were put in situations of being at home instead of going to Church for Mass. For some people, Mass on TV became what they eventually "wanted" because if they chose to watch on TV, they didn't need to get dressed up or put on make-up. They were not as attentive to what was happening during Mass and would become distracted by phone calls or some sort of chore that they forgot to do. Mass just became less and less important for them – and I am talking about people who would normally have attended on Sundays. That is what scared me a bunch – listening to people I was trying to shepherd and had come to see regularly just stop coming to Mass and become "okay" with it.

"Spiritual communion is acceptable and sufficient. They would always say that prayer during the Mass from Holy Name Cathedral." While I heard that quite often from those who stopped coming to Church to worship, the reality is that the Church didn't have to give that dispensation and the spiritual communion prayer was created for this who DIDN'T have the capability to attend Mass, and that remains the case. It's not simply an "easy way out" from attending Sunday Mass, but that seems to be the way many people have been thinking, even after the Cardinal lifted

the dispensation from attending due to the pandemic. Sundays are still Sundays. Even if you didn't die by NOT attending, it is no less important. Maybe that is why we are struggling to build a sense of being a community. That's what I believe to be missing - a communal sense of the Eucharist. Jesus calls each of us individually, of course, but He calls us to gather. Some of you remember an older Church song called "We Gather Together." As a matter of fact, I think we've continued to use it periodically here at St. Cletus.

We gather together to ask the Lord's blessing


The wicked oppressing now cease from distressing

Sing praises to his name; he forgets not his own. (Gather, #697)

Maybe the Church herself has done a disservice too by teaching that through baptism we are united as brothers and sisters, but that isn't the same as having our bodies physically present to speak with one voice, sing with one voice, and partake of THE ONE meal.

You have made yourself known to us, O Lord. Blessed be your Most Holy Name. Blessed be God forever!



VOCATION PRAYER

Lord Jesus,

We beg you good and holy priests. In every age you call men to follow you as servants and shepherds of your people. Open their hearts to your call and give them the courage to follow you. Be their rock of refuge and their lights as they discern.




