

Pastor's Note

"Be joyful proclaimers of the Gospel," Pope Francis.

Dear Parishioners,

On Easter Monday (4/10) Pope Francis, as he led the recitation of the Regina Caeli prayer in St. Peter's Square, invited the pilgrims gathered to "be joyful proclaimers of the Gospel." Since then, I have been praying, reflecting, and asking others about Pope Francis' invitation, which resonates in my heart.

Trusting the work of the Spirit of the Risen Lord, Jesus Christ, I am happy to name some moments where I noticed how visitors and members of our parish community are joyful proclaimers of the Gospel.



First, year after year our parish is thrilled to pray and celebrate Easter Basket Blessing with love. Such joyful celebration took placed on Saturday, April 8, 2023, at 10:00 AM in church. Based on our experience from last year, we made the decision to expand our hospitality by having more ministers at the doors welcoming visitors and parishioners, setting up tables tastefully on which the baskets were placed, and praying/singing together with a liturgy carefully planned. It was such a joy seeing all journeying towards our church to have their Easter Baskets blessed. It was even more joyful when we sang and prayed together acknowledging the goodness of the Lord. I would like to thank everyone who helped with this amazing gathering and prayer that has a rich history.



"Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and proclaimed:

'You who are Jews, indeed all of you staying in Jerusalem. Let this be known to you, and listen to my words. You who are Israelites, **HEAR THESE WORDS**." (Acts 2:14)

The very next line (verse 15) has Peter proclaiming "These people are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning." ter and John have been boldly proclaiming the Gospel, but share your thoughts with them. I don't believe that any one they have not been alone in their efforts. Peter's affirmation of others in their boldness is priceless. If someone is teaching about Jesus or simply speaking about how He has touched their life, let them. Who knows, maybe you would be inspired to share how Jesus has been instrumental in your own life?

For many years, I have simply hoped to make my every move in line with Jesus' way of loving one another as He loves us. Obviously, there are times I fail in my everyday living, but my hope is to be on target. Last week, I must have done something right as I had at least 4-6 emails from "satisfied" disciples. I am not one who asks for praise, believe me. And to be honest, I get my share of criticism for things I might say or do or not do. It's not pleasant, but hopefully whatever criticisms I might receive turn into constructive opportunities I take to grow in my ministry.

That being said, I've just never been wanting to consciously and actively think about doing Jesus' work. Of course, I've run into situations that I absolute must take a step back to

closer look at just how the Holy Spirit leads me to act. However, I'd still rather rely on my instinct. Hopefully, that instinct is to serve. This past weekend was difficult for my soul. Yet, I know that the people of St. Cletus (as I have also seen in my past assignments) care about the health and well-being of myself and Fr. Elmer. 





MY NUNCOMMON LIFE BY PATRICIA A. SHEVLIN


As a local resident and a friend of St. Cletus Parish, I invite you to journey with me through my memoir, My NUNcommon Life.


