Fr. Marshall's Musings Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ

A month ago I had the opportunity to celebrate the First Communion Mass for some of our second graders from St. Cletus parish. In my position as University Chaplain I am not often able to be present at such a celebration. It was pure delight for me to be there, to see the enthusiasm and the joy in the children's faces as they prepared to receive the body and blood of Christ for the first time. It was exhilarating. I prayed for them that day that they may always have such enthusiasm for receiving the Holy Eucharist.

The following day, Sunday, we had asked the children to wear their First Communion outfits at Sunday Mass. I had the 9:30am Mass that day and I was somewhat disappointed because, at that Mass, only about 16 of the children were present. I wondered if maybe they had too many parties or too much going on. In reality I knew that many of them wouldn't be making their second Communion for awhile because their parents just don't go to Church and the children aren't old enough to go on their own. What a shame that is.

Today we celebrate the solemn feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. The Eucharist is the center of our Catholic belief. By literally taking the body and blood of Christ into us at Holy Communion, we become his body and his blood for the world. It nourishes us and strengthens us to face the challenges that life presents to us. The Holy Eucharist also makes us the body of Christ, the mystical body of Christ. So we have to go into the world and be Christ to others. We have to show the compassion, forgiveness, kindness, generosity and love that comes from the heart of Christ.

So it is a wonderful feast that we celebrate today because it talks about the centrality of our Catholic faith. Let's encourage others who don't come to Church regularly even in our own families, to come each weekend and join us around the table to receive the body and blood of Christ. The world desperately needs to be fed. The world desperately needs to be nourished and we as the Body of Christ have the ability to do that as we receive Holy Communion each weekend.

May we as the body and blood of Christ in this community as the Church of St. Cletus nourish one another and those that we come in contact with.
