Fr. Marshall's Musings
Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

After all the solemn feasts beginning at Easter and extending through last Sunday, the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, the Church now enters into ordinary time. Ordinary time is a time to continually reflect on our daily life and how we live as Christian people based on the Gospel of Jesus Christ. It gives us concrete suggestions of how to apply the Gospel to particular circumstances of our lives.

The Gospel that we hear today is a familiar one where the disciples are in a boat with Jesus. A storm comes up and they get very much afraid that something is going to happen to them. Jesus responds to them by saying words that I think could be comforting to all of us to calm the storm and that is, "Quiet, be still". Then he says to the disciples, "Have you no faith?"

So many times in our lives we allow anxiety and stress to overwhelm us and we become agitated to the point that we lose perspective on things. At moments like this it's important to remember those words of Jesus, "Quiet, be still". Hopefully, it will calm some of the storms and anxieties that our lives have.

These past months have been turbulent for us as a parish family. I hope now we can also apply these words to our parish community and trust that God will continue to direct and guide us in God's way and in His own time.

This is not an easy thing to do especially when we feel we are in the midst of the storm, but Jesus promises his presence among us and in that we must trust.

This is the last Sunday I'll be writing this column for the Canticle. Our new pastor, Fr. Bob Clark, arrives next weekend and will be preaching at all Masses on July 1 and 2. I'm sure that we as a parish family will welcome him with open arms in the hospitable style that St. Cletus has always been noted for. I have talked to Fr. Clark a number of times and I think that you will be very pleased with him. He is a solid, good, holy priest and I think his style will be exactly what we need for the coming months and years.

I thank those who have supported me during these months. Your prayers, letters and e-mails have been encouraging for me. I tried to do the best I could do under challenging circumstances and I need to take the words of the Gospel and keep reminding myself of them to be quiet and still.

Be assured of my continued prayers for you as a parish family and I ask that you keep me in your prayers. God bless you.
