FR. BOB'S MUTTEINGS

21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

We have been reading from the 6th chapter of John for the past several weeks and we conclude this week with the clear message that "unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you." This is a very strong message. We see this week's reading that many had difficulty in accepting this statement and no longer followed the way of Jesus. It comes down to all of us making a choice to believe or not to believe.

We have been challenged through these weeks to face our own faith in the Eucharist and the consequences of our faith. Have we come to accept that what we eat and drink is more than mere symbol? Have we come to accept and have faith in the miracle of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the form of bread and wine?

As some of his followers bail out, Jesus asks Peter if he and the others are going to leave also. Peter's answer is "Master, to whom shall we go?" Peter and the disciples understood little else than Jesus was the one sent from God, and that eternal life was not available to them through any other person or means. They were coming to faith. Through the Eucharist we come to faith and trust which are essential elements of our understanding and growth as followers of Jesus Christ.

"Decide today whom you will serve"

There comes a time when talk must turn to action, when words must move into works, when dialog must become deed. As far as Jesus is concerned, that time has come. It is time to stop talking and start walking.

For the past three Sundays, Jesus has been talking about the bread of life: God's bread that comes down from heaven and gives life to the world; the bread that is Jesus' own flesh for the life of the world; the living bread that enables anyone who feeds on it to live forever. Jesus has said everything he could say to explain what he means: the bread of life and anyone who eats this bread will live forever.

Now it is our turn. What are we to do with that kind of talk? Accept it or reject it? Belittle it or believe it? Let it shake our faith or strengthen our belief? Complain or proclaim? Murmur or mediate? Take it or leave it? We have to decide. About this, we cannot be noncommittal or neutral.

Jesus does not force us to follow him, believe him, love him. He offers us the same option he offered the disciples: "Do you also want to leave?" Jesus has not formed a chain gang but a community of free people whose motto is written in today's reading from Joshua: "Far be it from us to forsake the Lord for the service of other gods."

Peter speaks for all of us when he asks, "Master, to whom shall we go?" Is there anyone else who talks so clearly, so powerfully, so lovingly? Is there anyone else who acts so calmly, so decisively, so compassionately? Is there anyone else who could give us more than Jesus has given us? Who else has both the words of life and the bread of life to nourish us with? It looks as though it's either Jesus or nobody. So let's keep walking and let's be ever mindful of the gift we have been given and are called to share in our journey together.


