FATHER BOB'S MUTTERINGS

23rd Sunday of Ordinary Time Mark 7: 31-37

Mark's gospel today shows us the significance of Jesus bringing his message to all. He even ventures to different places than his own home territory. We find him interacting with Gentiles and making connections with different peoples and places as he spreads the good news.

We live in a time where many Catholics do not experience the same connection between home and church that existed several generations ago. Perhaps the statistic that shows the weak connection between Catholics and church as a gather place is this: about 35% of Roman Catholics participate in Sunday worship on a regular basis. Clearly, most Catholics do not want connections with a place of worship or with the people that go there. Separating ourselves from the Eucharist only makes this separation grow larger. We have a problem here that needs our attention and prayers. We Catholics must strengthen and deepen our commitment to community, the community of the parish. We are called to be a family of faith, not a string of strangers.


