

# The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ

Kings and kingdoms may be outside the usual experience for most of us, but victory surely isn't. We are a society of competitors. Sometimes the competition gets so fierce that we are willing to win at all costs — even by cheating, hurting another, or seeking personal glory at the expense of the of the good of all. Jesus is a gentle competitor. He came, called

followers, forgave, healed, drove out demons, preached, taught, and confronted his enemies. In all this, it was gradually revealed who he truly is and then, he went gently and willingly to his death. His victory, that we celebrate this Sunday, isn't one of armies or raw power. His victory didn't win him a quickly forgotten medal or quickly spent bonus; his victory won him the crown of eternal glory.

On this last Sunday of the liturgical year, we clearly see that Jesus' kingdom is not of this world. His kingdom is not a special place in this world, but an interior identity defined by our relationship to Christ the King. We celebrate Christ as worthy of our worship because he has been the "faithful witness" who "freed us from our sins by his blood." He persevered through our misunderstanding and our sometimes blank stare. He trusted us enough to send us out on his very mission. And he died for us.

This solemnity invites us to renew our commitment to serve Jesus with all our hearts. It invites us to recommit ourselves as self-giving disciples and to remember that we are God's kingdom already. To-day, we are once again called to fall in love with our King, that gentle competitor, who won eternal life for us. And, today, we are reminded that God's reign includes people like Pilate and people like ourselves. Power and kingship speak to us. They are present whenever anyone is willing to stand in witness — as Jesus stood — for the truth that God is not only above all, but in all.

If someone should ask us, as Pilate asked Jesus, "What have you done?" would our answer come quickly and surely — "We have served our King"?




