



NOTES FROM FATHER BOB...

SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 2010

Anthony De Mello in one of his many inspiring books gives us a parable of life to ponder. A group of tourists sit in a bus that is passing through beautiful country-side: lakes, mountains, green-fields and rivers. However, the shades of the bus are pulled down. So, the tourists do not have the slightest idea of what lies beyond the windows of the bus. Meanwhile, their journey is spent squabbling over who is the best dressed, who will have the seat of honor in the bus, who will be applauded, who will be well considered and so they remain till the journey's end. De Mello concludes that we often look for happiness in the wrong places.

Jesus in the Sermon on the Plain gives us a guide to inner happiness. However, we should be warned. The people whom Jesus calls happy, the world calls wretched, and the people whom Jesus calls wretched, the world would call happy. Once again, Jesus, in his preaching about the Kingdom of God, turns everything upside-down. Luke uses the Greek word, MAKARIOS, for happy or blessed. MAKARIOS in Greek often means inner happiness. How do we discover this treasure of inner happiness? Quite simply, by following the life and teaching of Jesus.

Jesus has come to preach to the poor, the prisoners, the blind and the downtrodden of his day. Jesus challenges his listeners to do the same: be humble, show mercy, be open to those in need. Jesus says something like this: "do this, and not only will you be close to God but also you will experience inner happiness, inner contentment." But what practical steps should we follow in order to find this happiness. Firstly, Jesus is able to carry out his demanding vocation because his whole life and work is rooted in his relationship with God the Father. Jesus has come from the Father, he is doing the work of the Father, he is returning to the Father. The primary and most important relationship or friendship in the life of Jesus is his intimacy with God his Father. And so, Jesus is advocating a God-oriented existence for each one of us. Secondly, Jesus effectively says: "forget about yourself and concentrate on loving and helping others. If you spend your life trying to bring other people happiness and joy, then you cannot fail to bring happiness and joy to yourself."

The Christian vocation can only be lived fully if we have a strong, vibrant, living relationship with Jesus. We need to keep listening to Jesus, we need to keep talking with Jesus. On our own we will not be able to cope with the challenges of being a Christian. Christianity is hard and it can only be tried in the company of Jesus.

We must have a relationship with Jesus in order to be faithful to our Christian vocation. In the tissue of relationships that make up our lives, we need to give priority to our relationship with Jesus. Therefore, prayer is not an option for the Christian, it is a necessity. The second step to inner happiness emphasizes that love of others must dominate the life of a Christian. We need to try and forget about ourselves and throw all our energies into loving and caring for others. It is the challenge, the journey of a life-time. If we set our hearts on loving and caring for our families, our friends, for those in need, we will experience a deep, profound joy, an inner happiness. There is the old story about a Christian missionary tending the dreadful sores of a leper. A visitor to the colony watched this act of healing and then remarked: "I wouldn't do that for a million dollars!" And the missionary looked up and said: "Neither would I!" The fulfillment we receive in reaching out to others in love, care and compassion cannot be measured in material or monetary value. If we stay close to Jesus and try to love and help others then we shall experience the inner happiness that money simply cannot buy.

TURN AWAY FROM SIN AND BE FAITHFUL TO THE GOSPEL

With these words we enter into the holy season of Lent; a season marked by two themes: the baptismal and the penitential. "By recalling or preparing for baptism and by repentance, this season disposes the faithful...to celebrate the paschal mystery" (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy). This paschal mystery is about a God who loves us so much, he sent his Son to take on the nature of a human being who freely gave up his life, so we would know we are holy, loved, and saved. We need these 40 days to contemplate this mystery and to become fully reconciled before we can truly experience the joy of Easter.

We fast and abstain to stand in solidarity with God's poor. We feel the pinch of hunger and the craving for extra food. We give the money we save from these simple Ash Wednesday and Lenten Friday meals to the poor. This money is called "alms".

We pray more in Lent. Our responsibility as the baptized is to pray for the needs of the world. We pray for our loved ones, our enemies, for peace in troubled places, and for our own souls. We pray for murderers and deviants and for all who have been or are being exploited. We pray for the rich and the poor.

Our fasting should also include, fasting from those behaviors, habits, and attitudes that fill up our lives and draw us away from building loving relationships with God and one another. Good choices for our Lenten practices are those that really change us – beyond the days of Lent.

The practices of Lent we undertake "in secret" must draw us beyond ourselves to the quality of life within the community – both the community of the church and the community of the world and in so doing –" … be faithful to the gospel".

Through Christ's presence in the Eucharist, we are connected with our brothers and sisters around the world. During this season of Lent our parish will explore this connection through our participation in Operation Rice Bowl.

We are invited to:

- Pray together
- Fast in solidarity with those who are hungry
- Learn about the joys and challenges in the lives of our brothers and sisters around the world
- Give sacrificial contributions to support those in need

Please take a Rice Bowl to place on your kitchen table and Lenten calendar to enhance your Lenten observances at home.

Let us pray:

God of all people, Hear us as we join in prayer with our brothers and sisters in need.

Bless our Lenten fasting, learning, and giving.

May your generous love for your people be our guide

As we reach out to all who live with hunger and poverty. Amen.

ASH WEDNESDAY

Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving: these disciplines, prescribed by Jesus himself in the Sermon on the Mount, along with strict instructions not to flaunt them in public to win recognition and praise (Matthew 6:1-18), have been embraced by all the saints at the beginning of every Lent for almost two thousand years. But mention Lent, and many react with a grimace or slight shudder—even now, years after official obligations have been reduced to a minimum! Rite's "Lenten No wonder the Eastern Announcement" sounds surprising: "Let us receive with joy, O faithful people, the divinely inspired announcement of Lent! The Lenten Spring shines forth! Begin the fast with joy! Let us fast from passions as well as food, taking pleasure in the good works of the Spirit, and accomplishing them in love!" Saint John Chrysostom, whose feast is September 13, elaborates: "Do you fast? Give proof by your works. If you see a poor person, take pity. An enemy, be reconciled. A friend gaining honor, don't be jealous." A positive approach! May the saints help us keep such a Lent!

<u>Abstinence</u> from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14-years-old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent.

<u>Fasting</u> is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by all this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted, if necessary, to maintain strength according to ones needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.


