



NOTES FROM FATHER BOB...

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

The native tribes of South America make a point of marking different events in a person's life in dramatic fashion. In a time- honored tradition, their young men are initiated into the tribe in a private ceremony. They will eventually receive honorable status in their society, but not before they endure differing rituals designed to test their strength and, perhaps, to humble them a little. Somehow, these rites of passage for different occasions help the men become loving, caring husbands and tribesmen. These societies have no doubt learned that the only way humanity moves forward is when it has the courage to face its weakness and fears.

Like Matthew and Luke, Mark shows Jesus going through a time of testing. Each account, in a different way, tells us that Jesus has to endure his strengthening, his initiation, before he can preach his message of salvation. The spirit that leads him to the wilderness is the same spirit that will tell him he is a beloved son. His preparation to do the will of the Father will not be complete, until he spends those hungry days alone with his thoughts, finding out who he is.

To the people of the day, the wilderness of the desert was a lonely place, cut off from the support of one's family. How could one survive this experience, vulnerable and exposed to danger? In fact, Jesus is facing those demons that we all must face at some time in our lives: the terrible vulnerability of aloneness, and the inevitability of death. His days alone were a foretaste of the cross to come. Of course, we know that this testing leads to freedom and through the cross, to redemption. Since we are baptized into Christ, we too can overcome the obstacles that may confront us. We can rest safely in the knowledge that Christ has overcome even death itself.

Perhaps like Noah, we cannot fully understand what real freedom looks like, until we experience vulnerability. As the early Christian mystics say, we cannot understand the language of the cross, until we have faced darkness in our own lives. To be a builder of the kingdom means being a person of compassion; we cannot be that person without suffering. Life brings with it many forms of testing. For some it may be an embittering experience, leaving them cold and closed. For us, as people of the promise, it can be a turning point, a cleansing experience, which leads us to growth and openness. This freedom can only come about if we, like Jesus, remember that we are beloved by the Father, who is with us at every stage of our journey. Like Jesus, we are accompanied by a Father who is intimately involved in our joys and our moments of weakness.

In this time of Lent, the Church asks us to spend time looking within ourselves. During the coming weeks, we are to confront our fears and temptations, in order to enter into a fuller relationship with Christ. The Gospel reminds us that the Father, who strengthens his son in the desert, is the same God who renews the promises to an unfaithful people and is bound with them forever. This is the good news we all need to hear, and are all called to share.

What does this good news look like? Well, we know it transforms people; it makes them turn around, repent, and start again. It gives hope; it drives away fear; it promotes true peace; it is concerned about others; it builds up what is good, and destroys what is evil. When we begin to see this work of God in our lives, when we respond anew, we will find life: life in all its fullness.

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT- Follow the rainbow

The rare and beautiful event of a rainbow usually lasts only a short while, but its colors and soaring form make a lasting impression. It follows storms as if to show the incredible beauty and peace of creation after a demonstration of its awesome power. In Hebrew scripture the rainbow symbolizes God's promise to Noah never to destroy the earth and all its creatures again with water, but just as important it was a sign of the wonderful re-creation of the world after the destruction of the biblical Flood. The season of Lent offers a unique opportunity to make a course correction on the path toward God. The goal is clear: the new life of Easter, fixed before your eyes like a glorious rainbow.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 27

LENTEN WEEKDAY-The least we can do

The vivid biblical descriptions of the Last or Final Judgment are designed to impress upon us the importance of taking our obligations to the less fortunate very seriously indeed. "But where to begin?" you might ask. The Corporal Works of Mercy are a pretty good place. If we each do our part, we can hope for the day when there will be no more hungry to feed, homeless to shelter, prisoners to visit, and the like. Then we can welcome that Final Judgment with confidence. But let's get started today—after all, none of us knows the day or the hour.

TODAY'S READINGS: Leviticus 19:1-2, 11-18; Matthew 25:31-46 (224)

"Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me."

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 28

LENTEN WEEKDAY—Listen with your heart

One of the cornerstones of Lent is prayer, something we often consider *our* job: talking to God, pouring out our hearts, asking for what we need. It is all that, but more. If we compare prayer to the living intimacy between people who love each other, we will see clearly that if their conversation is one-sided, if they do not let the other speak, if they do not listen with the same intensity with which the other pours out their needs, then something is wrong. Someone put it this way: *Show up. Shut up. Pay attention.* Crude, but true. To spruce up one's spiritual life is to consider how one prays. Is there room in my time with God just to be? Must I always be talking or reading or planning? Can I simply wait? Listen?

TODAY'S READINGS: Isaiah 55:10-11; Matthew 6:7-15 (225) "My word . . . shall not return to me void."

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 29

LENTEN WEEKDAY—Take a leap this year

Pope Gregory XIII established the calendar we use to count our days, weeks, and years in 1582—and there have been calls for its reform more or less continuously ever since. There are differences in the details, but in general the reform advocates say every month should have the same number of days and every date should fall on the same day of the week. These appeals for a new ordering of days always fail, partly because humans resist change and partly because an unchang-

ing calendar seems a little too rigid, a little too perfect. Logic and perfection have their place, to be sure. But so do flexibility and imperfection. February 29 is a good date to celebrate the latter.

TODAY'S READINGS: Jonah 3:1-10; Luke 11:29-32 "There is something greater than Solomon here."

THURSDAY, MARCH 1

LENTEN WEEKDAY- Persistence pays off

The story of Queen Esther told in the Bible book that bears her name is a fascinating novella filled with subterfuge and intrigue. Esther uses her wit and wiles to get what she wants from the king, but her master-stroke is to use prayer and petition to get what she needs from God: namely a plan for deliverance for herself and her people. As we begin our Lenten journey, our first step should be to ask God to help us chart our course. Then, like Esther, we must fast, pray, and wait, and soon God's plan for us will be revealed.

TODAY'S READINGS: Esther C 12, 14-16, 23-25; Matthew 7: 7-12 (227) "Turn our mourning into gladness and our sorrows into wholeness."

FRIDAY, MARCH 2

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER; DAY OF ABSTINENCE Out of the depths I cry to you

For some, prayer seems like a natural talent. For others, pulling teeth is easier! But for all, prayer is a necessary component of the life of faith. We seek a vital relationship with our Maker, and no relationship is complete without deep and meaningful communication. God begins the conversation with the words of scripture. You add your part in interceding for needs, offering thanks for gifts received, and singing praise for a world of wonders. As you abstain from meat on this global day of prayer, recommit yourself to the ways of fairness in family, work, civic, and international relationships.

TODAY'S READINGS: Ezekiel 18:21-28; Matthew 5:20-26 (228)
"Hear now, house of Israel: Is it my way that is unfair, or rather, are not your ways unfair?"

SATURDAY, MARCH 3

FEAST OF KATHARINE DREXEL, VIRGIN—Share your gifts

When you think about Catholic stewardship, does your mind go to collection envelopes and fundraising appeals? While certainly that is part of what it means, stewardship goes far beyond financial contributions. The U.S. Catholic Bishops wrote that stewardship is a call to receive God's gifts gratefully, cultivate them responsibly, share them lovingly with others, and return them with increase to God (*Stewardship: A Disciple's Response*). We see examples of such stewardship in the church through people like Saint Katharine Drexel. She made good use of her education and financial resources, and she also made it her life's work to help people in need, an effort that continues through the religious community she founded, the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament. How can you create a legacy of stewardship?

And so we were marked with the cross of ashes as we continue to "return to the Lord with our whole heart". That is our Lenten challenge. Through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, we are invited once again to renew our relationship with God and one another – to live as Jesus did.

Each week of Lent we are invited to set aside time with those in our household to:

- Gather at the table
- To pray together
- Share a simple meal
- Reflect on our actions as being loving
- To celebrate the Eucharist
- To remember others during our Almsgiving

Throughout these forty days of Lent, we have committed ourselves to embracing the challenge of following Jesus. We are offering some suggestions of how we might enter into this holy season.

PRAYER

- Make a prayer space in your home: a small table or space for a Bible, a crucifix, prayer cards, a statue and candle.
- Pray the daily or Sunday Scripture readings (listed in the Canticle).
- Take turns praying the grace before meals (traditional or create one of your own). Pray for those who are hungry.
- Start a Lenten journal. Share your thoughts, concerns, hopes and fears with the Lord. Write your own unfiltered thoughts.

FASTING

- Keep one evening meal a week simple: soup and bread, a meatless dish.
 Talk about the millions of hungry people who go without supper every day.
 Donate the food or money you would have spent to our own food pantry (in the vestibule).
- Avoid impulse buying on non-essential things (toys, candy, pop).
- Fast from gossiping, unkind speech, judgmental or critical comments.
- Fast from your normal routine one day each week. Choose to do something for someone else or use as quiet time for yourself.

ALMSGIVING

- Set aside the money you spend on yourself in one week. Put it in the Taller de Jose container that will help a family become self-supporting.
- Ask your parents if you can help with a chore without being asked.
- Spend time with someone (in the family or outside) who needs a good listener.
- Do one act of kindness without seeking reward or recognition.
