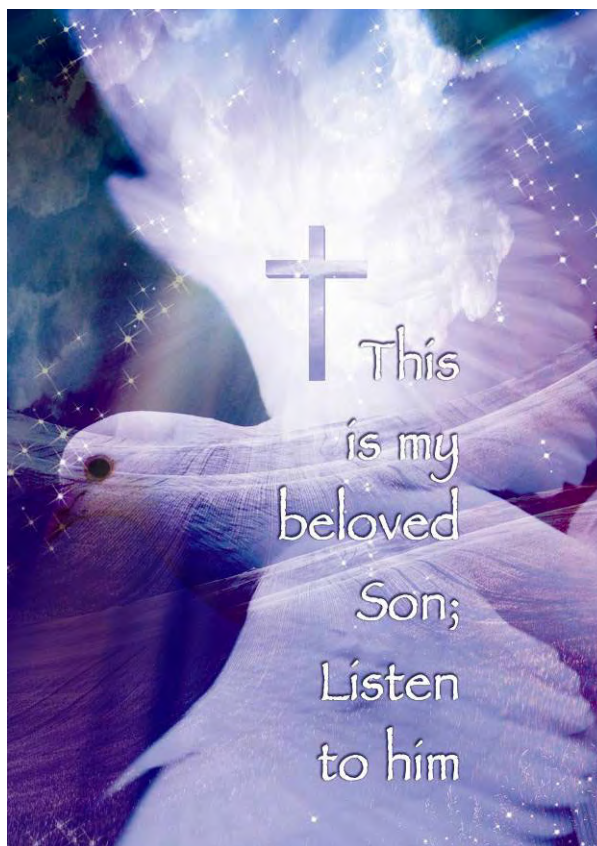

NOTES FROM FATHER BOB...

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Many examples are used to express the relationship of Christ with his people. One particularly powerful example can be used with younger children. A teacher holds aloft a box containing various articles, and tells the students that 'Inside this box is the best thing God ever made.' This should get the attention of the children. Then the teacher teases the class by emptying the box of its cargo: a chocolate bar, a music CD, the logo from the Chicago Bears, and a cell phone. As these are produced, the teacher asks if these are the best things God has made. The class is not sure. A child is then invited forward to look into the box, now empty except for a mirror at the base. The teacher reminds the class that in the box is the most beautiful thing God has made. Of course, when the child looks inside, all he/she sees is his/her reflection. Then this is shown to the class, who receives the message that we are each special, beloved by the Lord, and the best thing he ever made.

Children are usually able to accept this basic fact more easily than their parents. Hopefully, they will still be young enough to have not been told otherwise too often. Hopefully, they have not found themselves too hurt, and therefore tempted to close in on themselves. It is less likely that they will have failed too badly, or lost a relationship, and found themselves feeling worthless inside. By contrast, if you were to ask most of us adults to look into the mirror to see a wonderful creation of the Lord, would we readily believe it?

As Jesus begins his public ministry, he is comforted by a voice of assurance, a voice of love, which tells him he is beloved by his Father. This is a moment of truth, a moment of transfiguration. This gives Jesus the strength he needs to continue a journey that will lead to the cross. In our own lives, too, we need to know the love God has for us. We need to be reminded that we have been created by him and chosen in love.

Today the apostles see the glory of our Lord. They want to remain in this beautiful place. It is Peter who speaks up; "Let us stay here, I will set up camp." The impetuous apostle does not realize the significance of the moment. Just as Abraham imagined that the Lord would take his son, Peter imagines that they had already reached the end of their journey. Jesus has been acknowledged as the chosen one of God, not just in their presence, but also in the presence of history, in the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets. His next 'transfiguration' will wait until Gethsemane, the cross and finally the risen glory of Easter morning.

As we continue our pilgrimage through Lent, we look within ourselves for the strength we need to follow the way of the cross. We need a reminder of God's love in our moments of doubt. Sometimes we lose the ones we love; sometimes we find ourselves lost, unsure of our next move in life. If our God loves us, why do these things happen to us? There are no easy answers to such questions. Yet, we know that God has given us the ultimate gift; he has given his Son that we might be free. Could it be that in facing dark times, with God on our side, we become more whole? We have the choice to be alone and embittered, or to walk with him and hear that voice of encouragement... the voice that transfigures, calls us to be more than we are already...the voice that calls us his beloved.

Each of us has the capability of building others up, of showing them the love of Christ by our actions and our lives. Thank God we do not struggle alone. Like Christ, we each have moments of transformation along the way of faith that leads us to Easter. Those defining moments may be fleeting, but they point to the Father's presence with us. They may be an embrace, a wedding day or the birth of a new baby: high-points in our lives, confirming us, just as Christ is confirmed in the presence of Moses and Elijah, the Lawgiver and the Prophet.

Transformation is more than one moment. Christ's transfiguration is the start of a long journey of endurance towards another hill and a more painful spectacle that leads to our freedom. Peter hopes the moment will last, but as we know, such moments never do. Yet our little moments of transfiguration, instances when we are shown love, acceptance, and encouragement by others, are moments when we are given strength to journey on, like Jesus, to the moment of Redemption. They echo the voice of a God who says to each of us, "you are my chosen ones."

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT - Be-loved, and loving

One of the deepest human spiritual longings is to know ourselves as the beloved of God. Maya Angelou, in her memoir *Wouldn't Take Nothing for My Journey Now*, recalls being asked by her teacher to read a section from a book that ended with the words, "God loves me." He instructed her to say the passage again and again. Eventually it dawned on her there might be truth in those words. She writes: "I suddenly began to cry at the grandness of it all. I knew that if God loved me, then I could do wonderful things. I could try great things, learn anything, achieve anything." This Lent know that God loves you, and ask God to use you to help another know that he or she is beloved.

MONDAY, MARCH 5

LENTEN WEEKDAY - Let's give it up for Lent

If you grew up Catholic, you probably heard the question (perhaps more often than you would have liked!): "What are you giving up for Lent?" Often enough it was about forgoing goodies such as chocolate or your favorite television show. Good enough as far as it goes, if it taught you something about healthy self-denial. But there is another, more interior way to give things up for Lent—things such as the judgmental comments that come from a secret sense of superiority or the condemning attitude that is nothing more than self-righteousness dressed up in sharp clothes. The real action in the spiritual life, we learn as we age, is interior. So: what will you give up this Lent?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Daniel 9:4b-10; Luke 6:36-38 (230)*

"The measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you."

TUESDAY, MARCH 6

LENTEN WEEKDAY - That's the reality of the situation

Every so often a Milwaukee mother of five teens was in the habit of having what she called a "reality check." She and her husband would get everyone together to make plain the rules of the house and their expectations of mutual family responsibility and respect. She joked about it with friends, but those frank and honest meetings succeeded in keeping the family healthy as the children all grew to become mature and happy adults with children of their own. It's a way of looking at Lent: Reality-therapy in which you stand back and assess how it is between you and God, not by your own standards but by God's.

"Cease doing evil; learn to do good."

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 7

FEAST OF PERPETUA AND FELICITY, MARTYRS - Give it your all

The Passion of Saints Perpetua and Felicitas is an early Christian document that records the martyrdom of four catechumens—Perpetua, Felicitas, Saturninus, and Revocatus—and their catechist, Saturus, Perpetua's brother. Although Christians were heavily persecuted in the third century, these young people were so compelled by the life and message of Jesus that they were willing to face torture and death to be part of the Christian community. The process for most catechumens today is not as dangerous, yet still there remains a profound sense of giving one's life to God and being willing to give one's life for others. Let us pray for catechumens who this Lenten season are being immersed in the mystery of our faith. May they and their catechists have

the spirit, courage, and peace of these martyrs.

THURSDAY, MARCH 8

FEAST OF JOHN OF GOD, RELIGIOUS

Do something spontaneous for God

Even before making a total commitment to serving the sick and the poor, it was clear that the 16th-century Portuguese Saint John of God was a compassionate person who wanted to serve others, even though his early life was a bit colorful—he left home at 9 to become a shepherd and then a soldier. After the army he went on a trip to Africa intending to ransom Christian hostages from Muslim captivity, came to the aid of a grieving family at the docks who had been exiled from Portugal, and became a traveling religious goods salesman so that more people could have access to spiritual books and images. Such an impetuous desire to help others could have come only from utter trust in God. It's an impulse you, too, can follow.

FRIDAY, MARCH 9

FEAST OF FRANCES OF ROME, RELIGIOUS; DAY OF ABSTINENCE

How do you encourage others?

Recent studies of families suggest that parents have favorites among their children. It's hard not to take special delight in the accomplished daughter, the charming son, the child who's remarkably trouble-free to bring up. Yet good parents know that tucking these biases away is important because the struggling child needs encouragement and support even more than the darling. In a biblical story Jacob wasn't good at hiding his preference for Joseph, to the predictable outrage of his brothers. Today as we abstain from meat we might resolve to offer extra encouragement to those who need it—and "fast" from the impulse to favor or disfavor.

SATURDAY, MARCH 10

LENTEN WEEKDAY-Tolerate the truth

Today marks the feast of Saint John Ogilvie, a Jesuit priest executed for practicing Catholicism in Glasgow in 1560. John used scripture to preach tolerance. During Lent we not only prepare for the Resurrection of the Lord but also work on being more accepting and respectful toward each other. John believed that the Catholic Church embraced all people and that is why he preached the gospel, even though it got him killed. As we continue to grow this Lent, let us work on being more tolerant and, as John said, "Come to the knowledge of the truth."

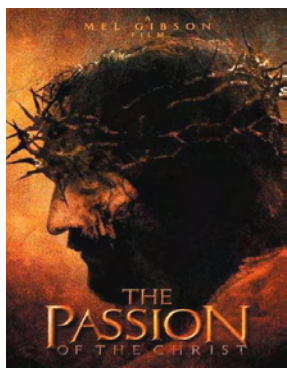
LENTEN ALMSGIVING TALLER DE JOSÉ

In today's first reading, Abraham responds faithfully to God, and God bestows blessings on him and all of his descendents. During Lent, we are called to listen to God's voice in our lives and respond in faith. In this week's story (below) we meet Marco, a man struggling with debt, and see how he experienced a faithful response to his needs, as the "Companions" of Taller de José listened to God's voice.

MARCO'S STORY

Marco came to Taller de José in January 2009 seeking assistance with his financial situation. He had severe credit card debt and did not understand the first thing about getting rid of it. Due to this debt, his paychecks were being garnished. He had tried to file for bankruptcy a year before, but the legal firm he went to was charging him thousands of dollars for court, filing, and attorney fees. We accompanied Marco through phone calls to low-cost legal services to set up appointments to discuss his case. We walked with him to court to file appearances and sat with him in court. Taller de José also connected Marco with an organization that would help him manage his credit card debt and his finances so that in the future this would not happen. Marco's fear of living with this debt and fear of the legal system was put at ease with Taller de José. He thanks Taller de José very much because "they don't ask for money, their first priority is to help people and they do it out of the kindness of their hearts." Marco has learned a lot from this experience and from the staff at Taller de José as today he manages his money much better.

This week we **pray** that we may recognize the inherent dignity in all of God's people, and we **fast** so that our sacrifices may bring new life to others. We **give** so that Taller de José, through our generous support, can continue to listen and walk with those in need, connecting people to services and services to people. We invite you to pray daily the Lenten Prayer of Peace and Justice, found in your Taller de José almsgiving container, to meditate on the Lenten Reflection, and to further educate yourself on the Principles of Catholic Social Teaching... all found in your Taller de José almsgiving container. If you do not already have a container, they are available in the church vestibule. MY LIFE'S JOURNEY OF FAITH – STUART HEYES, DEACON CANDIDATE

Aspirancy – An academic year in which Marlene and I attend all-day classes twice a month and evening classes once a month. These classes covered theology, cultural diversity, the Sacraments, family/marriage, spirituality, Church history and ministry in its many forms.

After each class a reflection paper was required from both of us (this requirement was dropped for the following year in light of our class feedback), to say Marlene was less than enthusiastic about this particular aspect of aspirancy would be to understate her actual feelings and comments!!

We had various evaluations to complete: Marriage compatibility (we thought “Are they kidding?” we’d been in love, totally committed to each other and married for 36 years at the time.)

Personality tests – for those familiar with Meyers-Briggs and who know us you’ll not be surprised to learn that I was an extrovert and Marlene the opposite. *If Marlene were to do the evaluation today I think the outcome might well be different given how she’s positively blossomed as we have taken this diaconate journey together!!*

So much for the academics, the program also included a retreat led by Fr. John Canary, (Vicar General of the Archdiocese and now Monsignor) up at USML, Mundelein. What an experience, our first ever retreat and we were so blessed to have Msgr. Canary as our Retreat Master. The experience was powerful, moving and very encouraging in our spiritual journey and as I wrote at the time we both realized that the graces God bestowed on Marlene and I needed to be used in His service.

As part of our cultural diversity training we attended three very different masses:

A Spanish Mass @ Most Blessed Trinity, Waukegan was both reverent and entertaining, with excellent musicians and choir.

A Polish Mass@ St. John Brebeuf, Niles was deeply reverent – no talking before mass, no leaving early, (**please note**) and almost all received the Eucharist on the tongue. The Polish communities are less familiar with the role of Deacons than most, indeed at the time Poland had only two deacons total!

An African American Mass @ Holy Angels, Oakwood Blvd., Chicago was loud, energetic, spiritual and entertaining and while it lasted well over two hours, such was the joyful atmosphere it just didn’t seem like it. The homily by Dcn Leroy Gill was just outstanding - “Jesus, Jesus” unforgettable.

Great experiences and we were warmly welcomed (and fed) by all.
