NOTES FROM FATHER BOB...

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Stephen Wiltshire became famous when he was just a young boy. Born to West Indian parents, who had immigrated to England, he had lost his father, could barely read or write, but was discovered to have an extraordinary gift for drawing buildings and townscapes.

His art teacher, Chris Marris first, and then the literary agent, Margaret Hewson, supported and encouraged him in his special talent. He, himself, was passive about his ability; he just drew- but at a highly technical level, even when he was very young. Margaret took him on drawing trips, first all around London and then to Venice, Amsterdam, Russia and the United States. Stephen responded immediately to these new sights; Margaret attained commissions and sponsorships for him, arranged and financed exhibitions, and helped him to produce his two best sellers "Floating Cities" and "Stephen Wiltshire's American Dream." She also found him a place at art school and established a trust fund to provide for his future. Her own exuberance and energetic personality seemed to inspire Stephen, as though his creativity took life from what Dr. Oliver Sacks, who accompanied them on some of their journeys, called "the exhilaraty, whirlwind atmosphere Margaret seemed to create all around her". Without such support, it is doubtful that Stephen would have fully developed his gifts or have become known to the wider world.

We live in a limited and conditional world, whereas God inhabits an unlimited and unconditional world. We are asked to accept that we can share this much more wondrous world of God, despite being dead through our sins. Such a leap can only be brought about through faith, the belief that God is so generous with his mercy that the gap can be bridged between the two worlds. The grace that is offered to us through the death and resurrection of Jesus lifts us up out of sin and failure and gives us a place in heaven with him. It also restores us to the possibility of living the good life we were always intended to live. The letter to the Ephesians explores how the mystery of salvation is made available to all. There is a profound conviction that Christ is the Lord of the whole of creation and that he gathers all into his saving death and resurrection. We become again, what we were meant to be at the world's beginning, God's work of art; made in God's image and likeness, in turn we also become artists. We can neither fully appreciate nor practice our calling without being constantly in touch with the brush of the painter, the poet's pen, namely the presence of God, which we celebrate in word and sacrament. If the Temple was the symbol of God's presence among his people in the Old Testament, we are now the new temple, the house where God lives in the Spirit, with Christ Jesus himself as the main cornerstone.

People sometimes struggle with life problems, we are told, because they suffer from low self-esteem. Coping with life needs a certain resilience, a certain confidence that enables us to ride the ups and downs we encounter. If we don't think we are worth much, we tend to think others view us this same way. We may even act in a manner that gives others that impression and encourages them to ignore us or treat us with disdain. On the other hand, we might go to the opposite extreme, becoming bullying or boastful, in the attempt to persuade others that we are really worth something. But if we are convinced in our hearts that we are God's work of art, then our perception of life is very different. We are free to use our imagination more. We can explore what is old, what is new and what is different. We can be endlessly curious. The world is not hostile, but a place we can give ourselves time to stand and stare and wonder. We can delight in others' gifts, as well as our own. This is where our real imitation of God begins, when we enable others to see their gifts and to use them fully. It is a sign of God's love for us that we can move beyond our limitations and share in the splendor of creation. Our love is evident in our removing of each other's limitations, allowing our spirits to soar freely in the image and likeness of our creator.

Saint Joseph knew a thing or two about having to uproot a family and leave for another country in a hurry. The Gospel of Matthew tells us that Joseph fled to Egypt with Mary and the infant Jesus when he learned that King Herod planned to kill all the male infants in Bethlehem. For this reason Joseph is a patron saint of immigrants. In every age and region people have felt compelled to immigrate for a variety of reasons, but rarely for convenience. Pulling up stakes on one's life and seeking it elsewhere is never an easy or pleasant task. Take a moment to honor Joseph by reaching out to an immigrant in your own community. It may give you a new perspective on one of the day's hot-button issues.

Refresh and recommit

For some the weeks of Lent are a time of preparation for baptism; for all it is preparation to renew that promise with conviction. Because most of us were baptized as infants, the sacrament can seem remote. Why not prepare for the renewal of your baptism at Easter by digging into family records for the date on which you were baptized and marking it for some simple celebration? If you are a godmother or godfather, ask yourself whether you have been active in helping parents hold Christ at the center of the lives of their children. Time in prayer, self-scrutiny, celebrating the sacrament of Reconciliation in a careful and thoughtful way can make the questions "do you believe in God?" and "do you reject sin?" not only words of a ceremony but a fresh commitment.

LENTEN WEEKDAY

Glad to be of help

The feeling that you are doing God's will on Earth activates a deep source of inner peace. On the other hand, the thought that you really should be doing something else creates a low-grade feeling of anxiety that you can ignore for only so long. Eventually the unease accumulates until life becomes a heavy burden, or you get sick—or both. Your fear might be that

God wants you to go to some hard place, to do some difficult task. Not so. As theologian Frederick Buechner put it, God calls you to "the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet." To find that place of deep gladness you have to go within and you have to listen. Lent is the perfect time to do both.

Today's readings: Isaiah 49:8-15; John 5:17-30 (246) "I do not seek my own will but the will of the one who sent me."

The risen Christ is worth the wait

Often when Jesus is portrayed in scripture he is confidently preaching the Good News. When he encounters doubters and has to start explaining himself and his mission, though, we might begin to have our own doubts about our faith. Jesus testifies that he is sent by the Father to carry out his work, but Jesus' followers at times have trouble believing in him. Lent is a time when we may grow weary waiting for the Resurrection of the Lord. During this season, however, remember that waiting for Christ and trusting in him will lead to eternal life.

LENTEN WEEKDAY; DAY OF ABSTINENCE

How do we endure differences?

If it were up to us, everyone would share our opinions, uphold our values, imitate our manners, and vote the way we do. What a wonderful world that would be! What a land of harmony! We live, however, in a land of free will and endless variety, and that—regrettably at times—includes the way other people think, act, perceive reality, and believe. We can therefore proceed in historically predictable ways. We can kill everyone who thinks differently (obviously that hasn't worked). We can suppress all other perspectives. Or we can learn to dialogue across the differences. As you fast from meat today, imagine a world of mutual respect, free of the spirit of condemnation.

"God made me do it"

Some folks claim God told them to do something—run for political office, for example. Interestingly, you don't hear much about people saying God told them *not* to do something. At any rate, discerning messages from God can be a tricky business. The prophetic books of Hebrew scripture record many of what are presented to be direct quotes from God. These prophets, however, were not using God to advance themselves or gain power. Instead they were reminding the nation of the ways of God the people knew perfectly well but were ignoring. So the next time you hear someone speaking of how God told them to do such-and-such, ask who's really doing the talking. The best way really to hear from God is through prayer and a life of faith.

2009 SUMMER INTERNSHIP - SERVICE TO CHARITY AND JUSTICE @ LEARNING CENTER, NORTH LAWNDALE

I spent one evening a week throughout the Summer at The Learning Center, located at 2153 S. Millard Ave., Chicago. It is a neighborhood adult center offering free education to men and women in the North Lawndale and Little Village areas of Chicago. It is located in the former rectory of Blessed Sacrament Parish and its mission is to improve the lives of students through the acquisition of knowledge and skills in reading, writing, math and ESL.

It is run by the Sinsinawa Dominicans who do an incredible job in a very challenging environment, primarily African American, undereducated with high crime and poverty.

I was blessed to meet and work with Sisters Monice and Marilyn who run this center and typify the very soul of Catholic social teaching – faith-filled volunteers with true vocations and a strong desire to help the less fortunate in our society. I worked with a number of students all of whom were motivated to learn to improve themselves, whatever tribulations life had caused them. It was a grace of God, I was appreciated and in turn thankful for this opportunity.

That said every Thursday night as I drove there from the suburbs I would ask God for his protection as I did his work and thank him for a safe return. The adults I worked with didn't have the luxury of returning to such a safe refuge after classes! However, because they were making such great efforts I prayed He protected them also.

I've mentored in business much of my working life but never taught adults the three R's, and I've spent very little time working in neighborhoods such as this, rather I'd zip by them on the expressways into downtown Chicago. So my initial reaction was "Lord what are you getting this white suburbanite into? Let it be your will not mine."

In summary it was a very rewarding experience and "The Learning Center" taught me much!


