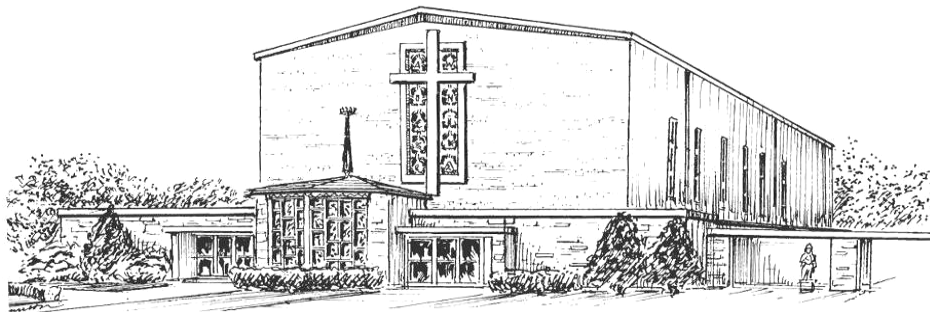

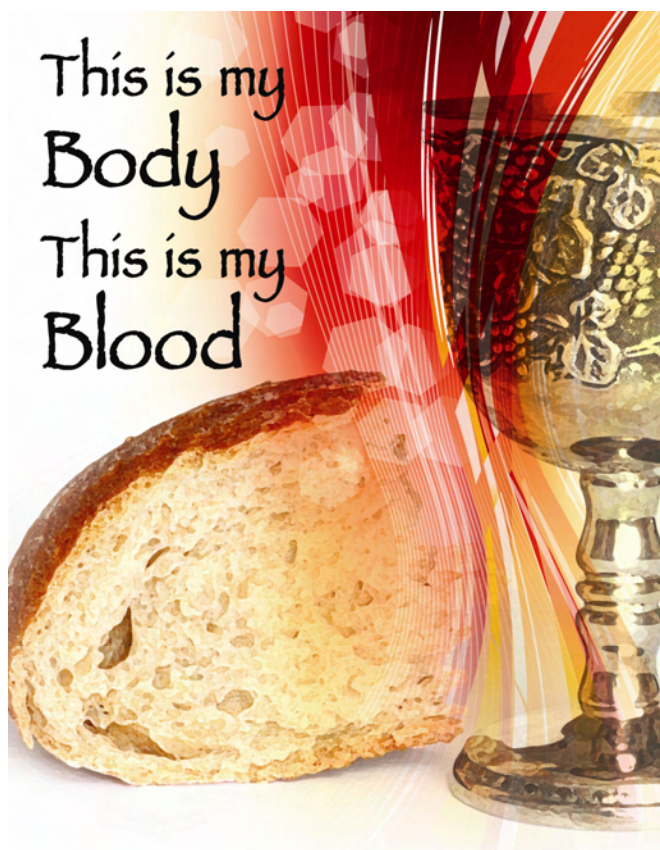

## ***Notes from Father Bob...***

### **FEAST OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST**

*People cannot match God for faithfulness; the Covenant was constantly breached. And so Jesus came, God's own Son. The Law became a person, obedience became a relational response to a person, and the rule became love. The writer of the Letter to the Hebrews deliberately describes the work of Christ as renewing—even replacing—the old Covenant between God and people. The New Covenant is the person of Christ. This brings us to consider the first Day of Unleavened Bread.*

*God's new covenant with people gradually unfolded in the person and teaching of Christ. He is revealed as Savior in his ministry of healing, teaching and forgiving. But the old Covenant is still in place, and people are still bound by the Law. Jesus re-states the Law, showing its heart to be love. He points out that the two greatest commandments are loving God and loving neighbor, and he lives these commandments to the fullest. He spends his final hours on earth fulfilling, in his obedience, the Old Covenant and putting in its place the New. Only he could fulfill the demands of the Law perfectly, and so only he could bring the New Covenant into being. Only his blood could seal it.*

*In the upper room, Jesus took bread and wine and used them to announce his own death and the salvation it would bring. Ever after, bread and wine, broken and poured out in his memory, would be a sign of the New Covenant between God and his people. Christ made the one, perfect offering to the Father, and enables us to share in that offering. We have nothing else to offer the Father. In the Eucharist, we associate ourselves with the ultimate offering, Christ himself.*

*The Eucharist is not a morbid proclamation of the sacrifice of Christ; it is a celebration of a sacrifice unto death, which brought -- and continues to bring -- only life. The Law alone was not enough; we cannot relate to law. However, when Christ himself became the sign of the Covenant, we entered into a personal, dynamic relationship with him, who is our salvation.*

*In our Eucharist, bread and wine are signs of the New Covenant. They are signs of Christ, who is the Covenant, and signs of the blood by which he sealed the Covenant. This has profound implications for us, who gather around the table of the Lord to share this bread and wine. We are not people under the obligation of law; rather, we are people in a covenantal relationship with God. This means that external obedience is of no importance. Obedience of the heart is what is crucial. Our commitment to the commandments of love will be manifest in our lives, and so our behavior is renewed from the inside to the outside.*

*Our sharing the bread and wine is a celebration and a demonstration that we are not individuals with private contracts with God, but we are a people who share a Covenant with God. Our living of the Covenant is not private, but social; it is something we do together, with and for each other. We become what we celebrate: the Body of Christ, the presence of Christ in the world, and we pour out our lives in service of God and of our neighbor.*

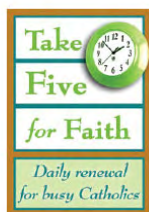
### **PRAYERS AND BLESSINGS**

**SUNDAY, JUNE 10, 2012 SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST**  
**Master these special effects**

What has the church been celebrating on this day ever since the 13th century? If your answer is the gift of the Real Presence of Jesus in both the Body and Blood of the Eucharist, you would of course be correct. Is it also a feast to glorify the communion you have with Jesus through the sacrament? Definitely. Tradition also emphasizes another aspect of the Eucharist: its effect. Now, an effect can be passive, something you receive, or active, moving you to do something. In the “effects” of the Eucharist you have both: oneness with God as well as a call to imitate Jesus’ sacrificial love in your own life. Today is a good day to rededicate yourself to just that.

TODAY’S READINGS: *Exodus 24:3-8; Hebrews 9:11-15; Mark 14:12-16, 22-26 (168)*

*“This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many.”*

**MONDAY, JUNE 11 FEAST OF BARNABAS, APOSTLE**  
**Billions served**

Did Gentile converts have to become Jews in order to become Christians? Confused yet? Well, so was the early church, until the matter was settled at the Council of Jerusalem around the year 50 A.D. The council decided that Gentiles (that is, everyone who wasn’t Jewish) did not have to keep most of the Mosaic Law in order to become followers of Christ. Saint Barnabas was instrumental in helping Saint Paul evangelize and lead the church to this fundamental decision, one that essentially turned Christianity from a branch of Judaism into the largest of the world religions. Of course, bigger doesn’t necessarily mean better—that part is up to each member of the Body of Christ. So make Barnabas proud by living up to the ideals he lived and, as a martyr, died for.

*“Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.”*

**TUESDAY, JUNE 12**  
**You are the salt of the earth**

Salt is such an ordinary, cheap, and easily found substance nowadays that you can fail to fully grasp the profound meaning of Jesus’ famous metaphor. Consider these facts. Once known as “white gold,” salt is necessary for human life. It preserves, purifies, and enhances the flavor of food. It made civilization possible. Wars have been waged over supplies of salt; it has been taxed, hoarded, traded, and used as currency; and it helped galvanize Mohandas Gandhi’s nonviolent movement for India’s independence from Britain. When Jesus compares his disciples to salt of the earth, he is really saying: “Your life and presence matter. In fact, you are more than valuable, you are essential.” Be alert for opportunities to be salt for the world today.

*“If salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned?”*

**WEDNESDAY, JUNE 13**  
**FEAST OF ANTHONY OF PADUA, PRIEST, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH**  
**Give what you receive**

Saint Francis of Assisi had a healthy skepticism about academic pursuits. In the Middle Ages the accolades a noted scholar might enjoy could leave gospel poverty in the dust. When Anthony of Padua asked to join Francis’ new “Order of Penance,” however, Francis saw that Anthony was able to combine brilliance and oratorical power with fidelity to the gospel and simplicity.

Francis even welcomed Anthony to bring his precious books with him—they were the tools of his trade—and entrusted to his care the training of brothers seeking to become priests. You may find yourself juggling values that seem at odds with each other, like being a bread-earner *and* a caring mom or dad. Saint Anthony knew that the gifts of God—even those most esteemed like intelligence, power, and wealth—are still gifts.

**THURSDAY, JUNE 14 FLAG DAY**  
**Carry on the flag**

The American flag was adopted on this day in 1777, and for the past 235 years it has been a cherished symbol of everything this country holds dear. As President Calvin Coolidge observed, “It represents our peace and security, our civil and political liberty, our freedom of religious worship, our family, our friends, our home.” But, he noted, it is equally a symbol of responsibility. As a nation the United States has its share of problems, disagreements, and failures. Today is a good day to reflect on the sacrifices your ancestors made and consider how you might carry on their work so that your grandchildren may live in the freedom the Stars and Stripes proclaim.

**FRIDAY, JUNE 15**  
**SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS**  
**Heart to heart**

Last spring a friend received from his ailing elderly mother two small oval portraits of Jesus and Mary nestled inside matching gilt frames, their special hearts radiantly visible. Finding these images a bit too sentimental for his tastes, he put them in a drawer. When his mother died on the night of June 15, he noted to us who knew him: “She died between the two hearts she loved best.” The oval portraits now hang on his wall, reminding him of the love that surrounds everyone at all times. Celebrate the twin feasts of holy hearts today and tomorrow with gratitude for how God so loves the world.

**FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE HEART OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY**  
**Fond embraces**

Characters in the Bible can seem larger than life because of the singular roles they play in human history. Yet even a prophet won’t leave home without kissing his folks goodbye! In the great story of salvation, love is the tie that binds each player to the other and all of us to God. That should be no surprise, for God is love, as the First Letter of John will later say (1 John 4:8). Perhaps that is why the image of Mary’s Immaculate Heart has brought comfort to so many. Her radiant heart, full of sorrow and joy like any mother’s, bears the world’s sons and daughters in its embrace.

### SPECIAL 2ND COLLECTION FOR RETIRED PRIESTS OF THE ARCHDIOCESE OF CHICAGO - THIS WEEKEND, JUNE 9/10

This second collection is solely for the retired priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago. The retired priests of the Archdiocese receive no funds from the Religious Retirement Collection taken up in December. Those funds go for religious nuns and brothers and religious order priests.

There are 221 Retired Archdiocesan Priests. They represent more than one quarter of all the priests serving in the Archdiocese. There are currently 20 priests over the age of ninety. 95 priests are between 80 and 89 years old and one of our priests turned 100 this past year. Collectively our retirees represent more than 10,000 years of service to the Archdiocese.

Normal retirement age is 70 for Chicago priests. 50 retired priests still live in a rectory and assist the parish on a regular basis. Close to 125 retired priests celebrate Sunday Mass weekly: perform marriages and baptisms; and visit the sick in hospitals. Without these dedicated men, many parishes would not be able to offer the full range of Masses and sacraments that is currently offered.

There are two independent living residences for retired priests that are subsidized by the Archdiocese. There is space for 28 retired priests to enjoy communal living with their brother priests in retirement. 25 rooms are currently being used.

30 priests received or are currently receiving nursing home assistance or have full-time aides coming to their home or rectory in the last year.

The priests' pension fund was adversely affected by the economic downturn. Millions of dollars will be needed in the coming years to bring it to appropriate funding levels.

The Archdiocese of Chicago is committed to caring for our retired priests but we need your assistance. Please help and many, many thanks.
